S-2 CHRONOLOGY

1. Significant Events. There was no single significant event noted during the month of July. The overall incidents of small arms fire and mines increased considerably over the previous month. It should be noted however, that the Battalion was in its present ZOA for only half of the month of June.

2. New Developments. The first and only incident of an electrically detonated explosive device since moving to the new ZOA occurred on 260843H vicinity (AT 958674) when a charge was prematurely detonated in front of a patrol. Sabotage of bridges that started last month, continued this month with bridges on MSR #5 set afire vicinity (AT 943680) and the footbridge across the Song Yen vicinity (AT 959658) was destroyed on the 7th during change of units on the Battalion's left flank.

3. Problem Areas. The main problem areas continue to be the shortage of interpreters and excessive down time on the AN/TPS-21. Both problems have been set forth in detail in previous reports.

a. There is a definite need for additional interpreters over the four that have been assigned to this Battalion. The need is further amplified by the fact that this Battalion is currently operating four CAC platoons and planning a fifth.

b. The AN/TPS-21 should be replaced with a more reliable unit which can better withstand the prolonged periods of high temperature and humidity encountered in Vietnam.

4. Weather. The rainfall has decreased slightly from the previous month while the periods of cloudiness and days with early morning and late evening fog in the mountain valleys have increased. The rainfall for July totaled 2.5 inches as compared to 4.8 inches during June. The maximum high temperature recorded was 99 degrees, with the minimum low being 75 degrees.

5. Intelligence Summary.

a. VC activity during July in the Battalion's ZOA increased considerably over the month of June. There were a total of 79 VC initiated incidents with the majority of the incidents being mining activities and small arms fire.

b. Secondary activities consisted of several grenade throwing incidents, sabotaging of 2 bridges and propaganda incidents of distributing leaflets and 1 incident of broadcasting by loud speaker.

c. The 79 VC initiated incidents included the following:

(1) 36 mining incidents, 19 of which were discovered and destroyed in place

(2) 32 small arms fire incidents

(3) 9 incidents of grenades being thrown. During one of these incidents, 5 grenades were thrown at a patrol followed by a heavy volume of S/A fire. Lack of friendly casualties indicate a prematurely sprung VC ambush.

(4) 2 incidents of bridges being sabotaged.

d. It is considered worthy of note that the majority of the mining incidents have been effected with grenades and homemade devices. Most of the grenades found rigged and those identifiable after detonation have been ChiCom or VC in origin.

e. There were seven incidents of VN civilians either bringing in ammunition or telling Marines where duds or mines were located.

8. Prisoner Report.

a. There were 1 VCC apprehended in July.

b. There were 35 VCS apprehended and sent to Hieu Duc District Headquarters or IIT during the month.

9. Enemy Casualties.

a. There were 3 VC killed (body count) and 5 probable killed (reported carried off by villagers).

b. There were 7 VC wounded (probable).

10. Captured Equipment and Supplies. Captured weapons and equipment included 1 cal. .45 U.S. pistol, 2 M14s w/selectors, 1 K50 w/3 magazines, 1 ChiCom grenade, 2 M26 grenades (these are in addition to those found rigged as AP mines and destroyed), 11 M79 rounds, 2500 to 3000 7.62 rounds. Duds recovered and destroyed included 1 8", 3 105mm, 4 81mm, and 1 60mm.

11. Destroyed Defenses/Positions. There were 4 caves and 9 punji pits destroyed during the month.

1. 020105H - Co E patrol fired on 1 VC vic AT925665. VC fled into village and patrol searched area with negative results.
2. 021005H - CAC patrol rec'd info from villagers that 1 VN woman had a VC son and 2 other VN women were associated with VC vic AT924712. Patrol apprehended the 3 VCS and forwarded them to Hieu Duc Dist Hq for interrogation.
3. 021235H - Co I patrol destroyed a cave vic AT905709. Cave was 6' deep with a 4'9" camouflaged entrance. Area searched with negative results.
4. 021220H - Co K patrol discovered 1 nan size punji trap 4x2x5 ft. on trail vic AT897714. Patrol threw a grenade into trap and a secondary explosion occurred, believed to have been an M-26 grenade. Area searched with negative results.
5. 021405H - Co I patrol discovered and destroyed a mine vic AT908696. Mine was constructed of a C-ration can filled with explosives and had a pressure type fuze. Area was searched with negative results.
6. 021447H - Co I patrol discovered and destroyed a mine which was composed of a 155mm rd rigged with a pressure type device vic AT889673. Area searched with negative results.
7. 021915H - Co I patrol detonated a mine vic AT891685. Mine was believed to have been an M-26 grenade. Area searched with negative results.

