S-2 CHRONOLOGY

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS. None.

2. NEW DEVELOPMENTS. None

3. PROBLEM AREAS. At the present time there are 6 interpreters assigned to this Battalion, 2 of whom were wounded and are presently in an ARVN hospital. The shortage of interpreters has made collection of information from indigenous personnel, the proper functioning of the civil affairs program, and liaison with local Vietnamese forces, difficult. It is felt that 9 interpreters is the minimum required by an infantry battalion, with the ideal being sufficient interpreters to allow assignment of one per infantry platoon, with 3 additional at the Battalion C. P. for use by the Command Group and S-2 during field operations, the Battalion Aid Station, Chaplain, and Civil Affairs Officer in the Battalion People to People program.

4. WEATHER. Weather in the Battalion TAO was moderate to clear during the reporting period, and did not appreciably influence any of the activities of this Battalion. A total of 2.4 inches of rain was recorded during the month of February, which is a decrease of 1.1 inch from January.

5. INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY

a. VC activity during the month of February increased considerably over the month of January. Activity in the Battalion TAO consisted mainly of mine and booby trap incidents, attempted ambushes, and isolated small arms incidents by individuals or small groups, ranging in number from 1 to 10.

b. There were 155 VC initiated incidents in the Battalion TAO during February, as compared with 76 during January. These 155 incidents consisted of:

(1) 69 incidents of small arms compared to 46 in January.

(2) 11 ambushes compared to 10 in January,

(3) 69 booby trap and mine incidents compared to 18 in January. This figure includes booby traps and mines that were detonated, as well as those which were discovered and destroyed in place.

(4) 6 close-in infiltration attempts. These consisted mainly of VC who infiltrated to within grenade range, or who were detected attempting to get through defensive positions.

5. TARGET INFORMATION. No significant targets were reported.

6. DAILY INTELLIGENCE SUMMARIES. Attached as appendix (1), (original only).

8. SPECIAL INTELLIGENCE REPORTS. One report attached to INTSUB file.

9. A.O. REPORTS. No significant sightings reported.

10. PRISONER REPORT.

a. There were 47 VC apprehended and evacuated to IFT during February, as compared to 96 apprehended during January.

b. There were 10 VC captured during February, as compared to 7 during January.

11. BODY CASUALTIES.

a. There were 33 VC killed (body count) in the battalion TAOB during February, as compared to 33 VC killed (body count) during January.

b. There were 28 VC probable KIA or WIA during the month. This is a result of searching VC positions and observing pools or trails of blood indicating VC casualties.

12. CAPTURED EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES.

b. VC equipment and supplies captured consisted of 4 M-14 magazines, 100 rounds 7.62 ammunition, 3 caliber .30 carbine magazines, 50 rounds caliber .30 ammunition, 2 cartridge belts, 1 gas mask, and approximately 3,000 lbs of rice.

c. Defensive positions and fortifications destroyed included 71 caves and tunnels, 162 fighting holes, and 1,050 meters of trench line.

b. Enemy Situation.

(1) At 310835Z, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a booby trap at (LT 957664) which was destroyed in place. The report indicated the booby trap was an M-26 grenade with a trip wire placed across the trail. The report stated that 2 VCs were apprehended in the immediate area for paying particular attention to the Marines actions. The report continued the Marines believe the VCs had knowledge, and may have set the booby trap. The suspects were evacuated to IIT for investigation. No casualties were reported.

(2) At 310900Z, a Company "L" patrol reported apprehending 1 VCS at (LT 946692) when a routine examination revealed he lacked adequate identification. The suspect was evacuated to IIT for investigation.

(3) At 311140Z, a Company "I" patrol operating in the vicinity of (LT 946614) reported receiving 5 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (LT 943514). The Marines directed 25 rounds S/A fire at the enemy position and physically pursued the VC to the hamlet of Canu Son (1) where contact was lost. No casualties were reported.

(4) At 311305L, a Company "I" patrol operating in the vicinity of (LT 945606) reported receiving an estimated 30 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (LT 943600). The Marines directed approximately 200 rounds S/A fire and 5 106MM recoilless rifle rounds at the enemy position and physically pursued the fleeing VC until contact was lost in a cane field. No USMC casualties were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

(5) At 311310H, a Company "L" patrol operating in the vicinity of (LT 954653) reported receiving 4 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (LT 954650). The Marines directed 25 rounds S/A fire at the enemy position and physically pursued the VC to a tree line where contact was lost. No casualties were reported.

(6) At 311355H, a Company "I" patrol reported discovering a large tunnel (exact size not indicated) at (LT 945602). The report stated the tunnel will be destroyed on 1 February.

(7) At 311500H, a Company "I" patrol reported discovering a tunnel 2 feet by 2 feet by 10 feet long at (LT 939611) which was destroyed.

(8) At 311600H, an LWT operating in the vicinity of (BT 032640) in support of Company "L", reported receiving 3 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (BT 033652). The Marines directed approximately 100 rounds S/A fire, and 5 40MM (M-79) rounds at the enemy position with unknown results. No casualties were reported.

1. Summary of Enemy Situation for the Period.

a. Characteristics of the Area of Operation.

b. Enemy Situation.

(1) At 010800H, Company "B" (2/9) relayed a report that an M4V vehicle in the vicinity of (LT 028644) reported receiving an undetermined amount of S/A fire from 4 VC positioned at close range. Company "B" dispatched a patrol to search the area, but reported negative results. The report stated that a Vietnamese woman in the area told the Marines she had seen 4 VC with weapons heading in a southwesterly direction. No casualties were reported.

(2) At 011050H, a Company "I" patrol reported detanating a booby trap (no description provided) at (LT 965633). Two USMC WIA were reported.

(3) At 011130H, a Company "F" patrol operating in the vicinity of (LT 998638) reported receiving an estimated 200 rounds automatic and semi-automatic S/A fire from an estimated 10 VC positioned at (BT 00 3633). The Marines directed approximately 250 rounds S/A fire, 30 81MM mortar rounds, 54 105MM artillery rounds, and an undetermined number of 90MM (tank) rounds, and physically pursued the fleeing VC by fire and maneuver until contact was lost. A search of the area revealed an undetermined amount of expended cartridges, 50 rounds of S/A ammunition, and pools of blood indicating 3 VC probable WIA. The report continued that 4 tunnels discovered at (BT 008632) were destroyed. One USMC WIA was reported.

(4) At 011220H, a Company "A" river patrol operating in the vicinity of (BT 003653) reported receiving 20 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned on the eastern bank of the river (BT 003653). The Marines directed approximately 40 rounds S/A fire, 7 40MM (M-79) rounds, and 3 106MM recoilless rifle rounds (from river bank at BT 031649) at the enemy position and observed 1 VC fall as if struck by the Marines fire. Further pursuit of the enemy revealed 1 VC dragging the fallen dead VC. The Marines directed 20 rounds S/A fire and 3 40MM (M-79) rounds at the fleeing enemy and observed the second VC fall. A search of the area revealed negative results. No USMC casualties were reported. One VC KIA (body count) and 1 VC probable KIA were reported.

(5) At 011350H, a Company "I" patrol reported discovering 3 caves at (LT 984655) 3 feet by 3 feet by 4 feet long, (LT 983634) 2 feet by 5 feet by 5 feet long, and (LT 986632) 4 feet by 4 feet by 6 feet long which were destroyed.

(6) At 011600H, a Company "M" patrol operating in the vicinity of LA BONG (1), (LT 977673) reported observing 1 VC enter a tree line at (LT 980678). The report indicated that 5 rounds S/A fire were heard (not directed at Marine patrol) initiating from the same tree line. The Marines advanced on the enemy position, but a search revealed negative results.

(7) At 011625H, an Aerial Observer reported receiving an undetermined amount of S/A fire from an estimated 10 VC positioned in a tree line at (LT 962640). The MULE aircraft strafed the tree line with rockets and S/A fire and a Company "A" patrol and "Sparrow Hawk" were dispatched to close in on the enemy position. A search of the area revealed traces of blood indicating 2 VC probable KIA. No USMC casualties were reported.

(8) At 011815H, a Company "L" patrol reported apprehending 1 VCS at (LT 942650). The report indicated as the Marines approached to make a routine examination, the suspect attempted to flee. The suspect will be evacuated on 2 February when transportation becomes available.

At 011930H, a Company "E" river patrol operating in the vicinity of (BT 033654) reported receiving 3 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned on the eastern bank of the river (BT 033654). The Marines directed 7 40MM (M-79) rounds at the enemy position and the fire ceased. No casualties were reported.

(10) At 012135H, a Company "E" patrol operating in the vicinity of (BT 029640) reported receiving an estimated 400 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (BT 023643) and (BT 029641). The Marines directed approximately 250 rounds S/A fire, 12 40MM (M-79) rounds, and 26 81MM mortar rounds at the enemy positions. The report indicated that as a medical evacuation helicopter arrived, it reported receiving an undetermined amount of caliber 50 machine gun fire from the same suspected enemy position. The report stated a reinforced squad with a section of ontos were dispatched to assist in pursuit of the enemy. One USMC KIA was reported. Many casualties could not be determined. Additional information will be provided when available.

b. Enemy Situation.

(1) At 020712H, a Company "I" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 955604) reported receiving an estimated 50 rounds S/A fire from 3 VC positioned at (AT 953603). The Marines directed approximately 400 rounds S/A fire and 2 3.5 inch W.P. rounds at the enemy position and physically pursued the fleeing VC until contact was lost. No USMC casualties were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

(2) At 020730H, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a booby trap at (AT 959676). The report indicated the trap consisted of an M-26 grenade with a trip wire extended across the trail which was destroyed in place. No casualties were reported.

(3) At 020730H, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a booby trap at (AT 959677). The report indicated the trap consisted of a CHIGOM grenade with a trip wire extended across the trail which was destroyed in place. No casualties were reported.

(4) At 020801H, a Company "L" patrol reported apprehending 2 VCs at (AT 950690) when routine examinations revealed they lacked adequate identification. The suspects were evacuated to IPI for investigation.

(5) At 020805h, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a punji trap (size not indicated) which was destroyed. No casualties were reported. Punji trap located at (AF 951691).

(6) At 020816h, a Company "L" blocking force positioned at (BT 026625) reported receiving 10 rounds S/A fire from 2 VC observed leaving the hamlet of T.M.H. QUIT (1), (BT 026620). The Marines directed approximately 100 rounds S/A fire and 3 40mm (M-79) rounds at the enemy position killing both VC (body count). The report indicated that due to their mission the Marines could not recover the bodies, but reported that the PF sweeping force recovered both VC bodies including 1 unidentified carbine rifle. No USMC casualties were reported.

(7) At 020821h, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a booby trap at (AF 954682). The report stated the trap consisted of a grenade (unidentified) with a trip wire extended across the trail which was destroyed in place. No casualties were reported.

(8) At 020821h, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a booby trap at (AF 954682). The report stated the trap consisted of an M-26 grenade with a trip wire extended across the trail which was destroyed in place. No casualties were reported.

(9) At 020900h, a Company "L" river patrol reporting observing an empty boat (800m approximately 6 feet long) floating on at (BT 034655). The report indicated the boat exploded when it was pulled by a grappling hook. No casualties were reported. Additional information will be provided when available.

(10) At 020915h, a Company "L" patrol reported detonating a booby trap at (AF 957690). The report indicated the trap was an M-26 grenade with a trip wire extended across the trail. Three USMC WIA were reported.

(11) At 020918h, a Company "L" blocking force positioned at (BT 025621) reported receiving an estimated 200 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (BT 015623). The Marines directed approximately 300 rounds S/A fire, and 41 105mm artillery rounds at the enemy position and the fire ceased. One USMC WIA was reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

(12) At 021208h, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a booby trap at (AF 954682). The report indicated the trap consisted of an M-26 grenade attached to a tree 8 inches off the ground with a trip wire across the trail which was destroyed in place. No casualties were reported.

(13) At 021216h, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a booby trap at (AF 954679) which was destroyed in place. The report stated the trap consisted of an M-26 grenade placed inside a tin can. No casualties were reported.

(14) At 021220H, a Company "L" patrol reported detonating a booby trap at (AF 953570). The report indicated the booby trap consisted of approximately 20 pounds of Vietnamese TNT placed in the side of a dike with a large stone and an undetermined amount of clay placed on top to increase the blast effect. The report stated that a bamboo pole was extended out from the charge and activated the explosive device when pulled by a Marine. Two USMC KIA and 4 USMC WIA were reported.

(15) At 021400H, a Company "L" sniper positioned in the vicinity of (BT 028629) reported killing 1 VC (observed body count) positioned at (BT 030630). No equipment was recovered from the dead VC.