1. 031040H -- Co H patrol apprehended a 69 year old VCS vicinity AT957667, while conducting a routine ID card check. VCS was named PHAN KIEN. He was sent to HUEU DUC Dist Hq for interrogation.
2. 031240H -- Co H patrol member detonated a booby trap vicinity AT994687. Device was located in a camouflaged punji trap on a trail. It was believed to be a CHICOM grenade rigged with a unknown firing device. The area was searched with negative results. It appeared that the villagers were forewarned as to the location of the device as they stayed away from this vicinity.
3. 031415H -- CAC patrol, vicinity AT954686, discovered an electrical firing device hidden in a hole. Device consisted of 4 cylinder shaped cells from a BA-279. The area was searched with negative results. Device will be forwarded through the intelligence chain for evaluation.
4. 031550H -- Co E patrol observed a VM man and woman, vicinity AT928675. Patrol challenged and the VM fled. Marines physically pursued and captured the male. The woman was pursued by fire and was believed to be wounded. The area was searched with negative results. Male VC was armed with a .45 caliber pistol and one CHICOM grenade. He had various documents and combat ribbons in his possession. VC was sent to 3d RT.
5. 031725H -- Co I patrol discovered a booby trapped sign, vicinity AT904685, indicating "Beware of Mines." Sign was located 25 feet off the trail and a secondary explosion occurred when the sign was blown. The sign was not in the area yesterday (2 Jun 1966).
6. 032305H -- Co M listening post located AT953665, received one grenade approximately 30 meters from their position. Marines fired small arms at what appeared to be 2 VC. VC fled southeast. Area was illuminated and searched with negative results.

1. 050100H -- Co K LP located vicinity AT944715 received 1 incoming grenade. LP then observed 4 VC approximately 60 meters to their front, and opened fire. VC returned fire with approximately 5 rounds small arms. Area illuminated with 81mm mortar. VC broke contact. Area searched with negative results.
2. 050630H -- Co I patrol apprehended 1 male VCS vicinity AT929684. Suspect (NID) was observing patrol from roadside. Suspect sent to HIBU DUC Dist Hq for interrogation.
3. 050740H -- Co M patrol discovered 2 punji pits, vicinity AT956683, 2'x2'x2' with punji stakes 8 to 10 inches long. Grenades were thrown in each pit, and one secondary explosion occurred. Pits were destroyed.
4. 050840H -- Co K discovered VC ordnance cache in a house vicinity AT939706. Cache contained one spool nylon tripwire, one expended 81mm mortar cannister, two 7.62 rounds, seven .30 caliber M-1 rounds and two 30 caliber carbine rounds. Cache contained no documents or weapons.
5. 050925H -- Co M patrol discovered a mine located AT958679. A cylinder was buried in the ground with approximately 1/8" to 1/4" showing. There were possible markers placed about 40 meters from the mine on the trail. Markers had VN writing on them saying CAM DONG MIN, meaning "Don't move, mines!" Engineers were notified and they reported that it was a shaped charge containing 2 1/2 pounds of explosive with a pressure type firing device. Mine was destroyed in place leaving a hole 3 1/2 x 2 1/2 feet deep.
6. 051325H -- Co I patrol detonated an M-26 grenade booby trap rigged with a trip device vicinity AT906688. Area searched with negative results.
7. 051515H -- Co I patrol observed 3 VN males vicinity AT893705. Marines challenged and VC fled. Patrol opened fire and pursued but contact was lost in a treeline.
8. 051605H -- Co K patrol observed 3 VN males vicinity AT893705. Marines challenged and VCS fled. Patrol opened fire and VCS fell as if wounded. Area searched with negative results. Patrol continued mission.