(16) At 021450H, a Company "I" patrol reported destroying a tunnel 2 feet by 5 feet by 110 feet long and reinforced by bamboo at (AF 957603). The report stated 5 caves all approximately 2 feet by 3 feet by 8 feet long ("L" shaped) were destroyed in the vicinity of (AF 956505).

(17) At 021450H, a Company "E" blocking force positioned at (BT 028629) reported receiving an undetermined amount of S/A fire from VC positioned in the hamlet of AN TU (1). (BT 023637) The Marines dispersed approximately 150 rounds S/A fire at the enemy position and continued to act as a blocking force. Sparrow hawk was alerted and landed to the NW of AN TU (1), and a reserve platoon of Company "K" was alerted, and landed to the NE of AN TU (1). The report indicated that both forces joined and swept to the south to the Company "E" position. No USMC casualties were reported. Two VC KIA (body count) and 1 VC probable WIA were reported. No equipment was reported recovered from the dead VC.

(18) At 021800H, a Company "M" platoon positioned at (AF 970660) reported receiving 4 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (AF 969659). The fire was not reported and the exact enemy position could not be determined. No casualties were reported.

(19) At 021800H, Company "K" reported thinning 200 meters of brush, filling 5 fighting holes, thinning 200 meters of bamboo, and destroying 1 tunnel 6 feet long in the vicinity of (AF 975676).

(20) At 022010H, a Company "F" patrol reported detonating a booby trap at (AF 997644). The report indicated the trap consisted of an M-26 grenade with a trip wire extended across the trail. One USMC WIA was reported.

(21) At 022045H, a Company "L" LP observed movement of 1 VC to the front of their position. The Marines directed 1 M-26 grenade at the suspected enemy position, but a search of the area revealed negative results. No casualties were reported.

(22) At 022120H, a Company "F" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AF 990556) reported observing 6 VC at close range. The Marines directed 50 rounds S/A fire at the enemy position at which time the VC returned 15 rounds S/A fire and began fleeing to the south. The Marines physically pursued the VC until contact was lost due to darkness. No

USMC casualties were reported. One VC probable VC WIA was reported.

(23) At 022130n, a Company "M" security element positioned at (LT 970653) reported detecting movement on a S/D. A patrol was dispatched to investigate and observed 2 VC running. The Marines directed 10 rounds S/A fire at the fleeing VC with negative results. No casualties were reported.

(24) At 022255n, a Headquarters Company, 9th Marines security element positioned on the bridge at (LT 998706) reported hearing movement in the rice paddy to the south of their position. The Marines directed 2 M-26 grenades, 10 S/A fire, and 2 hand illumination rounds at the suspected enemy position with negative results. No casualties were reported.

c. (25) At 023001H, a Company "M" ambush element positioned at (LT 950653) reported observing 2 VC to the west of their position. At the same time 2 VC were spotted approaching the Marines position from the south. The Marines directed 150 rounds S/A fire at the enemy position and observed 2 VC fall. The Marines directed 10 rounds S/A fire at the enemy position and physically pursued the fleeing VC capturing both. No USMC casualties were reported. Two VCC (1 L) were reported. (S-2 comment: The 2 VC were given medical treatment and evacuated to IFP for interrogation. Initial interrogation revealed that both VC were local guerrillas, one being a VC tax collector.

The Marines directed approximately 15 rounds S/A fire, 60 60mm mortar rounds, and 10 90MM (tank) rounds at the enemy position and began physically pursuing the enemy by fire and maneuver. The report indicated that in the process of sweeping through the enemy position, a Sparrow Hawk element reported detonating a booby trapped M-26 grenade (trip wire) at (AF 953653). The report stated that a Company "L" patrol detected a booby trap (unidentified) at (AF 953663). Seven USMC WIA were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined. Additional information will be provided when available.

(5) At 031235H, an Aerial Observer reported observing a freshly dug trench line approximately 200 meters at (AF 942592).

(6) At 031455H, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering an 81mm mortar round (dud) which was destroyed in place.

b. Enemy Situation.

(1) At 040540H, Company "M" provided information on the circumstances surrounding the burning down of the school house in AT TRAC (1) (AT 972662). The report indicated a young Vietnamese boy was apprehended after being found in the vicinity of the incident, and then admitting to having started the fire. The report stated the youth admitted being given 100 piasters by VC to start the fire, and was going to receive an additional 900 piasters after the building was destroyed. The suspect was evacuated to HUA VING District Headquarters for investigation.

(2) At 041143H, a Company "L" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 951650) reported receiving an estimated 100 rounds automatic S/A fire from VC positioned at (AT 953650). The Marines directed approximately 150 rounds S/A fire and 17 61MM rounds at the enemy position and physically pursued the fleeing VC until contact was lost. No USMC casualties were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

(3) At 041200H, a Company "E" river patrol operating in the vicinity of (BT 041701) reported receiving an estimated 25 rounds automatic and semi automatic S/A fire from 3 VC positioned at close range. The Marines directed 25 rounds S/A fire and 3 40MM (M-79) rounds at the

enemy position killing 1 VC (body count). The report indicated that 1 grenade (unidentified) and 1 cartridge belt was taken from the dead VC. The report stated the weapon of the dead VC fell into the river and could not be recovered. No USMC casualties were reported.

(4) At 041430H, a Company "L" river patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 952677) reported receiving 30 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned on both sides of the SONG YAM river. The Marines directed approximately 150 rounds S/A fire, 6 40MM (M-79) rounds and 1 81MM mortar round at the enemy position with unknown results. The report indicated the LVT's transporting the Marines could not beach on either side of the river, making physical pursuit impossible. No casualties were reported.

LATE REPORT

At 040150H, a Company "E" river block positioned at (BT 031640), reported observing 3 VC tampering with a communications cable across the S. VINH DIEN river. The Marines directed 50 rounds S/A fire and 4 40MM (M-79) rounds at the enemy position and observed 1 VC fall as if struck with the Marines fire. A check of the area at first light revealed negative results. No USMC casualties were reported. One VC probable WIA was reported.

(5) At 041445H, a helicopter operating in the vicinity of (AT 953667) reported receiving 150 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned in the vicinity of (AT 951555). Company "L" directed 40 105 artillery rounds, 11 81MM mortar rounds, and 7 90MM tank rounds at the enemy position, and dispatched a patrol to pursue the enemy. Contact could not be made, and a search of the area revealed negative results. No casualties were reported.

(6) At 041000H, Company "M" conducting a search and destroy operation in the vicinity of (AT 976677) reported clearing 300 meters of bamboo, and destroying 1 tunnel 3 feet by 3 feet by 20 feet long at (AT 975675).

(7) At 050400H, a tank in support of Company "I" on Hill 55 reported observing (flood light) 1 VC positioned at (AT 964620). The Marines directed 40 60MM mortar rounds at the enemy position with excellent effect on target. A patrol was dispatched to search the area, but reported negative results. No casualties were reported.

(8) At 050715H, a Company "I" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 954607) reported receiving 125 rounds automatic S/A fire from VC positioned at (AT 950607). The Marines directed 200 rounds S/A fire, 3 3.5 inch W.P. rounds, 6 106MM recoilless rifle rounds, and 7 90MM tank rounds at the enemy position and physically pursued the enemy until contact was lost. No USMC casualties were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

LATE REPORTS

At 041500, K&S Company patrol apprehended 1 VCS in the vicinity of (AT 963606). The man had been observed about 1 hr. previously in the vicinity of a stream near his home and refused to walk with the patrol, falling on the ground. No interpreter was available and the man was not apprehended at this time. As patrol continued, they found a small tree tied down to a trip mine and a "C" ration can secured to the tree. Examination found the ration can to be empty but a grenade placed in the can would have been hurled into the air if mine were tripped. When going back through area, old man was seen in home and a thorough search was conducted. One briefcase with maps and wire papers and books were found and a quantity of unknown type were found ("C" ration case full). Man was apprehended and forwarded to ITT with all gear.

At 021030H, a patrol from "E" Company apprehended 2 VCS in house vicinity (DT 025626). Patrol had first received fire from this area. No weapons could be found in or around the house. 1VCS was picked up when patrol left area, suspect had no I.D. card.

At 020655H, a patrol from "I" Company apprehended 1 VCS who ran from house as patrol approached hamlet. Several persons ran from adjacent house and fired on patrol but were able to escape in cane field.

c. Report of VC received directly from civilians during period.

The villagers of AN THAM (1), (AT 972662), YAM NG (.), (AT 975677), and LA DONG (1), (AT 975675), held a meeting in AN THAM (1). as a result, the villagers told the Marines, (Company "H") they desired to have their 3 hamlets converted into strategic hamlets. The report indicated the villagers plan to build a fence around the hamlets, made of bamboo and barbed wire, with controlled exits and entrances. The report stated the only assistance they wanted from the Marines was 4600 feet of barb wire, and help in building the fence. The villagers indicated they plan to organize their own militia for defense against VC attacks.

(10) At 121600H, the Battalion S-3 provided additional information on a Company "E" search and destroy operation conducted in the vicinity of grid square (BT 0066) on 9 February. The report stated 32 tunnels 6 feet by 6 feet by 6 feet long, 1 tunnel 6 feet by 6 feet by 20 feet long, and 3 bunkers, 1 of which was reinforced by railroad ties, and 1 reinforced by bamboo were destroyed by demolitions (C-4).

(11) At 121655H, Company "L" reported filling 20 fighting holes located along a trail from (AT 949629) to (AT 954629).

(12) At 121700H, a tank positioned at (AT 956609) in support of Company "I" reported receiving 10 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned in the vicinity of (AT 953608). The Marines directed 4 rounds S/A at the suspected enemy position and the fire ceased. No casualties were reported.

(13) At 1217305H, a Company "E" patrol operating in the vicinity of (BT 016646) reported receiving 60 rounds S/A fire from an estimated 6 VC dressed in black, armed with carbines, and positioned at (BT 017639). The Marines directed 300 rounds S/A fire, 10 40MM (M-79) rounds, 4 3.5 inch W.P. rounds, 18 81MM mortar rounds and 38 105MM artillery rounds at the enemy position, and pursued the fleeing VC by fire and maneuver until contact was lost. A search of the area revealed 1 VC KIA (body count) (reported shot by a scout sniper). No equipment was reported found on the dead VC. No USMC casualties were reported.

(14) At 121900H, a Company "E" patrol reported destroying a freshly dug trench line running from (BT 014617) to (BT 011617). The report indicated 6 bunkers 4 feet by 4 feet were destroyed in the same vicinity, and a tunnel (size not indicated) was destroyed at (BT 016618). The report stated a secondary explosions revealing black smoke occurred while destroying the tunnel at (BT 016618) resulting in 2 USMC WIA (non M&I evac).

(15) At 122005H, a Company "K" platoon positioned at (AT 961673) reported receiving 1 grenade from VC positioned at close range. The Marines directed 20 rounds S/A fire at the suspected enemy position, but a search of the area revealed negative results. No casualties were reported.

(16) At 122130H, a Company "K" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 956678), reported receiving an estimated 12 rounds automatic S/A fire from VC positioned at close range (100 meters). The Marines directed 50 rounds S/A fire and 3 grenades at the enemy position, physically pursued the VC until contact was lost because of heavy brush and darkness. One USMC WIA was reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

(17) At 122100H, the Battalion S-3 provided information on a Company "F" operation conducted between 120730H, and 121900H, in the vicinity of grid square (AT 9965) to (BT 0265) south to SONG LA THO river. The following is a summary of events:

(a) At 120830H, while reconing by fire from (BT 002638), received 10 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (BT 006633). One VC probable WIA (saw VC fall). No USMC casualties.

(2) Entered hamlet of LA THO BaC (1), (BT 007631) where villagers told Marines the VC just left with 1 VC KIA and 1 VC WIA. Villagers also stated there had been approximately 60 VC in an ambush position at (BT 005638) but had split up into 3 groups and headed in a southerly direction on 3 separate trails. The Marines fired an undetermined amount of 81MM mortar rounds at the suspected VC locations (BT 010624) and (BT 007623), and observed 2 VC run into a cone field at (BT 007623). The Marines directed artillery and S/A fire at the enemy position and pursued the fleeing VC to (BT 002610). A search of the area revealed 2 VC KIA (body count) and pools of blood indicating 5 VC probable KIA, and 16 VC probable WIA. No USMC casualties.

(3) AO reported spotting 8 VC in a trench line at (BT 009608). The Marines directed fire at the enemy position with excellent effect on target resulting 2 VC probable KIA, and 6 VC probable WIA. No USMC casualties.

(4) AO reported 20 VC moved into a building at (BT 006605). Marines directed an air strike (HUIE and fixed wing) at the enemy position destroying the building resulting in 3 VC probable KIA and 9 VC probable WIA. No USMC casualties.