Interpreter stated that the shouting occurred around the NEW LIFE Hamlet (AT944685). He believes the VC are trying to determine the strength and disposition of friendly units.

2. 062335H - Co E patrol, vicinity Hill #22 (West) (AT921674) observed 2 to 3 VC in abandoned position. VC taken under fire and 81mm mortar mission requested. VC returned fire with 10 rounds SA fire. 81's fired, 4 rounds WP and 4 rounds HE with good coverage. Area searched with negative results.
3. 070350H - Co E, located Hill #41 (AT933663), received 1 incoming grenade from outside wire. Hand illumination thrown and area searched with negative results.
4. 070640H - Co E patrol received 1 grenade thrown over hedgerow, vicinity AT921674. VC forgot to pull pin. Grenade was M-26. Patrol searched with negative results.
5. 071040H - Co E patrol apprehended 1 VCS vicinity AT943679. Suspect had expired ID with no picture. Suspect transferred to DAI LOC Dist Hq for interrogation.
6. 072030H - 2 vehicles returning from 3d Marines CP observed a black figure running across the road, vicinity AT928717. 4 rounds fired at figure. Area searched with negative results.
7. 072030H - Co E, located Hill #22 (AT921674) received 4 to 5 bursts of AW fire from AT915675. Area illuminated and fired six 60mm mortar rounds. Observed movement away from Co E position to the west. Area to be searched at first light. Co E Commanding Officer believes VC were 2 groups of 4 to 6 men each.

1. 072045H - Co F patrol changing ambush position received 1 incoming dud grenade. Patrol returned 1 M-26 grenade at probable enemy position. Area searched with negative results. Patrol continued and heard sounds of movement and moaning. Fired SA at sound and searched area but could not contact enemy. Area searched again at first light and discovered pools of blood and indications of bodies being dragged away. 1 WIA probable.
2. 072230H - CAC 3-3, located vicinity AT944684, observed 2 bridges burning at AT943680 and AT943676. CAO fired at unknown number of VC at bridge (AT943680) and dispatched patrol to investigate. VC fled and area was searched with negative results. Fire was extinguished by patrol. Meanwhile, CAO ambush, located vicinity AT947-677 exchanged SA fire with unknown number of VC at bridge (AT943-676). VC fled and area searched with negative results. Both patrols joined and conducted search of village, vicinity AT942680, with negative results. While returning to CAO OP, patrol found 1 M 26 grenade at AT943680, rigged with trip wire. Mine was disarmed. Bridge at AT943676 was destroyed. Bridge at AT943680 is serviceable. The MSR is open.
3. 080700H - 7th Engineers attached to Co K found 1 M-26 grenade inside a "C" ration can with pin removed, vicinity AT903713. Grenade was blown by Engineers.
4. 080930H - Co H patrol apprehended 1 VN male who ran into house. When patrol started to bring man into OP, a VN woman who claimed to be the suspect's mother explained that the suspect could not hear. Patrol believes suspect can hear, but not very well. Suspect transferred to DAI LAC Dist Hq for interrogation.
5. 081825H - Co E patrol halted 1 VN male. Suspect ran and was taken under fire. Patrol moved into area where VOS was last seen and found 3 VOS. Suspects evacuated to HIEU DUC Dist Hq for interrogation.
6. 081615H - Co E patrol apprehended 1 VOS, vicinity AT926667, with ID card, out of date. Suspect acted very suspicious. VOS forwarded to HIEU DUC Dist Hq for interrogation.
7. 082145H - CAO 3 observed 4 VC heading for bridge, vicinity AT944681. Hand illumination fired and VC taken under fire. VC fled west into house, patrol saturated house with SA fire. 1 VC appeared to be carrying rage the other 3 had weapons. Several minutes later patrol observed 3 lights moving south on MSR. Patrol fired at lights and lights went out. H&E Co's notified. HIEU DUC plans search and clear operation, 090600H in villages parallel to MSR.

1. 090815H - OAC unit reported the villagers of TUN LOAN (1) (AT0470) turned in 3 VN women who were writing anti-American slogans on walls of houses which said "Americans come here to take your land and live on it." The 3 VCO were taken to 2210 2nd Dist Hq.
2. 090830H - Co E patrol opened fire on 2 VC, located AT0467. VC were overrun and 2 VC were KIA (body count). Artillery fire was called in on surrounding area in case other enemy are present in the vicinity. One M31 SMO, 3 magazines and 2 grenades were captured.
3. 091330H - Co E patrol discovered 1 ONICOM grenade, vicinity AT04718. Grenade was rigged with a rock fall type firing device. A rock was attached to a trip wire and the pin of the grenade; the grenade was balanced on a forked stick. Grenade was destroyed in place.
4. 091830H - Reference 3d Marines Intcom #169, Encl (3), para 8, PP's found bloody clothing in vicinity of bridge located AT04960. Local villagers stated that 1 VC was buried last night. 1 VC KIA (Prob).

1. 120818H -- Co M while on a search and clear operation apprehended 6 VN males aged 21 to 40 vic AT909698. They were interrogated in the field and said that 3 local guerrillas, TRAN THONG, NGUYEN TUONG and NGUYEN LAN, were operating in the area and coming to the village to stay every 3 or 4 days and visit their families. Two other guerrillas accompany them but do not carry weapons just grenades and explosives. The 6 VCS were sent to Hieu Duc Dist Hq for further interrogation.
2. 120915H -- A VN child informed a CAC unit that eleven M-79 rds were located vic AT924712. CAC searched the area and discovered the rds in a hole with nail type firing devices. Child was rewarded with 500 Piastres by PF. Rounds were sent to S-2 3/3 for evaluation.
3. 122330H -- Co K recd 3-5 rds S/A fire from east of their position, no casualties. Fire was not returned due to lack of target. Co saw no muzzle flash and was unable to determine distance of sniper fire.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS.1 July 1966.

A Co K patrol observed three VC with weapons at (AT 884733) at 011130H. The VC were taken under fire with a machine gun and 81mm mortars. The patrol was ordered back to its CP before it could conduct a search but a later patrol searched the area with negative results. There was good coverage of the target.

At 010038H the point man of a Co E patrol was WIA when he detonated a mine at (AT 914671). The mine is believed to have been a grenade. It was initiated by an ankle high trip wire stretched across the trail. A search was made of the area but nothing was found.

At 011115H Co K was alerted for possible deployment as part of a provisional battalion. It was ready for deployment from 011215H until stand down was ordered at 011459H.

A Co E patrol executed a S/C operation in the village of DUYEN SON (1) (AT 9366), and GS (AT9364) and (AT 9265) at 010800H. No enemy forces were encountered during the operation. The patrol returned at 011200H to the Co CP.

The villages of BO BAN (1) (AT 9568) and LA CHAU (3) (AT 9567) were searched by a Co M patrol on a S/C mission commencing at 010800H. The mission was accomplished without encountering the enemy. The patrol returned to its CP at 011600H.

A Co M patrol executed a S/C operation in the village of DUYEN SON (3) (AT 9565) at 010815H. The area was searched with negative results and at 011700H the patrol returned to its CP.

A patrol from Co K commenced a S/C operation in THON TRUC DONG (AT 9071) at 011300H. The operation was conducted without incident. The patrol returned to its CP at 011800H.

S/D operations were conducted in the following uncleared hamlets of: DONG BICH (3), AN NHON (2), KUONG MY (2) and GIAO TRI (2) and in GS (AT 8873), (AT 9265) and (AT 9365). Results of above follow.

At 020105H a Co E patrol spotted a man on the trail and took him under fire. The man ran into DUYEN SON (5) (AT 925665). The patrol swept the village but could find no men.

At 021230H a Co I patrol destroyed an 81mm dud at (AT 923679).

At 021235H a Co I patrol discovered a cave 4'x4'x6' at (AT 905709). RCM were thrown into the cave, the cave was then searched but nothing was found and the cave was destroyed.

At 021405H a Co I patrol discovered an explosive device at (AT 908696). The device was partially buried in one of the tracks of a tank trail. It consisted of a C-ration can filled with explosive with a pressure type fuze. The device was destroyed in place.