(5) Marines in vicinity of (BT 006633) reported receiving heavy S/A fire from VC positioned at (BT 004628), (BT 005529) and (A¹ 996632). Marines returned heavy S/A fire, 81MM mortar fire, 90MM tank fire, LAW'S and M-79 rounds with excellent effect on target. Six VC probable WIA reported. No USMC casualties.

Three VC KIA (body count), 12 VC probable KIA, and 39 VC probable WIA were reported. No USMC casualties were reported.

REPORTED TOTAL CASUALTIES FOR THE OPERATION.

The VC force engaged during the operation was believed to have been of company size or approximately 130 VC. The reports indicated the VC were dressed in khaki uniforms and armed with automatic and semi-automatic weapons.

LATE REPORT

At 11120H, a Company E river patrol operating in the vicinity of (BT 035683), reported receiving 20 rounds s/a fire from VC positioned at (BT 034682). The Marines proceeded to shore, directed 180 rounds s/a fire, and 25 40mm (M-79) rounds at the enemy position, and physically pursued the VC until contact was lost because of darkness. No USMC casualties were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION.

Company K provided additional information on the booby trap that was detonated on 11 February (see 111730H entry INTSUM #20). The report indicated the trap consisted of a 60mm mortar round or 2 CHICOM grenades detonated electrically from a building 125 meters to the south. The report continued that communication wire was found leading to the building

and that the VC had clear observation from the building to the point of detonation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Company "K" reported that the grenade received in their position at 122005H, (see 122005H entry this INTSUM) was directed at Marine position that had been vacated prior to darkness.

c. Report of VC received directly from civilians during period.

Company "M" reported that the villagers of LE SON (5) told Marines and a Pacification team that 2 VC were killed (KIA) by Company "M" Marines on the afternoon of 11 February. The villagers of LE SON (3) told the Marines of Company "M" and a Pacification team that they saw 1 VC WIA as a result of the action on 11 February (See 111403H entry INTSUM #29).

(8) At 131530H, a Company "M" security element providing security for approximately 100 villagers AN TRAM (1), (AT 971657), who were assisting the Marines in clearing bamboo and brush, reported receiving 20 rounds S/A fire from 2 VC positioned at (AT 968654). The Marines directed 50 rounds S/A fire and pursued the enemy until contact was lost in heavy brush. As the Marines were searching the area, they reported receiving 25 rounds S/A fire from 2 VC positioned at (AT 972650) and (AT 973654). The Marines directed 75 rounds S/A fire at the VC position and physically pursued the fleeing enemy until contact was lost. A search of the area revealed 5 fighting holes along the SONG YEN river which were destroyed by demolitions (C-4). After interrogation, the PAT team agreed to evacuating him to IPT and through Marine channels because of information that might be of value to USMC units in this area. The rallier will be evacuated to IPT on 12 February when transportation becomes available.

The report indicated the Marines discovered a trip wire leading into bamboo. The report stated that after taking cover the trip wire was pulled detonating the explosive. No casualties were reported.

(2) At 120800H, a Company "E" river block positioned at (BT 031648), reported receiving 3 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (BT 034653). The Marines directed 3 40MM (M-79) rounds at the enemy position and the VC fire ceased. No casualties were reported.

The Marines directed 100 rounds S/A fire, and 1 LAW at the enemy position and the fire ceased. A patrol (with LVT's) was dispatched, and a search of the area revealed negative results. No USMC casualties were reported. One VC probable KIA was reported as a result of the excellent effect on target by the Marines fire.

(4) At 081152H, a Company "K" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 955680) reported receiving 10 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (AT 959678). 

(9) At 201745H, a Company "L" patrol reported destroying a booby trapped illumination unit at (AF 947660). No further description of the booby trap was reported. Additional information will be provided when available. No casualties were reported.

(10) At 201945H, Company "H" patrol reported detonating a booby trapped 81mm mortar round (with trip wire) at (AF 971660). Three USMC WIA were reported.

(11) At 21000 H, a Company "L" ambush element positioned at (AF 942647) reported observing 4 VC positioned at (AF 944649). The Marines directed 100 rounds S/A fire, 4 40mm (M-79) rounds and 63 81mm mortar illumination rounds at the enemy position, and physically pursued the VC until contact was lost in the vicinity of (AF 944653). A search of the area revealed pools of blood indicating 1 VC probable WIA.

(12) At 210015H, the Company "D" river block positioned at (AF 973612) reported receiving 2 rounds of fire from VC positioned at (AF 975616). The Marines directed 2 rounds of fire at the enemy position with good effect on target. No casualties were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

LATE REPORTS

(13) At 201630H, the Company "I" river patrol positioned at (AF 973611) reported discovering a shape charge positioned near the anchor on the south side of the river block. The report indicated communication wire was attached and led to a position along the SONG LA RAO river. The report stated the charge was placed as to inflict casualties on Marine personnel and not to damage the anchor. The shape charge was removed and destroyed.

(14) At 201630H, a Company "I" patrol investigating the communication wire attached to the shape charge (AF 977613) (see 201630H this INTSUN), reported receiving 2 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned at (AF 979612). The report stated the Marines observed 1 VC armed with an M-1 rifle at (AF 979612) who directed 3 rounds at the advancing Marines. The Marines directed 20 rounds S/A fire and 5 40MM (M-79) rounds at the fleeing VC who disappeared into heavy brush. No casualties were reported.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

(15) At 192002H, a Company "L" ambush element reported engaging 5 VC (see 192001H, same INTSUN # 37). The report stated 2 VC were seen to fall as if struck by the Marines fire. A search of the area at first light on 21 February failed to reveal either body of the fallen VC. Two VC probable WIA will be claimed in this INTSUN's box score.

SPECIAL REPORT

(16) 3RD BATTAL reported that a VC document captured on 20 December in SONG LA RAO (No 2588) revealed a new VC tactic for using grenades against infantry troops, helicopters, and moving vehicles. When the tactic is used against holes, VC dig a series of conical shaped holes, and place 1.4 kg TNT charge with an electric blasting cap at the bottom of the holes. The hole is covered with dirt, and a board with 10-16 grenades is placed over the hole. Each grenade is fastened to the board between two nails (to hold open). The safety pins are removed, and the device is covered with dirt and/or grass. When the target approaches, the TNT is detonated electrically and the grenades are propelled upward. Grenades will detonate at 120 to 250 meter altitude. When used against vehicles and troops, holes are dug and grenade boards are placed at a 45 degree angle. Upon detonation, the grenades are tossed in the general direction of the approaching target.



Interrogation of ralliers from THAI CAM (AF 9864) resulted in following information: Hamlet guerrillas duties were to patrol hamlets, supervise work and plant mines and booby traps. Mines normally used were cylindrical (8" x 3") utilizing pull, tension release, and pressure fuses. Grenades inserted in cans were also used. One rallier stated he was given a "claymore" to emplace. Village level forces are trained to use artillery shells for mines.

Captured documents indicate the issue in late January and early February to Q-14 (Dai Loc District Company) and other units in area, of "claymore" type mines. These type mines have previously been used in the TUY LOAN river area in Gb (AF 8970). Documents indicate increased emphasis and employment of directional mines through out the DA NANG TAOB.

Essential Elements of Information

Analysis of current VC mine and booby trap incidents show a sudden increase in the use of "grenade mines", a cluster of M-26 fragmentation grenades. These mines will ordinarily consist of from two to six M-26 grenades. The use of these clusters is in addition to an increase in the use of single M-26 grenade booby traps. Analysis indicates that the VC have come into possession of a quantity of these grenades.

It is requested that a special intelligence collection requirement be issued for the following essential elements of information.

What is the primary source of the M-26 fragmentation grenades now in the hands of the VC?

Are the VC obtaining the grenades from other areas and transporting them into the DA NANG TAOB?

Are the VC obtaining the grenades in the DA NANG TAOB from us or ARVN sources by either loss, neglect, or theft?

Submit reports as information is obtained.

The phrase "The South Vietnamese people want to live at peace with the Americans" was heard in English. The 51st ARVN Regiment stated the VC use this tactic by setting up speakers in a village, and then broadcast from a covered position some distance away.

(10) At 270100G, a Company L patrol reported detonating a booby trap at (AT 953676) resulting in 3 USMC KIA. The report indicated the trap was an M-26 grenade positioned in a tin can.

b. Enemy Situation.

(1) At 280600H, a Company I patrol reported detonating a booby trapped 155 mm artillery round (dud) at (AT967635). The report indicated the artillery round was placed in the bottom of a punji trap, and was rigged with a trip wire. The report stated a Marine tripped over the wire activating the explosive, but had enough time to escape any injury, indicating the trap contained a delayed fuse. No casualties were reported.

(2) At 281120H, a Company L patrol reported destroying a suspected booby trapped gate at (AT953653).

(3) At 281125H, a Company L patrol reported destroying 2 booby trapped CHICOM grenades at (AT953651), which were rigged with trip wires.

(4) At 281140H, a Company L patrol reported what was believed to have been an electrically detonated explosion at (AT955653). The report indicated the nearest Marine was 20 meters from the explosion. The report stated no communication wire was found in the area, but a

crater 1 1/2 feet deep, and 4 feet in diameter was left by the explosion. Three USMC KIA were reported.

(5) At 281140H, a Company L patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT955653), reported receiving 60 rounds automatic s/a fire from an estimated 3 VC positioned at (AT932651), and (AT954653). The Marines directed an undetermined amount of 60mm mortar rounds, and s/a fire at the enemy positions, and physically pursued the VC until contact was lost in heavy brush. One USMC KIA (DOW) was reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

(6) At 281145H, a Company L patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT943643), reported receiving 75 rounds automatic s/a fire from VC positioned at (AT945635), and (AT951643). The Marines directed an undetermined amount of 60mm mortar rounds, and s/a fire at the enemy positions, and physically pursued the VC until contact was lost in a cane field. The report states the Marines were pursuing the VC positioned at (AT945635), when they received s/a fire from (AT951643) causing the Marines to terminate their pursuit to the northeast. No USMC casualties were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

(7) At 281208H, a Company L patrol reported destroying 1 booby trapped C4ICOM grenade at (AT953653). The report stated the grenade was rigged with a trip wire.

(8) At 281210H a Company L patrol reported apprehending 4 VCS at (AT 953651) who were evacuated to ITH for investigation.

(9) At 281220H, a Company M patrol reported destroying 1 booby trapped C4ICOM grenade at (AT 970659). The report indicated the trap was rigged with a trip wire extending across the trail.

(10) At 281245H, a Company M patrol reported destroying 2 tunnels 2'x3'x10' long at (AT 962649). The report stated 1 tunnel 2'x3'x10' long was destroyed at (AT 959654).

(11) At 281925H, a Company L platoon positioned at (AT 961661) reported receiving 3 rounds S/A fire from 1 VC positioned at (AT 958658). The Marines directed 6 rounds S/A fire and 2 M-79 rounds at the enemy position, and a patrol was dispatched to physically pursue the VC. The Marines advanced in a Southwesterly direction to (AT 953650) where they reported hearing metallic sounds, and movement indicating a possible VC ambush site. The Marines directed 26 105mm artillery rounds at the enemy position with excellent effect on target. A search of the area will be made at first light on 1 March. No USMC casualties were reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

(12) At 282350H, a Company I ambush elements positioned at (AT 959626), reported observing 2 VC heading South along the river at (AT 956626). The Marines directed 40 rounds S/A fire at the enemy position, and physically pursued the fleeing VC until contact was lost due to darkness. One USMC KIA (non med evac) was reported. Enemy casualties could not be determined.

c. Information on VC received directly from civilians.

(1) At 281400H, Company M reported receiving the following information from a villager in LE SON (1), (LT 960646):

(a) The names of the 2 VC killed by Company M on 26 February were LE NGAN, 26 years old, and equipped with 1 grenade, and LE LIEU, 16 years old and equipped with 2 grenades. See 260830H entry INTSUM #44.

(b) On 29 December, Company M killed 2 VC with S-1 mines whose bodies were carried away. The names of the VC are TRAN HA, and NGOYEN XING. (2 VC KIA (body count) will be claimed in this INTSUM's box scores). See 290930H entry INTSUM #191 (December).

(2) At 013004H, Company M reported receiving the following information from a villager in LE SON (3), (LT 976646):

(a) On 11 February, Company M killed 1 VC by the name of TRAN DINH HO and 05 RB fire, and seriously wounded 1 VC by the name of LE LY, whose bodies were carried away. (1 VC KIA (body count), and 1 VC WIA will be claimed in this INTSUM's box score). See 111440H entry INTSUM #29.