A Co I patrol found a 155mm dud at 021447H. The dud was in the middle of a trail at (AT 889673). It was anchored to the ground with a wire which led to a friction type fuze in the fuze wall. The dud was destroyed in place.

At 021915H a Marine on a Co I patrol tripped an explosive device believed to be an M-26 grenade at (AT 891685). The Marine was WIA. The device was initiated by a trip wire across the trail and was apparently at or slightly above ground level.

At 021220H a Co K patrol found a 4'x2'x5' punji trap in the trail at (AT 897714). A grenade was thrown into the trap which caused a secondary explosion. The secondary explosion is believed to have been caused by an M-26 grenade. Examination of the trap revealed a trip wire near the bottom of the hole.

At 021005H a patrol from the Combined Action Company picked up three female VCS. Villagers in the area told the patrol that the son of one of the women was a VC and that the other two women were associated with the VC. The women were taken to Hieu Duc for questioning.

The battalion utilized two scout sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team was with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 15 night ambushes, 15 night listening posts and conducting 2 night combat patrols. Ten day combat patrols were also conducted.

At 031725H a Co I patrol found a cardboard sign on a bamboo stake at (AT 904 685). The words CAM CHONG MIN (Beware of mines) were printed on the sign. On the chance the sign might be booby trapped it was destroyed. A secondary explosion occurred. There were no Marine casualties.

A Co K patrol conducted a S/C operation in GS (AT 9073) commencing at 030700H. There was no enemy contact and at 031000H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

The villages of THON TRUC DONG, THON NINH AN and THON THAT LAI (AT 9171) were searched by a Co K patrol commencing at 030800H. The operation was conducted without encountering any enemy forces. The patrol returned to their CP at 031200H.

At 031248H a Marine from Co M stepped in a camouflaged hole on a trail at (AT 955685) and detonated an explosive device. The Marine was WIA and was MEDEVACED. The device is believed to have been a Chi Com grenade. Means of initiation is unknown, but detonation was almost instantaneous. The hole was 8"x12"x12".

A Co M patrol apprehended an elderly male Vietnamese, while conducting a routine ID check at (AT 957667). The man's name PHAN KIEO, appeared on the Black List. The captive was forwarded to Hieu Duc for interrogation.

A patrol from Co M conducted a S/C operation in PHU SON (3) and (2) (AT 9464) commencing at 030600H. The mission was accomplished without incident. The patrol returned to its CP at 031100H.

The village of DUYEN SON (3) (AT 9565) was searched by a Co K patrol on a S/C operation commencing at 031400H. The mission was completed without encountering the enemy. At 031600H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

A Co M patrol commenced a S/C mission in the hamlets of DUONG LAM (2) and (3) (AT 9569) at 030800H. The operation was conducted without incident and at 031700H the patrol returned to its CP.

A Co E patrol apprehended a Vietnamese man armed with a .45 pistol in the area of (AT 928675) at 031550H. When the patrol challenged the man and a woman companion they began to run. The VCS were pursued by fire and maneuver. The man was apprehended but the female VCS escaped and was believed to have been wounded. The captive had a Chi Com grenade in his possession, also various documents. The VC was forwarded to 3d ITT.

A Co E patrol executed a S/D operation in the village of PHUOC NHON (3) (AT 8965) and PHUOC NHON (2) (AT 9066) at 030900H. There was no enemy contact during the operation. The patrol returned to the CP at 031500H.

A patrol from Co E commenced a S/C operation in GS (AT 9365) at 031500H. The operation was conducted without incident. At 031900H the patrol returned to the CP.

ENCLOSURE (3)

A CAC patrol found an electrical firing device hidden in a hole at (AT 954 686) at 031445H. The device was made of four cylindrical shaped cells from a BA-279. The device was forwarded to higher headquarters for examination. The patrol searched the area for other devices with negative results.

The battalion utilized two scout sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team was with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 18 night ambushes, 16 listening posts. Nineteen day combat patrols were also conducted.