At first light, on 2 Feb, a combined S/D operation commenced with a Popular Force platoon crossing the LOD vicinity (BT 042623) and moving west; a platoon of Co E, reinforced with 60mm, blocking on the right (BT 028623); and an ARVN force blocking on the left on the south bank of the SONG THINH QUIT river vicinity (BT 030617). At 020810H the platoon blocking force (Co E) received S/L fire (BT 028625) from VC about 500 meters southwest; returned fire with small arms and fired artillery mission. Two (2) VC KIA (body count), and one carbine recovered. At 020810H the Co E platoon block received S/L fire (BT 025621) from the West and a few rounds from the North; fired 20 rounds HE and 21 rounds WP, 105mm artillery, good effect on target. At 020930H Sparrow Hawk was requested in support of Co E (GS 0262). Launched at 021006H in vicinity (BT 025627); moved to (BT 021630), received fire from the Southeast (BT 023637) vicinity AR TU (1); fired WP setting a house on fire. Air strike called on source of hostile fire, and a strafing run was made on village. The 2d platoon (E 2/9) moving in from the Southeast (BT 027620) and the 2d platoon (K 3/3) moving on village from Northeast (BT 032643); BU-1E screening Southwest flank. At 021109S Sparrow Hawk was in blocking position, (BT 032639); ARVN elements moved from NIEU BONG (BT 033657) to apprehend indigenous personnel moving east toward Highway 1. At 021215H Sparrow Hawk and 2d platoon (K 3/3) linked up vicinity (BT 022638) and commenced sweep South. No further contact was made, and at 021345H, Sparrow Hawk and K-2 moved to rendezvous with transportation for return to Co E CP.

Special Combined Operation. At 020700H a joint operation of Co L (3/3) (command group) and Co L (1/1) linked up at (LT 945693) to commence S/D operation from LOD extending from (LT 943690) to (LT 945693), Eastward to phase line (LT 951684) to (LT 955686). One squad Co L (3/3) established block at (LT 958685) with another squad of Co L blocking at (LT 957684). Company L (1/1) moved Southward at 020730H to blocking position (LT 958685). One squad of Co L established a blocking force to the South in vicinity of LA CHAU (3) (LT 955678).

At 020729H blocking squad Co L (3/3) located and destroyed one M-26 booby trap (LT 954676) and one Chicom grenade (LT 959677). At 020750H Co L apprehended one VCS at (LT 946669) and two VCS at (LT 950690); VCS taken to Bn S-2 for further investigation. At 020835H patrol from Co L (3/3) destroyed an M-26 grenade at (LT 954682) and punji trap at (LT 951691). At 020856H a platoon from Co L destroyed M-26 booby trap at (LT 954682). At 020915H a platoon from Co L tripped mine (LT 957690) resulting in three USMC KIA (two med-evac'd); one being Co L's commanding officer.

About 021208H a Marine from platoon of Co L (3/3) tripped an M-26 grenade rigged with a tripwire at (LT 954682); a second Marine grabbed spoon as pin was pulled. Platoon destroyed grenade; no injuries. At 021216H Co L destroyed an M-26 grenade at (LT 954679). At 021220H mine (LT 953676) of 20lbs of Vietnamese type TNT, initially reported as possible 105mm or 81mm round, with tensile device, was detonated by a squad, Co L, resulting in one USMC POW and five USMC KIA (med-evac'd). At 021300H the operation terminated; units retracting at 021300H. Total casualties of the S/D operation were one USMC KIA, (POW), eight ARVN KIA with three VCS captured and nine booby traps destroyed.

At 021800H the 1st platoon CP, Company M, (LT 963659) received four rounds of small arms rapid fire from West of the CP. Fire was not returned due to undefined target.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At about 021615H 1st platoon CP, Co M, (LT 9636) received approximately 20 rounds of small arms fire from 700 meters southwest along SONH (SN) direction. The platoon did not locate the enemy position; fire not returned.

At 022025H a Co L LP observed movement (LT 953665), threw one M-26 grenade and fired one 81mm illumination round. A squad (-) checked immediate area; no evidence of VC casualties.

At 022110H a Co F (2/9) squad enroute to ambush site tripped an M-26 grenade rigged with a tripwire vicinity H. DONG (LT 997644). Sustained one USMC WIL. Non-medevac.

At 022120H a Co F (2/9) squad ambush (LT 990656) fired on an estimated six men VC patrol approaching from the east; platoon observed one VC fall to the ground. The VC withdrew, firing small arms at the Marine position. Estimate one VC WIL (possible), no Marine casualties reported. Area searched with negative results.

At 022130H two Marines, Co M, investigating SDU reading, fired 10 rounds of small arms fire at two men running vicinity AN PH. CH (1) (LT 970663). Searched for VC casualties with negative results.

At 022255H a Co K squad at SONG CHU DO (LT 998705) heard sounds of movement (from two bunker positions) in rice paddy vicinity gully (LT 999705). Used one hand parachute illumination, then two M-26 grenades and directed 10 rounds M-14 fire into the gully area. No further movement heard and no sign of any VC casualties.

At 022345H, the 3d platoon, Co K, (BT 046723) received sporadic small arms fire from VC located about 100 meters south across SONG VINH DIEN vicinity (BT 046722); exact location of VC could not be determined and fire was not returned. The VC fire killed one older male VN civilian. Marines carried sand across river on 3 February, at request of relatives, in order that he could be buried. A Vietnamese boy was wounded in arm in a similar shooting incident at 030600H; location of sniper approximately the same. Marine squad crossed river in LVT, searched with negative results. VN boy med-evac'd.

3 Feb 1966. At 030001H a Co M squad ambush (LT 958653) in AN PH. CH (1) hamlet noted two VC passing to the west and two VC approaching the rear of the ambush from the south. The Marines fired about 100 rounds of small arms at the two pairs of VC at this time. The VC did not return the fire and the thickly vegetated area was searched for casualties; evidence of VC casualties not found; nor were any confirmed with detailed search conducted at first light on 3 February. Estimated two VC WIL (possible).

031000H a Co L squad patrol vicinity DUYEN SON (3) (LT 950656) had a grenade thrown at them by two VC. The Marines shot one VC; apprehended one VCC; both delivered to IIT. One VC WIL captured, one VCC captured; no USMC casualties. Two Chicom grenades and one cartridge belt captured.

At 031000H squad S/D Co I found a 155 mm and (LT 983636) and cave 5' by 4' by 3' vicinity (LT 968639); both were destroyed.

At about 031045H a Co L squad on S/D mission located an old punji trap at one foot deep vicinity LA CHAU (2) (LT 946647); destroyed, filled in hole.

RE: SONG HUNG

At 031130H Co L received heavy small arms fire from estimated 15 VC at (LT 957663) vicinity DUYEN SON (2). Battery F (2/12) fired 16 rounds of HE 105mm; excellent effect on target.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1 Feb 1966. At 011050H a Co I squad patrol (rein) with an engineer team was on a search mission in the vicinity (LT 99953), resulting in two (2) WIA's (one med-evac'd). The patrol then continued on to H. DUNG bridge, met an LVTE and returned to Hill 55. At 011130H a platoon from Co F (2/9) made contact with VC vicinity BICH NAM (LT 999638), sustaining one (1) USMC WIA (med-evac'd), returned fire with an artillery mission (BT 003632), 14 rounds 105mm HE, and an 81mm mortar mission of 28 rounds HE and 2 rounds WP. Tanks were moved to support and Co K (3/3) reserve platoon alerted. At 011230H a platoon patrol Co F was in contact with an estimated 10 VC, receiving small arms fire and automatic weapons fire. Sustained one (1) WIA (med-evac'd). Directed 48 rounds WP and 2 rounds HE 105mm artillery mission against VC position (BT 003633) to (BT 003630). VC fire ceased, and a detailed search of enemy positions underway at 011305H. At 011550H the 3d BN, 4d Marines requested Sparrow Hawk to reinforce friendly troops engaged with an estimated 5 to 10 VC at (LT 970650) and (LT 976647). At 011615H Sparrow Hawk squad landed (LT 964643) after UH-1's conducted airstrike. Sparrow Hawk retreated at 011706H. At 011325H the 2d platoon, Co I, (3/3) was moved into positions at ~~LT 976647~~ relieving H&S Co of assigned duties.

At 011842H the Co I CP (LT 967616) directed 8 rounds of 90mm WP and 20 rounds of HE at 8 VC observed running south into a house across the SONG LI WHIL River (LT 974601). 8 VC hit on target. 8 VC KIA.

At 011910H Co L reported they were holding one VCS, apprehended (LT 942650) VCS evacuated to IPT.

At 012135H a squad S/D patrol (BT 029644) from Co E (2/9) received about 400 rounds of S/L from an unknown number of VC about 600 meters west, vicinity LN TU (1) (BT 023643); sustained one marine WIA. About 250 rounds of S/L were directed at the VC, 11 rounds of 81mm EP fired on target with good effect and four rounds of M-79; commenced search of area. Med-evac helo reportedly received .50 cal machine gun fire. Another squad and two (2) Ontos sent to reinforce the patrol. No more movement or fire observed, search was continued, Co K reserve platoon alerted and committed to reinforce and assist with search. Troops searched grid squares (BT 0264), (BT 0364), (BT 0263), and (BT 0363) until 020230H, with negative results. The reinforcing squad, Ontos, and Co K platoon returned to Co E CP to prepare for search and destroy operation to commence at 020430H.

Evacuation. It was noted by 3/3 that school attendance at LN THACH (1) increased from the usual 20 to 44 children on 31 Jan 1966; believed due to the opening of the new footbridge across the SONG NAM River.

2 Feb 1966. At 020712H a Co L platoon patrol (LT 955604) received 50 rounds of S/L fire from an estimated 3 VC (LT 953603). The patrol fired 400 rounds S/L and two (2) 3.5" WP, moved into area and conducted search with negative results.

At 020900H a Co E (2/9) river patrol consisting of two (2) LVT's with a fire team on each, approached a 61-diameter round boat (BT 034555) on the SONG NAM DIEN river. When a grappling hook was attached to the boat and the boat moved, it exploded. Found 4 more boats on the west side of river. Checked each with negative results.

ENCLOSURE (1)

At 031158H SPARROW HAWK was activated; situation found estimated 10 VC with automatic weapons vicinity DUYEN SON (2) (AT 953663); LZ (AT 945650) about 1300 meters Southwest, M-1/3/3 blocking on East bank of SONG YEN, L-3/3 (AT 952660) moving on enemy from river (East), L-2/3/3 commenced, first elements landed (L2) (AT 950645) South vicinity PHU SON (2) spreading block East to SONG YEN at 031255H. SPARROW HAWK squad meanwhile swept Southwest to Northeast. M-1/3/3 still blocking on East side of SONG YEN, had shifted block to cover about 700 meters of bank West of AN TRACH (2) and (3) (AT 965653).

SPARROW HAWK 3 (Gunship) fired a mission in support of SPARROW HAWK squad prior to landing, and a second mission in preparing LZ for K-2/3/3. SPARROW HAWK squad and L-2/3/3 linked up and conducted detailed search South through the target area.

At 031445H while searching the area the SPARROW HAWK squad received three MIA and one KIA, and 2d platoon, Company L one MIA from mines, five USMC med evacuated. Company L destroyed one 81mm dud at (AT 953659); further search of area produced negative results. SPARROW HAWK secured at 031555H.

At 031830H an engineer team with Company L destroyed three duds in place, one 81mm round (AT 953654), one 60mm round (AT 946662) and one M-25 grenade (AT 946654).

As of 032125H, clearing operation vicinity Hill 55 had progressed to the South along river to (AT 974613) where two ramps had been constructed to permit LVT's easy access to the bank of river. Six line charges had been used and nine secondary explosions achieved, one of which was possibly a 155mm shell or larger. The VC mines were laid in triangular pattern on crest that might be used by vehicles.

At 032244H an HK&S Company provisional platoon position, on CP perimeter (AT 962685), received six rounds of small arms automatic weapons fire. Exact source of the fire could not be determined. No fire was returned, no USMC casualties reported.

At 031810H it was reported that the school house in AN TRACH (1) vicinity (AT 972662) was burned to the ground; desks, chairs and equipment were saved. It was believed the fire was a result of Vietnamese children playing with matches but further investigation on 4 February indicated that a 10 year old boy received 100 Plasters from VC for starting fire, with promise of 900 Plasters after burning. Boy was sent to HOA VANG District Headquarters for questioning.

4 Feb 1966. At 040150H a Company E (2/9) platoon at VINH DIEN riverblock (BT 031648) fired AR's and M-79's at three VC tampering with cable. Observed one VC hit, two VC dragged him into the brush. VC did not return fire. Search at first light on 4 February produced no bodies. One VC MIA (poss).

At 041143H a Company L squad patrol Northeast of PHU SON (2) (AT 951650) received small arms automatic fire from estimated three VC located (AT 953650) about 200 meters East, near the SONG YEN. The patrol returned the fire with small arms, called a 17 round 81mm mortar (WP) mission and then assaulted the position. A detailed search provided no evidence of VC casualties.

At 041200H a squad LVT river patrol, Company E (2/9), received small arms and automatic fire from three VC on SONG VINH DIEN river bank (BT 041401). Returned fire with small arms and one round of M-79, killed one VC (body count) before the VC fled. Dead VC had cartridge belt and one CHICOM grenade on body. Weapon fell in river.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 041420H ten VC sighted by Co I in open (LT 953656); Battery 4 (2/12) fired 105mm artillery mission of 36 HE (VT) and four HE (u). One squad, 50 M, searched for VC casualties with negative results.

At 041430H Co L squad LVT patrol (LT 962677) received about 30 rounds small arms fire from both sides SONG YEN. Returned S/L, 2 M-79's, 1 81mm WP (not obs). LVT had maneuver problems. Two USMC WIA. Received no more fire from VC; searched area with negative results.

One platoon (-), Co B (2/9), conducted S/D patrol through grid squares (BT 0265), (BT 0264), (BT 0263), (BT 0364), (BT 0363) and (BT 0362); one platoon Co F (2/9), conducted S/D in grid squares (LT 9961), (LT 9962) and (LT 9963), a light section of tanks in support located (LT 981623). Operation commenced at 040730H and terminated 041600H.

At 041920H a Co M squad S/D reported completion of clearing 300 meters of bamboo vicinity TEN HE (4) (LT 976677); also destroyed 20 foot long (3'x3') tunnel (LT 975675), smoke machine was utilized revealing eight air holes in the tunnel prior to destruction by demolitions.

At 042035H a Co K patrol reported that a Co C, 3d LT Bn, 3/4 ton PC overturned in drenching storm (LT 986671) along road west of DUONG SON (3). One Marine (Co C, 3d LT Bn) pinned under truck in paddy was reported DOL at 0 and C due to drowning.

5 Feb 1966. 050015H a Co I tank-mounted spotlight revealed one VC West of Hill 55 (LT 964620). Marines directed small arms at the VC and 40 rounds of 60mm mortar were fired to search and traverse the defilade area; a squad was dispatched and searched for VC casualties with negative results.

Two platoons of Co L (3/3) and one platoon of Co A (1/1) established cordon around LA CHAU (1) (LT 944665) at first light. CS/CN, gas masks and two dog teams were utilized in search for tunnels. By 050855H the force had 110 persons for ID check. Operation secured at 050945H with no enemy contact.

At 050715H a Co I squad patrol vicinity CHAU SON (3) Southwest of Hill 55 (LT 954607) received about 100 rounds of small arms fire from several automatic weapons located some 400 meters to the west. The Marines returned the fire with several hundred rounds of small arms, three rounds of 3.5 WP, six rounds of 106M Ontos, two rounds of 90mm WP and five rounds of 90mm HE. A detailed search of the area provided no evidence of VC casualties.

At 050745H a Co I platoon patrol Southwest of Hill 55 chased two VC toward SONG LA NGHIA (LT 952605). A short time later, the Marine OP (LT 963609) which had observed the chase and saw VC climb patrol, sighted two VC paddling a boat. First (LT 963604), fired on the VC and received small arms fire from South of the river (LT 963603). A fire team and an Ontos sent to search the area sighted two boats covered with bamboo (LT 966604) on the South side of river, but had no contact and returned to the OP. Villagers from vicinity (LT 962605) brought a VN man to the OP with a gunshot wound in the arm; the man is believed to be one of the men who ran from the patrol and was seen on the river. Classified as a VCS and evacuated to C Med.

At about 051330H AD reported that four armed VC in uniforms on SONG LA T. reached and joined three others vicinity (BT 019607), on Southwest bank. To the East the AD observed seven VC in trenchline vicinity (BT 020605); artillery mission fired at (BT 020605) expending 30 HE (u) rounds and 35 HE (VT) 105mm. AD reports that rounds hit directly on target. AD estimated two VC WIA.

ENCLOSURE

Feb-Mar.

a. Twenty-seven families moved back into YEN NE (4) (AT 976677) in the three weeks Marines and Pacification Teams have been working in the hamlet. Families have indicated others intend to return also. At a meeting in AN TRACH (1) (AT 972652), villagers indicated:

- (1) Desire that strategic hamlets be made of AN TRACH (1), YEN NE (4) and LA BONG (1) (AT 975675).
- (2) That they plan barbed wire and bamboo fences around hamlets with controlled entrances.
- (3) That they plan to organize a militia for protection against VC attacks.
- (4) That they desired the Marine Corps provide 4600 feet of barbed wire to help build the fences.

At 052105H a squad river patrol (Co L) utilizing two LVT's heading North on SONG YEN, West of LA BONG (1) (AT 965672), received small arms automatic weapons fire from river bank (AT 967670). The rear LVT returned fire with small arms and M-79's. The lead LVT, 200 meters forward, turned to support and received about 20 rounds small arms fire from second VC position (AT 963674). Small arms and M-79's directed at that VC position also. A total of 17 rounds M-79 and several hundred rounds small arms were expended; squad patrol (Co L) diverted West of the river vicinity (AT 961670) for support; and squad patrol (Co M) deployed vicinity (AT 967670) to search the Eastern bank of SONG YEN. The VC broke contact before squads ashore positioned; efforts to regain contact or locate VC casualties unsuccessful.

At 052220H a Company M squad patrol, searching AN TRACH village (AT 968658) for reported five VC armed with one machine gun and two rifles, reported negative results their search. Villagers claimed VC fled South into cane field before Marines arrived but no evidence found to support or refute claim.

6 Feb 66. At 061150H a Company I platoon on search and destroy mission vicinity (AT 960603) received about thirty rounds of small arms fire from unknown number of VC positioned 100 yards South across SONG AT NGHIA river (AT 960602). The Marine platoon fired about 100 rounds small arms, three rounds 3.5 (WP) and three 106mm RR in brief engagement. The VC broke contact; the platoon did not search area due to contact being across river and outside TAOR.

At 061553H a Company I platoon S/D patrol destroyed a tunnel under bamboo tree line (AT 948603); tunnel was 15'x12'x10', entrance 1'x1', reinforced with 4x4's, two air holes. Smoke machine used but a search with dogs failed to find any VC or weapons.

At 061830H a Marine with platoon (Company K) on S/D mission, actuated mine of unknown type (AT 957679); resulted in two USMC KIA, med evacuated.

At 062105H a TFS-21, vicinity Company L CP (AT 954667), indicated possible VC squad about 600 meters South of Hill 22 vicinity BUYEN SON (2) (AT 955662). After directing two rounds of 90mm, 14 rounds of 81mm mortars and about 50 rounds of M-60, TFS-21 still indicated enemy presence. Marines fired two rounds of 90mm, 20 rounds of M-60, 20 rounds of 81mm mortars and 22 rounds 105 (HE); TFS negative sighting. Squad search conducted through target area, VC casualties were not evident.

At 070242H a Co K PFB (LT 959685) received about 20 rounds of small arms fire and two grenades from VC to the west of their position. The exact position was not determined due to deep underbrush, no fire was returned; no URM casualties reported.

At 070740H a Co I Marine, vicinity Hill 55 squad OP (LT 970620), stepped on a booby trapped 105mm round. One Marine WIA, med evacuated.

A Co K S/D platoon crossed IOD at 070800H east of SONG YEN (LT 965689) and swept South, with a squad providing security on western side of SONG YEN, to a squad blocking position (LT 963672). At 071030H a mine (LT 959681) resulted in one USMC WIA, med evacuated to C med. One booby trap destroyed (LT 950603); one spider trap blown (LT 959682); one tunnel destroyed (LT 958679), Co/CN used on tunnel prior to destruction. Platoon S/D terminated at 071130H.

Co L (*) on S/D mission crossed IOD vicinity (LT 947663) at approximately 070800H; Ontos on West. one platoon blocked South from (LT 943646) East to SONG YEN, one platoon of Co M blocked East along SONG YEN.

At 071013H booby trapped Chicom grenade destroyed in place (LT 956655).

At 071039H found one rusty canteen and medical supplies (LT 955655).

At 071220H elements linked up, secured operation and returned to CP; negative VC contact.

A platoon S/D operation, Co F (2/9) commenced 071000H vicinity BICH BAO (GS 9863) and South of HA DONG Bridge along RR (GS 9962 and 9961).

At 071133H fired destruction mission on VC prepared defensive positions at (LT 992628); fifty-eight rounds of 105mm HE and 54 rounds of WP were fired with good effect on target.

At 071410H a Co F Marine with the S/D force activated a M-26 grenade mine with a trip wire (LT 994624); one WIA, med evacuated.

At 071525H an LVT, in support Co F S/D, detonated a mine vicinity BICH BAO (LT 985637); disabled, towed to HA DONG Bridge (LT 990642); two Marines WIA, med evacuated.

At 071550H a Marine of H&S Co (2/9) stepped on a mine (LT 994677) in the 2d Battalion CP; the wounded Marine was evacuated.

At 071600H, Co I employed two line charges on Hill 55 vicinity (LT 969619), achieved seven secondary explosions. Clearing operations continue.

PSY WIA

Report of 070920H indicates that approximately 150 Vietnamese attended IN TRACH (1) market vicinity (LT 966664) on 6 February. The market was reestablished by elements of 3/3 in recent past; many utilizing market were from LA CHAU village west of SONG YEN, crossed river on USMC footbridge vicinity (LT 962660).

At 071930H a Co L squad (wire team) apprehended two VCs vicinity DUYEN SON (LT 943664); one VCS had 26,500 piasters, the other had 17,700 piasters. Interpreter suspects they are VC supply men, evacuated to IPT.

At 071930H Co M positions (LT 972652) received about 30 rounds of small arms fire from (estimated) six VC approximately 400 meters southwest and Northwest vicinity IN TRACH (2) (LT 971649) and (LT 969655). The Marines returned small arms fire and a squad was maneuvered into the area to search. At 071940H a Co M platoon CP (LT 972663) received about four rounds of small arms from a VC position across (west of) the SONG YEN. The Marines directed about fifty rounds of small arms and two rounds 81mm HE at the VC; two men were observed running South along the near (East) side of the river; not fired on because of Marines searching in the area. Search after both incidents met with negative results.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 071935H Co I positions on Hill 55 vicinity (LT 970620) received ten rounds of carbine fire from the Northwest, below XUAN DIEM (2) vicinity (LT 963634) illuminated with tank searchlight; target not located, held fire.

At about 072000H, the platoon position (F 2/9) at HUBONG bridge vicinity (LT 990642) received approximately six rounds of S/A fire from BICH BAC vicinity (LT 985637). The VC positions could not be located, and fire was not returned.

At 072115H a Co F (2/9) FT ambush (LT 025664) heard noises 150 meters North (approx); suspecting a VC ambush, the Marines displaced to the North, fired two claymore mines and about 80 rounds of 7.62mm at the position. The FT searched and found a trench, but VC casualties were not evident.

At 072210H the Lt Col Co squad at bridge #2 (LT 999699) received two rounds of small arms fire from tree line several hundred meters west vicinity PHONG LE (1) (LT 997698). Fired about 200 rounds of small arms and one round of 81mm HE at the area; searched immediate area with negative results.

8 Feb 1966. Co I squad (LT 949609), within 100 meters of intended blocking position, received 15 rounds of small arms fire from four directions. The squad established a 360° perimeter defense and directed about 600 rounds of small arms and one 3.5 WP at the surrounding tree lines and foliage suspected of concealing the VC. After VC fire ceased and a hasty search of immediate area revealed no sign of VC casualties. The squad continued on original mission establishing a block for S/V force North of Chu SON (2) vicinity (LT 949608). This at 080520H.

At 080955H the (Co I) platoon S/V patrol vicinity Chu SON (2) received about 15 rounds of small arms fire from (LT 948608); patrol returned small arms and on assaulting the position, assaulted. The VC had fled and no sign of casualties found. Further search of the positions, utilizing dog teams, produced one notebook, forwarded to BN S-2.

At 081055H a Co E (2/9) squad VINH DIEM river block (BT 032648) received about 30 rounds of small arms fire from Pagoda vicinity (BT 033652) on the East side of river. The Marines returned fire with about 100 rounds of small arms and scored direct hit on Pagoda with one round LAM; dispatched one fire team of LVT to search Pagoda and vicinity. Search produced no VC casualties; one VC WIA (possible).

SPARROW HAWK. At 081210H elements of Co K received small arms and LAM fire from vicinity LU CHAU (3) (LT 957678) conducting search and destroy mission on both banks of SONG YEN (GS 9568). Sparrow Hawk frag order was issued at 081220H; Sparrow Hawk was airborne at 1242H, landing 1252H at LU (LT 963672). The 3d platoon (Co K) blocked on East side of river, as Sparrow Hawk moved into block at (LT 949677) at about 1305H; at 1310H the 2d platoon (Co K), moving South along West side of river, commenced sweep Southeast through LU CHAU (3) toward Sparrow Hawk. The 2d platoon (Co K) located one booby trap (LT 960676), cautioned Sparrow Hawk about the high ground booby trap hazards in the village, and completed sweep at 1335H without further incident. Sparrow Hawk was retracted at 081555H from LU (LT 957677).