4 July 1966.

A mine believed to be an M-26 was detonated by a Marine as a Co I ambush patrol was returning from its ambush site at 040240H. The incident occurred at (AT 915696) causing two (2) USMC WIA's. A Med evac for one Marine was effected and completed without further incident. The Marines were travelling on a paddy dike. The mine was initiated by a trip wire and was at ground level.

A helicopter flying in the vicinity of (AT 878709) and (AT 880709) received two burst of automatic rifle fire and several rounds S/A fire at 040945H. Artillery missions were fired into both areas with good target coverage.

The villages of CAO SUNG (1) (AT 8769) and NINH AN (1) (AT 9070) were searched by a Co I patrol commencing at 040600H. The operation was conducted without encountering any enemy forces. The patrol returned to the CP at 041200H.

Marines in a Co I platoon position (AT 930683) observed a male Vietnamese who was observing their position for approximately an hour from (AT 930682). A fire team was dispatched to apprehend the VCS. When the VCS saw the fire team approaching he ran into a near by village, picked up an ax and started chopping wood. The VCS was apprehended and taken back to the Co CP. When questioned, the VCS stated he was irrigating a rice paddy near the Co I platoon position, but it was noted that no rice paddy or irrigation ditch was located there. The VCS will be delivered to Hieu Duc on 5 July.

The village of HUONG MY (1) (AT 9268) was searched by a Co I patrol on a S/C mission commencing at 040600H. The mission was completed without encountering the enemy. At 041000H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

A Co K patrol conducted a S/C operation in GS (AT 8973) and (AT 8970) commencing at 040700H. There was no enemy contact and at 041100H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

The villages of THOI TRUC DONG and THON NINH AN (AT 9171) were searched by a Co K patrol at 040800H. The operation was conducted without incident and the patrol returned to their CP at 041200H.

A patrol from Co M conducted a S/C operation in DUYEN SON (3) (AT 9565) and LA CHAU (AT 9567) commencing at 040600H. The mission was accomplished without incident. The patrol returned to its CP at 041000H.

A Co M patrol commenced a S/C operation in the hamlet of BO BAN (1) (AT 9568) at 040800H. The patrol returned to its CP at 041500H without enemy encounter.

At 041230H a Co M patrol discovered a spider trap 3'x3'x3' at (AT 964667). The trap was camouflaged with a 12"x12" cover reinforced with bamboo. The trap was destroyed and the area was searched with negative results.

A Co M patrol found the following punji traps: 4'x4'x4' with 2½' punji stakes at (AT 954683), 4'x2'x4' with 2½' punji stakes at (AT 956667) and 4'x2'x4' with 8" punji stakes at (AT 953675). All of the punji stakes were made from bamboo. Each trap was well camouflaged and located on a trail. All punji traps were destroyed.

A Co E patrol executed a S/C operation in the villages of PHUOC NHAM (2) (AT 9066) and PHUOC NINH (6) (AT 9067) at 040600H. There was no enemy contact and the patrol returned to the CP at 041100H.

A patrol from Co E commenced a S/C operation in DUYEN SON (1) (AT 9366) at 041200H. The operation was conducted without incident. At 041700H the patrol returned to the CP.

Marines from Co E, while driving down a road at (AT 922665) at 041500H, observed a man running across a rice paddy carrying a rifle. The VC ran into a nearby house in DUYEN SON (5). The Marines saw the house which he entered and notified the Co E CP. A patrol was immediately dispatched to the scene. A man believed to be the one with the rifle was apprehended and delivered to Hiep Duc for interrogation. A thorough search of the house failed to reveal the rifle.

A Co E patrol moved through the hamlet of DUYEN SON (1) (AT 937660) without incident. At 042045H, when the patrol reached the opposite side of the hamlet they received five grenades and a heavy volume of S/A and A/W fire from an estimated 5-10 VC who were inside the hamlet. At the same time Hill #41 received S/A fire from DUYEN SON (1). The patrol immediately returned fire and began to withdraw to Hill 41. When the patrol had cleared the area Co E illuminated and fired 90mm tank rounds and 81mm (HE and WP) rounds into the village silencing the enemy fire. The village will be searched at first light 5 July. There were no USMC casualties.