At 081324H a squad patrol Co E, (2/9) (BT 019641) received ten rounds of small arms fire from a VC position about 200 meters Southeast vicinity PHONG LOC (1) (BT 015640). The patrol returned about 50 rounds of small arms, four rounds of 81mm mortar WP and assaulted the VC position. The VC had withdrawn quickly and the patrol found no evidence of casualties.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 081330H a Co M squad patrol (MT 969655) vicinity N TANG (2) received 2 rounds of small arms fire from some 300 meters Southwest. Small arms fire was directed at the VC and one squad with an Ontos assaulted and pursued, but lost VC in the foliage.

SPARROW HAWK. At 081425H a squad patrol (Co B) made contact with estimated VC platoon vicinity (BT 015627); artillery fired mission and at 081435H a Sparrow Hawk Frog Order was issued; sighting report from (3/3) MW indicated possible platoon of VC, in green uniforms with helmets, vicinity PHONG LUC (3) (BT 015627); Sparrow Hawk LG (BT 014634); elements of Co B (2/9) at (BT 017626) and (BT 028664) all moving; no contact. At 081745H still no contact, Sparrow Hawk retracted.

At 081845H a Co L squad S/D patrol destroyed two M-26 grenade booby traps, vicinity LI CHAU (MT 957667), which villagers had shown the patrol; arranging money award for the aid.

At 082000H a Co M squad patrol (MT 972657) received about 30 rounds of small arms fire from possible three weapons, including one MW, vicinity LE SON (MT 973658). The Marines encircled the VC position but located no VC; no Marine casualties reported.

At 082147H a Co F squad (2/9) approaching their ambush position (MT 990658) received one grenade and observed three men running away. The squad fired small arms at them and pursued; observed one VC fall as though hit by fire but the VC managed to avoid capture in darkness and surrounding foliage. One VC WIA (possible).

At 082345H the squad LVT patrol (Co K) on SONG YEN River (MT 963692) received two rounds of S/A fire from West river bank vicinity (MT 962689). The patrol returned about 20 rounds of small arms fire and searched for VC casualties with negative results. Patrol sustained two minor WIA's (one USMC, one USN).

9 Feb 1966. At 091100H a Co E (2/9) patrol (BT 010644) vicinity HA TAY, received about eight rounds of MW fire from a VC some 300 meters West (BT 007000). The patrol called 81mm fire mission, 10 WP and five HE, and assaulted the position; located a network of caves and a tunnel (MT 008648), which have been destroyed. No further contact or evidence of VC casualties.

At about 091145H a Co K platoon patrol sustained one Marine WIA from a mine of unknown composition vicinity LI CHAU (3) (MT 959678); aid not required and evacuation.

At 091200H the Co K platoon patrol, while in same vicinity (MT 959677), tripped a mine on side of trail, also of unknown composition; three USMC WIA, med evacuated.

At 091230H a Co E platoon on S/D mission (BT 010640) vicinity PHONG LUC (1) observed five VC in trench line some 600 meters South-Southwest vicinity LI THO BAC (1) (BT 008634). The Marines directed small arms at the VC and closer on the position; one VC was hit, another seen dragging him away. Called 81mm mission on three VC seen in same area (10 rounds HE, four WP); another VC observed being dragged away. Directed two rounds of 3.5 WP and three rounds of M-79; laid base of fire and assaulted position. Found documents, maps and picture of HO CHI MINH (to Bn B-2). VC casualties not apprehended, no further contact. Two VC WIA.

ENCLOSURE

At 092140H a squad LVT patrol on SONG YEN river vicinity (AT 961677) received about 20 rounds small arms/automatic weapons fire from both sides of river. The patrol directed over 100 rounds of small arms at the VC positions as the LVT's moved from between the opposing fires. Enemy fire ceased; VC casualties could not be determine. No Marine casualties.

10 Feb 66. At 100100H a TRS-21 on Company I perimeter (AT 953657) indicated possible VC movement about 250 meters South. The Marines fired about 100 rounds from tank machine gun, illuminated with six rounds 81mm, searched with infra-red device and dispatched squad to search; negative results.

At 100120H, Company K CP received one round sniper fire (AT 961608); five rounds of small arms was directed at the VC sniper. Sustained one WIA USMC, med evac.

At approximately 100800H a Company F squad patrol vicinity HA DONG tripped two grenades rigged with trip wires, one WP (AT 996643) and one frag grenade (AT 997643), resulting in two WIA's USMC, med evac. The patrol apprehended two VCS in the vicinity (AT 996646), evac to Company F CP for interrogation.

At 100912H a platoon on search and destroy mission (Company K) destroyed three spidertraps (AT 964687), (3'x4'x2'), with 8 pounds C-4.

At 101320H a squad patrol (Company I) activated a mine of unknown composition vicinity BICH BAC (AT 985635) resulting in two WIA's USMC med evac.

Psy-War. Company L (3/3) established a signal system with villagers of DUEN SON and LA CHAU complexes, grid squares (AT 9466), (AT 9566) and (AT 9666). The signals are to be a means by which villagers can let Marines on Hill 22 know when VC are in the villages. This is the first time villagers have admitted that VC come into their villages.

11 Feb 66. At 110515H a squad, Company I, enroute to cordon position as part of platoon S/D mission, received about 20 rounds of small arms (AT 963626); VC strength estimated at ten men, positioned about 100 meters North of the squad vicinity XUAN DIEM (2) (AT 963627). The Marines returned the fire with small arms and, when fire ceased, checked area with negative results, then continued to cordon village.

At 110755H the platoon (Company I) on S/D mission XUAN DIEM (2) grid square (AT 96362), had completed cordon of village. One squad with dog teams commenced search from South (AT 963626) to North; negative contact throughout.

At 110830H a Company K squad S/D (AT 959678) located one M-26 booby trap with 10' monofilament line. Grenade found on trail tied to stick, one foot off paddy dike. Booby trap was blown in place. At 111110H (AT 961673) engineer with squad S/D found VC mine, 6'x3'x2' with friction type fuze. Mine seemed to have been discarded, no trip wire. Mine is being forwarded to Battalion S-2.

At 110850H a squad patrol (Company K) located and destroyed booby trapped M-26 grenade (AT 959678).

At 110920H a platoon (Company M) on S/D mission vicinity THAI CAM (1), located (estimated) 2800 pounds of rice (AT 969643); half of rice left for twelve families in village, remainder marked for their future use and moved to AN TRACH storage. (Further info: see Psy-War).

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 111245H the 2a platoon, Co I, completed construction of three road blocks leading into ASB#1 vicinity (AT 988724); also completed anti-mortar trenches.

At 111400H FP Co F (2/9) controlled 105mm fire mission on squad VC with weapons (AT 959644), 30 rounds HE fired with good effect on target. Search of area produced no evidence of VC casualties.

At 111405H Co L squad found and destroyed freshly dug man-size punji trap (AT 956664).

~~SV-100~~. There were approximately 2800 pounds of rice found in vicinity THAI CAM (AT 969643); half was left for the twelve families; half was overhauled for storage in N KACH (1) (AT 972662). Co M commander and pacification team explained to village leader that the rice was being held to keep the VC from confiscating it. Bags were marked in the presence of villagers for later reissue.

At 111920H squad (E 2/9) on SONG VINH DIEN LVT patrol vicinity MLEU BONG (2) received about 20 rounds of small arms fire from East bank of river (BT 035503). The squad returned about 200 rounds of 7.62 mm machine gun, 25 rounds of M-79 then beached and searched area; negative results, no JUNG casualties reported.

At 112110H a Co K fire team listening post (AT 961673) received one frag grenade from a (suspected) VC position Southwest; returned one grenade, one M-79 and ten rounds of small arms; searched area with negative results, one Marine KIA non-evac'd.

12 Feb 1966. At 120615H a squad (Co I) on search and destroy mission found a homemade booby trap (AT 956625); destroyed in place.

At 120800H a squad (E 2/9) on river block (BT 031648), received about three rounds of small arms fire from VC position East of SONG VINH DIEN vicinity (BT 034653). The squad returned small arms and three rounds of M-79 were directed at the VC position with unknown results; enemy fire ceased.

Combined search and destroy mission commenced 120800H with one platoon (Rein), Co F and one platoon (Rein), Co E moving South from grid line (65) between grid lines (99) and (04); platoons about 1000 meters apart.

At about 120900H the Co F platoon (BT 006633) received about 20 rounds of small arms fire from the South (BT 006631); returned about 100 rounds of small arms, enemy fire ceased. Searched area with negative results.

At 121025H the Co F platoon received small arms fire; artillery fired 24 rounds HE and 20 rounds of WP 105mm at (BT 010624). A second mission was directed at VC position (BT 019625), consisting of 31 rounds HE 105mm. Results not observed.

At 121125H an artillery mission of 22 rounds HE 105mm was directed at (BT 010627) when elements of the search and destroy force reported receiving small arms fire from that position.

At 121144H the search and destroy force reported observing a group of moving South below PHONG LUC (3) vicinity (BT 002619); called an artillery mission of 60 rounds HE 105mm; FO report indicated at least one VC KIA (possible).

Villagers of LA THO BAC (1) (BT 006631) reported that about 60 VC occupied ambush positions (BT 006632) from which initial fire was received.

Enemy contacts were made at coordinates; (BT 006632), (BT 004629), (BT 010625), (BT 007623), (AT 996632) and (BT 015623).

ENCLOSURE (3)

Nine artillery missions were fired in objective area; additional missions (AO) against 6-3 VC in trench (BT 009606) South of BUNG LA THU; also an artillery and UH-1E mission was directed by AO against a building (BT 016605) in which an estimated 20 VC had congregated.

Enemy casualties include:

3-KIA, confirmed (2-S/L, 1-arty)
2-WIA, confirmed
12 KIA, possible (7-air, 5-arty)
37-WIA, possible (15-air, 22-arty)
1-VCS apprehended PHONG LUC (2), wounded, evac'd.

Enemy fortifications and equipment destroyed included:

6-Bunkers 4'x4' (BT 011617)
3-Tunnels, vicinity (BT 016618); secondary explosions
2-Boats, vicinity (BT 008608)

Friendly casualties sustained:

1-WIA, USMC (gunshot, left shoulder), condition good
1 WIA, USMC (punji trap), not evacuated
2-WIA's, USMC (fragmentation in tunnel demolition)

Observations: VC encountered in operation were dressed in either khaki uniforms or khaki and black; no enemy machine gun fire encountered, unusual for this area; actual enemy strength in the area based on operation was one VC Company.

At 120930H a VC surrendered at Co M CP (AT 972662). The "rallier" was evacuated to Regimental S-2 and IIT for processing at 121230H; a "rallier" who surrendered on 10 February was evacuated at the same time.

At 121253H a Co L platoon PFB received one round of sniper fire from (AT 954633). Patrol returned six rounds of 7.62, two LAW's and five M-79, observing two VC falling. One VC KIA. Body on other side of river. One USMC KIA med evacuated.

At 121325H a Co L squad (AT 956659) squad apprehended one VC armed with C4/MOM grenade. Evacuated to Battalion CP for transportation to IIT.

At 121340H a Co L platoon PFB (AT 953629) received two rounds of small arms fire from vicinity (AT 955633); small arms fire returned by USMC with further contact.

At 121345H a Co L squad located VC log books and medical supplies (AT 956659); delivered to Battalion CP.

At 121823H Co B (2/9) PFB positions vicinity PHONG LUC (1) (BT 007637) received heavy S/A fire from Southwest vicinity (BT 003631). Artillery mission consisting of 30 rounds HE and 26 rounds WP was directed at the VC; FO reported two VC WIA observed and five buildings destroyed. Squad patrol searched area with negative results.

ENCLOSURE (2)

At 122005H the 1st platoon, Co K, reported receiving one grenade thrown in a forward position (AT 961673) that was unoccupied. The Marines fired about 20 rounds of small arms fire and two M-79's with unknown results.

At 122130H a squad patrol Co K, vicinity LA CHAU (3) (AT 955670), was fired upon by estimated six VC in bamboo area vicinity (AT 956670); the patrol directed small arms fire, three grenades and four shotgun blast at the VC. Search proved negative; VC apparently fled; believed there may have been an ambush awaiting LVT patrol. Reported one VC KIA (possible). Further search 130700H resulted in finding one M-26 grenade and expended M-16 cartridge; (AT 956670).

13 Feb 1966. At 130630H a Company I squad patrol located and destroyed one 15'x2'x2' tunnel reinforced with bamboo (AT 957603), and two punji traps (AT 957605).

At 131015H a Co E squad patrol vicinity PHONG LUC (1) (BT 020639) saw three VC run into village (BT 017639); villagers then ran from village with animals; called 81mm mortar mission (seven rounds HE) and conducted search of area; no sign of any VC casualties.

On 13 February Co M conducted a platoon search for fighting holes, trenches and tunnels in vicinity of "no name" village (AT 966677); the company had no enemy contact during the search.

At 131400H a Co I OP (AT 963609) received about three rounds of S/A fire from Southwest of Hill 55 vicinity (AT 961608). A fire team was dispatched to search, apprehended one male VCs who had an ID card but had not been seen in the area before; also located two tunnels vicinity (AT 961608). The VCs was evacuated to Battalion S-2 for interrogation; CS/CN and demolitions sent with patrol to clear and destroy tunnels.

At 131445H Co L reported that a squad search and destroy patrol filled in 63 holes on 13 February vicinity PHU SON (3) (AT 952644); no hostile contact.

At 131330H Co E squad saw one man 25-28 years old running into village; searched village house by house; negative results. Squad found 18 rounds of carbine ammo and cave at (BT 014653); cave destroyed with 10 pounds of C-4.

At 131813H the mine clearing detail vicinity Hill 55 (AT 967616) detonated three line charges (AT 964623) to (AT 969623) which achieved twelve secondary explosions.

At 132055H a Co E squad vicinity PHONG LUC (2) (BT 011633), ambushed three VC, killing two (body count); searched for third VC with negative results.

Psy-War

Co L (3/3) is currently attempting to organize a school with villagers for LA CHAU-LUYEN SON Complex vicinity grid square (AT 9566); have school kits for 100 children and one building which villagers and Marines have cleared up. Plan to conduct three hours daily instruction on arithmetic, writing and personal hygiene; had Cap daily and Psy-war Team weekly.

14 Feb 1966. At about 140300H, in vicinity Co L CP (AT 953667), SID initiated movement vicinity LA CHAU (4) (AT 950667); fired 81mm illumination and six rounds M-79. Searched area with tank light and fired eight rounds 105mm (AT 947667); apprehended one VCs (AT 947667) without ID. Found no evidence of casualties.

At 140920H a Co I platoon on search and destroy mission located a booby trapped 105mm shell vicinity XUAN DIEM (1) (AT 967637), M4VH dog took sniffer trip wire and would not move; shell checked and disarmed by engineers, destroyed in place.

At 140920H a platoon search and destroy Co I vicinity LE SON (5) (AT 960639) received S/A fire from a VC positioned some 700 meters North vicinity LE SON (4) (AT 960646); patrol fired one round 3.5, VC ceased fire and apparently fled. No VC casualties were found on search on the position.

At 141005H elements of Co S (2/9) (BT 030635) received small arms fire from vicinity PHONG LUC (1) (BT 025634); returned fire with 27 rounds small arms, 15 M-79's, 2 LAW and artillery FO called fire mission, 15 rounds HE and 12 rounds WP. Effect of artillery fire not determined as FO was not able to adequately observe and VC casualties were not evident in search that was conducted.

At 141010H a Co F (2/9) platoon patrol vicinity TAN HANH (AT 996656) located and destroyed a concussion-type grenade. The patrol also experienced a large explosion in the same vicinity, believed to be an electrically detonated booby trap or mine that may have been activated prematurely. There were no USMC casualties reported. Twelve punji traps, two man traps, and 2 tunnels 5'x10' were destroyed during this operation.

At 141045H Co I platoon on search and destroy mission vicinity LE SON (5) (AT 959639), received one round of S/A fire from the northwest vicinity (AT 958644); the VC's exact location could not be determined, fire was not repeated. At 141100H the patrol apprehended one male VC loitering in paddy conducted helo evac vicinity (AT 958638). The patrol destroyed a tunnel (AT 954644) that was 2'x2'x4'.

Co M assisted villagers at LU SONG (1) and YEN NE (4) in construction and renovation of strategic hamlets and school house at AN TRACH (1).

Psy-War. Co L provided a security squad for I Corps psy-war team in village of LA CHAU (4) (AT 951669). Theme of the presentation was "Why Marines are in RVN and that Allied victory is inevitable". Leaflets and books were handed out to 10 adults and 20 children present.

126 villagers worked in AN TRACH (1) (AT 966664) on February 14th clearing brush and working on school.

School attendance at AN TRACH (1) was up to 53 students on 14 Feb; villagers of LA PHONG (1) (AT 973671) indicated desire to start a 3d school next week in area.

About 200 villagers came to AN TRACH today to get wire for fence construction around strategic hamlets.

At about 141000H the Co I CP (AT 967616) observed a VC squad swimming in the SONG YEN (AT 948618) followed by a boat which they proceeded to unload on South bank into tree line; also observed OD-colored packs in boat, directed artillery missions (2 rounds WP, 2 rounds WP, 15 rounds HE 105mm); tank detected 10 rounds 90mm and observed artillery fire through BC scope; one round 105mm hit within 10 feet of two VC running in open. Mortars also fired 14 rounds 81mm HE from Hill 55. Two VC KIA.

ENCLOSURE (2)

At 142100H Co F squad vicinity LE SON (1) (AT 983658), moving to ambush position, received one hand grenade from nearby VC position to the south. The Marines returned fire with about 100 rounds small arms and four M-79's; in pursuit, received about ten rounds of small arms carbine fire before losing contact with the VC. No Marine casualties reported.

At about 142145H, tripped a wire to a grenade (AT 993655), no casualties reported.

At about 142155H, upon establishing ambush, (AT 993655) detected movement in bushes 10 meters away; fired 35 rounds of small arms and received one VC grenade. Small arms and automatic weapons fire were directed at the VC, then the Marines searched the area with negative results. No Marine casualties.

At about 142225H, in an alternate position (AT 993656) same vicinity, the squad sighted an armed VC leaving a trench 100 meters away; fired 30 rounds of small arms at the VC; searched the area but found no evidence of VC casualties.

At 142200H a Co L squad patrol vicinity DUYEN SON (2) (AT 955666), experienced one grenade explosion near their formation; called in two rounds 81mm illumination and used one hand illumination. Directed two fragmentation grenades at a suspected VC position. Searched the area with negative results. No casualties.

15 Feb 1966. At 150530H a Co I squad, west of XUAN DIEM (2) and Hill 55 (AT 950626), while returning from ambush position, received about ten rounds small arms fire and one hand grenade from "no name" village to the South vicinity (AT 950625). The Marines directed 20 rounds of small arms at the VC position and heard signal drums in the village while approaching on search; no further contact made and VC casualties were not evident.

At 150900H a member of Co I squad patrol vicinity CHAU SON (3) (AT 956604), Southwest of Hill 55, sustained minor injuries when he stepped into a punji trap; trap destroyed, continued patrol.

At 150915H Co K platoon on search and destroy sustained one non-battle casualty vicinity LA CHAU (3) (AT 961676) as a result of a blasting cap explosion, med evacuated.

At 150935H a platoon Co I on search and destroy mission vicinity CHAU SON (3) (AT 955604), Southwest of Hill 55, located and destroyed ten newly implanted punji stakes.

16 Feb 1966. At 160007H, a Co L platoon position, vicinity LA CHAU (5) (AT 957667), detected movement (AT 964667) and fired ten rounds of small arms; a search of the area disclosed no evidence of VC casualties.

At 160830H, a Co K squad, returning from search and destroy patrol, detonated a mine vicinity LA CHAU (3) (AT 961676); no injuries sustained.

At about 161000H, an engineer team, sent on a mine clearing mission, set off a large explosive of unknown composition vicinity LA CHAU (3) (AT 959676); though the Marines were 35 meters apart three USMC WIA's were sustained, med evacuated.

At approximately 161220H a small boy and a water buffalo were killed by a booby trap Southwest of Co L (3/3) CP vicinity DUYEN SON (4) (AT 945662).

At 161430H, a Co K squad, on search and destroy mission, found VC directives on the operational aspects of mines and booby-traps; also 500 cc of blood plasma (AT 953606). Further search of the area produced one female VC; evacuated to MI-7 DUG Headquarters.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 161900H, the Co L OP on Hill 55 (AT 970620) sighted a ~~enraged~~ unit being handled by an undetermined number of VN personnel, presumably VC, on bank of SONG BAN XAU vicinity (AT 961621). One tank and infantry squad dispatched to vicinity (AT 961623). Tank directed 500 rounds .30 caliber at the raft and the adjacent treeline. Raft destroyed; undetermined number of VC casualties.

At 162024H, a Co L squad ambush, vicinity Hill 22 and LA CHAU (4) (AT 951670), noted movement to its front on a SLD-150. The marines requested two rounds of 81mm illumination, threw two hand grenades and pursued two fleeing VC. Contact lost. Twenty-five rounds of small arms fire expended at enemy. Area searched; negative results.

At 162050H, a Co K squad, west of SONG YEN (AT 956682), received one grenade while enroute to its ambush position. The squad returned 20 rounds of automatic fire and pursued three VC heading North; contact was lost near DO BAN (1) (AT 956686) in thick vegetation. The VC apparently had no weapons other than grenades since no fire was returned. No confirmed VC casualties. No USMC casualties.

17 Feb 1966. At 170000H, the 3d platoon, Co K, assumed responsibility for ASP#1.

Commencing 171230H, one squad, Co K, aboard two LVT's, patrolled along SONG CHU DO between (AT 971698) and (AT 998707) in conjunction with search and clear operation being conducted by 3d Tank Battalion and 3d AT Battalion in GS (AT 971698) and (AT 9970).

At 171300H, a Co I platoon on search and destroy mission located and destroyed two mortar clubs; one 81mm and one 60mm vicinity (AT 963630).

At 171925H, a tank crew with Co I, OP #5, Hill 55 (AT 963609), sighted two male VC in a boat (one with rifle) on SONG AI NGHIA (AT 958603); the tank fired three rounds 90mm HE (direct hits); two VC KIA.

18 Feb 1966. At 180930H, a Co I platoon on search and destroy mission, vicinity LA SON (5) (AT 956639), received ten rounds of small arms fire from the east (AT 967630); the marines returned sixty rounds of small arms and conducted a search for VC in the immediate area. Negative results.

At 181745H, a scout-dog was seriously wounded vicinity (AT 955684) when a device of unknown composition exploded; dog DOW.

At 181830E, a Co H platoon CP (AT 963659) received two small arms rounds of harassing fire from the Southwest (AT 962656); platoon returned ten rounds of small arms fire, 60mm mortar and one round 106mm RR. A squad searched for VC casualties with negative results. No friendly casualties reported.

At 181955H, the Co I squad OP on Hill 55 (AT 963603), using tank spotlight, sighted one armed VC on a small boat on SONG AI NGHIA vicinity (AT 965605). The marines killed him with ten rounds of .50 cal machine gun fire and twenty rounds of .30 cal. Boat sank. Body left in river.

19 Feb 1966. At 190700H, a squad block (AT 963625) for Co I platoon search and destroy mission directed 10 rounds small arms fire at three VC (wearing black pajamas) vicinity XUAN DIEM (2) (AT 965628); one VC KIA and a second appeared to be hit while moving into treeline. Searched area; recovered one M-14 rifle (AT 9636495), four loaded magazines, one cartridge belt and one CHICOM grenade. Followed VC blood trail through cane field, lost trail in rice paddy. One VC KIA.

ENCLOSURE (2)

At 190745H, a Co I platoon apprehended 14 VCs vicinity XUAN DIEM (2) (AT 964 627); over to Battalion collection point for screening.

At 192010H (AT 972661) a Co M squad patrol saw 3 VC positions firing at AN TRACH (1) schoolhouse, positions were at (AT 973662), (AT 971556) and (AT 971557). It is believed the VC were armed with one AK, a carbine and an M-1 rifle. The patrol fired at the muzzle flashes, assaulted into the area, and the VC fled in the darkness. A Vietnamese boy 7 or 8 years old was killed during the fire fight.

At 192030H a Co M squad patrol (AT 961651) tripped an M-26 grenade rigged with a trip wire resulting in 3 WIA's (2 med-evac'd). As the patrol was carrying the WIA's to the LZ, 3 VC fired on them from (AT 963658). The patrol returned fire with 20 rds 60mm mortar, 24 rds 81mm mortar and 1 rd 106 RR and searched impact area. Squad rechecked area at first light and received S/A fire from approximately 4 VC (AT 962653) and (AT 962648).

At 192041H a Co L squad ambush killed one VC at (AT 954686). VC was wearing black shorts and shirt. A carbine, an M-26 grenade, cartridge belt and misc., were recovered from the body. While the squad was recovering the gear, they received 30 rds of S/A fire from (AT 956686). The squad returned fire with 100 rds S/A, 4 rds 60mm mortar, under illumination by 7 rds of 81mm. Two VC were seen to fall as if hit. A search of area at first light revealed no evidence of VC casualties. Two VC WIA (possible).

At 192143H a Co L squad ambush (AT 951666) had positive SID contact and fired one claymore. A search of area produced negative results. A recheck of area at first light was conducted, negative results. The contact was 40 meters from the claymore and in center of dispersion fan when claymore fired.

20 Feb 1966. At 201045H a Co L squad patrol received approximately 150 rds S/A from estimated 5 A/W's vicinity (AT 942640). The squad set up a base of fire and a FF assaulted into area. On making enemy contact 3/3 hold's on re-supply mission were immediately directed to Hill 22, and the remainder of L-2, reinforced with an arty and 81 FO, were heli-lifted in two lifts to an LZ at (AT 945542). Co L established one squad in a blocking position at (AT 953652). L-2 searched from South to North through objective area vicinity PHU SON (2) (AT 950647) and PHU SON (3) (AT 952642) toward blocking force. L-2 at (AT 952640) at 201250H.

At 201700H, Co I OP on Hill 55 (AT 970620), using BC scope, sighted four VC South of SONG LA THO vicinity CHAU LAU (AT 965601) and directed five rounds 50mm HE which were on target. Results: 4 VC KIA.

At 201945H, one member Co M squad patrol activated a subterranean 81mm mortar explosive device vicinity (AT 971660); three WIA, med evac'd.

21 Feb 1966. At 210007H a Co L squad ambush (AT 942647), aided by 81mm illumination, observed four VC in treeing (AT 944649). Marines illuminated area and fired 100 rounds small arms and four 40mm rounds. Area searched. Blood stains noted in area. Two VC WIA (possible).

At 210215H, the Co I squad river block (AT 973612) received two rounds harassing fire from South of SONG LA THO vicinity (AT 975616). Squad directed two rounds 40mm at the VC. Results unknown.

At 210700H, a Co I platoon, Northeast of hill 55, apprehended four VCs vicinity BICH BAC (AT 907634) and one VCs vicinity THAI CANH (3) (AT 974627); delivered to IIT.

At 211140H, a fire team from Co I shot two VC in two boats on SONG LA NGHIA (AT 973611). VC had ignored warning shots and attempted to escape. Results: one VC KIA, one VC WIA (Med-evac), one boat sunk, one boat captured.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 211530H, villagers informed Co M of VC installing mines, vicinity AN TRACH (2) (AT 950657). Two squads searched both sides of SONG YEN RD. Received approximately 25 rounds of small arms fire from three positions South of river vicinity (AT 969640), (AT 966640) and (AT 962653); squads responded with 250 rounds of small arms fire. Negative results.

At 212300H, a Co I platoon patrol (AT 950613) received four rounds of small arms fire from Southeast, vicinity (AT 941611); exact VC location unknown. Established three ambushes in area, no further contact. No US casualties.

At 220020H, a Co I squad ambush (AT 954608) received 12 rounds of small arms fire from (AT 949607), squad fired 250 rounds of small arms and three rounds of 40mm. Search of area revealed no evidence of VC casualties.

At 220355H, 2/9 Battalion CP perimeter positions (AT 991679) directed 15 rounds of small arms fire at undetermined number of VC 50 meters Northwest of CP; effects of fire unknown, no evidence of casualties found on search of area.

At 220700H, a member of Co I squad, returning from ambush site, fell into punji stake man trap, 6'x5'x3' vicinity CHAU SON (1) (AT 942614). Results: one USMC WIA Med evac'd; one man trap destroyed.

At 220800H, a Co I fire team, vicinity CHAU SON (1) (AT 943606), received 25 rounds of small arms fire from VC located 300 meters South (AT 943605). Fire team responded with 200 rounds of small arms fire forcing the VC to cease fire and withdraw. Extent of VC casualties unknown, no US casualties.

At 221230H, a Co L squad patrol, vicinity PHU SON (4) (AT 944633), apprehended one male VCS, whom villagers pointed out as being a VC guerrilla; also, apprehended female VCS (no ID) reported as having medical supplies. Two VCS taken to IIT.

At 221630H, as Co L squad patrol moving Northeast, vicinity PHU SON (1) (AT 950650), observed one VC (AT 953653) jump up and run East. When the VC ignored challenge and warning shots, the patrol fired four rounds S/A at the VC, and saw him fall. Patrol sustained one WIA in pursuit as result CHICOM grenade rigged as a mine (AT 953652). Trail of blood led to VC body in stream (AT 954651). Results: one VC KIA (body count), one USMC WIA Med evac'd.

At 222000H, a Co L squad enroute ambush position, vicinity Hill 22 (AT 955689), received small arms fire from North, vicinity LA CHAU (3) (AT 955670). Squad returned small arms fire, 40mm and directed an 81mm mortar mission of 22 HE and two WP rounds. Search provided no VC casualties, continued mission.

23 Feb 1966. At 230750H, a Co L squad on search and destroy mission, vicinity DUYEN SON (3) GS (AT 9565), destroyed two punji pits booby trapped with grenades (AT 952651) and (AT 954653); no US casualties.

At 230923H, one Marine on Co I search and destroy mission activated a 105mm and rigged as a mine (AT 960655). One USMC KIA Med evac'd.

At 231035H, a Co L squad patrol apprehended three male VCS vicinity (AT 944664). One VCS detained after interrogation at Co CP, evacuated to IIT.

At 231155H, Co I (-) on search and destroy mission, vicinity LE SON (3) (AT 970640), received two rounds of small arms fire from 100 meters west (AT 969640) and 20 rounds of small arms from 250 meters southwest (AT 969646). Return 100 rounds of small arms fire and two rounds of 40mm. Search of area produced no evidence of VC casualties.

24 Feb 1966. At 240015H, the 1st platoon, Co L received one round of small arms fire from (AT 965660); returned 20 rounds of small arms and four rounds of 40mm, searched area with negative VC casualties found.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 240124H, movement heard from (LT 965667) by 1st platoon, Co L; one hand grenade thrown at suspected VC position resulted in one round of small arms fire from VC. Marines threw three more grenades and searched area but found no sign of VC casualties.

At 240940H, a Co I squad patrol, vicinity THAI CUM (2) (LT 942635), apprehended one male VCS departing village at dawn, no ID; evacuated to HPT.

At 241010H, a B&S Co squad patrol apprehended one female VCS hiding on stream bank, vicinity bridge #2 (LT 958698); taken to HON VANG collection point.

At 241130H, a Co M platoon patrol completing search and destroy operation, vicinity LE SON (4) (LT 965647), received eight rounds of small arms fire from a building 200 meters East (LT 966347); patrol returned approximately 200 rounds of small arms and four rounds 40mm, two rounds RF and three rounds of HE 3.5; a 81mm mission of six rounds HE was also directed at the target. VC casualties not evident in search conducted throughout area.

At 242145H, tank with Co I on Hill 55 (LT 967617) sighted one VC to Northwest with spotlight illumination, vicinity ALAN DIEM (LT 963625), VC appeared to be carrying rifle; directed three rounds 90mm at VC, squad searched area, found no trace of VC or weapons.

25 Feb 1966. At 250730H, Co I platoon on S&D vicinity LE SON (2) (LT 977648), disarmed two CHICOM grenade booby traps, one WP grenade booby trap; apprehended one male VCS (LT 978645) and located possible container for claymore type mine (LT 972536); all evac'd Battalion S-2.

At 252000H, Co M bunker (LT 971661) received 30 rounds S/A fire from (LT 971659). Returned 100 rounds S/A fire and five rounds 40mm. Area searched. Negative results.

25 Feb 1966. At 260400H, Co I squad (LT 973661) received grenade in position resulting in 1 W.L. Med evac halo received two rounds S/A fire vicinity (LT 967517). Sixty rounds S/A and 8 rounds 40mm fire directed at VC. Area searched. Negative results.

At 260830H, Co M squad patrol vicinity (LT 963646) pursued two VC into canefield. Discovered spider hole. Smoke and frag grenades used to clear and destroy hole. Two VC KIL (body count).

At 260830H, Co M squad patrol (LT 972657) sustained 3 W.L. as result of detonation M-26 grenade rigged with tripwire. Med evac'd.

At 261945H, a Co L squad (LT 953684) received one round S/A fire from (LT 953605) while enroute to ambush site. Directed 20 rounds S/A, 2 rounds 40mm and assaulted VC position. Area searched. Negative results.

At 261945H, Co M CP perimeter (LT 953663) received 10 rounds S/A fire from (LT 972657). Returned 2 rounds 40mm. VC fire ceased. Area searched. Negative results.

At 262040H, a Co L squad patrol (LT 957605) fired 2 rounds 40mm at VC in treeline (LT 955683). Illuminated and searched village. Negative results.

HLIGHTS. At 260700H, Co K 3/3 and Co F 2/9 commenced airlift from DANANG TAD to PHU BAI for operations under OPCON 2/1. Co K 3/3 deployed with command group 2/1. Co F 2/9 occupied defensive positions PHU BAI TAD.

27 Feb 1966. At 270100H, a Co L squad patrol (LT 953676) enroute to ambush site, sustained 3 W.L. as result detonation M-26 grenade rigged as mine. Med evac'd.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 270700H, a Co I platoon on S&D (AT 988623) observed one VC run from house into canefield (AT 900625). Area searched. Negative results.

26 Feb 1966. At 280800H, a Co I Marine on platoon patrol fell into punji trap vicinity (AT 967653). 155mm round in trap rigged as mine exploded as Marine left area. No casualties.

At 281030H, Co L platoon patrol vicinity (AT 953651) received S/A fire from (AT 950652). Returned S/A fire. Searched area. Negative results. Sustained one KIA (DOW). Med evac'd.

At 281140H, Co L platoon sustained two KIA (AT 955653) result of detonation grenade type mine. Med evacuated.

2. MISSION.

Commencing 0630H on D-Day, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines units search out and destroy enemy personnel, supplies, equipment and fortifications within objective area.

3. EXECUTION.

- a. Concept of Operation. By 0700H of D-Day, Company I provides one platoon (rein) vicinity (LT 940613) to search and destroy to the Northeast along the Eastern bank of the SONG YEN River in coordination with Company L to the west. Company I prepared to provide 81mm mortar and tank supporting fire into objective area. Commencing 0630H of D-Day, Company M provides one platoon (rein) to search and destroy South along the Eastern side of the SONG YEN River and establish blocking position vicinity (LT 957642). Company M prepared to provide screening force vicinity (LT 968645) on order. By 0630H on D-Day, Company L establishes platoon (-) block vicinity (LT 950640). Commencing at 0700H on D-Day, Company L (-) helilifts from Hill 22 to LZ at (LT 933617) in two waves, and searches and destroys through DUNG PHU Complex and to the North along the Western side of the SONG YEN River. (See Operation Overlay).

Company K provides one platoon (rein) to mill 22 on D-1 to provide security for Company L CP and river block, and one platoon (rein) at Battalion CP on D-Day as reserve for operation. H&S provisional platoon augments Company L CP security.

b. Company L.

- (1) By 0700H on D-Day, have one platoon (rein) vicinity (LT 940613) prepared to search and destroy North-east along the SONG YEN River in coordination with, and abreast of Company L (-) on West.
- (2) Be prepared to support Company L (-) with 81mm mortar and tank fire, on call.

c. Company K.

- (1) On D-1, provide one platoon (rein) to augment Company L CP security, and to relieve Company L units guarding river block at (LT 961660).
- (2) Provide one platoon (rein) as Battalion reserve at Battalion CP on D-Day, prepared for helilift to any location within objective area.

- (1) By 0700H on D-Day, establish platoon (-) block vicinity (LT 950640).

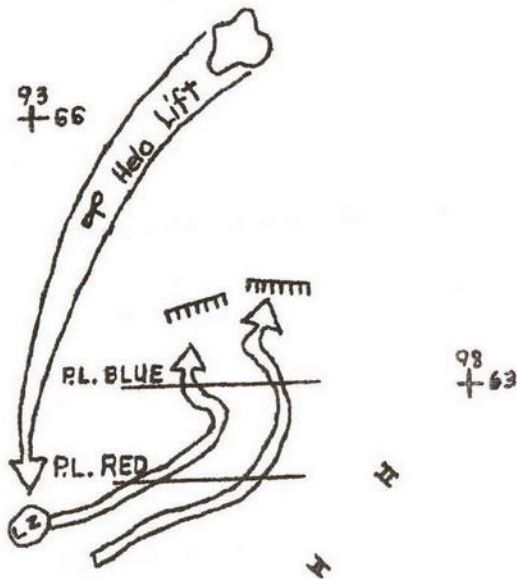