The battalion utilized two scout sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team was with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 19 night ambushes, 15 night listening posts. Twenty day combat patrols were also conducted.

5 July 1966.

At 050100H a Co K listening post located at (AT 944715) received an incoming frag grenade causing one USMC WIA (non-ovac). Four VC approximately 60 meters away were observed and immediately fired on. The VC returned 5 rounds of S/A and broke contact. An 81mm illumination mission was fired and a search was conducted with negative results. The grenade is believed to have been an M-26.

ENCLOSURE (3)

A Co K patrol found and confiscated a spool of nylon trip wire, one expended 81mm illumination cannister, two 7.62mm rounds, seven .30 caliber M-1 rounds, and two .30 caliber carbine rounds at (AT 939706) at 050840H. The area was searched for further findings with negative results. The ordnance was taken to the CP.

At 051605H a Co K patrol challenged a Vietnamese man who immediately ran. The patrol fired and the man fell as if wounded. The area was searched but no trace was found of the man.

A male Vietnamese was apprehended at (AT 929684) by a Co I patrol at 050630H. The captive was observing the patrol from the road side. The VCS had no ID Card and was forwarded to Hieu Duc District Headquarters.

At 050905H two male Vietnamese were apprehended at (AT 927704) by a Co I patrol in a routine ID check. One suspect had old scars appearing to have been caused by fragmentation from a grenade. The suspects were delivered to Hieu Duc District Headquarters for interrogation.

At 051325H a Marine in a Co I patrol was WIA when a mine believed to be an M-26 grenade was detonated at (AT 906688). The mine was at ground level next to a trail and was initiated by a trip wire.

At 051515H a Co I patrol challenged three Vietnamese males at (AT 97688). The men fled and the Marines opened fire but the men managed to escape. The Marine fire hit a Vietnamese house wounding three children. The children were Med Evaced. A backlash report has been submitted.

At 050740H a Co M patrol found two 2'x2'x2' punji traps with 8" - 10" stakes at (AT 956683). One pit was on a trail and one just off the trail. Both were camouflaged with bamboo strips and dirt. The traps were destroyed with grenades and a secondary explosion believed to be a Chi Com grenade occurred in the trap off the trail.

At 050925H a Co M patrol observed a cylindrical object protruding 1/8" - 1/4" above the ground in a trail at (AT 958679) resulting in the discovery of a mine. Paper signs were displayed along the trail with Vietnamese writing on them. Engineers were dispatched to destroy the mine. Engineers reported that the mine was a shape charge mine with 2 1/2 pounds of explosive and rigged with a pressure type firing device. The mine was destroyed in place. Signs along trail had the words "O MI DONG MIN" meaning "DON'T MOVE-MINES".

A patrol from Co I commenced a S/C operation in LA CHAU (1) (AT 9468) at 050600H. The operation was conducted without incident. At 051700H the patrol returned to the CP.

A Co I patrol executed a S/D operation in the villages of PHUOC NHAN (2) (AT 9066) and PHUOC MINH (6) (AT 9067) at 051200H. There was no enemy contact during the operation. The patrol returned to the CP at 051800H.

The village of KHUONG MY (4) (AT 9168) was searched by a Co I patrol on a S/C mission commencing at 051200H. The mission was completed without encountering the enemy. At 051800H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

ENCLOSURE (3)

A Co K patrol conducted a S/C operation in GS (AT 8973) commencing at 050700H. There was no enemy contact and at 051200H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

The villages of THON TRUC DOIG and LON NINH AN (AT 9171) were searched by a Co K patrol commencing at 051000H. The operation was conducted without encountering enemy forces. The patrol returned to their CP at 051400H.

The villages of CAO SUNG (1) (AT 8769) and NINH AN (1) (AT 9070) and GIAO TAI (2) (AT 8970) were searched by a Co K patrol commencing at 051400H. The operation was conducted without encountering any enemy forces. The patrol returned to the CP at 051800H.

A patrol from Co M conducted a S/C operation in DUYEN SON (3) (AT 9565) and PHU SON (2) and (3) (AT 9564) commencing at 050730H. The mission was accomplished without incident. The patrol returned to its CP at 051300H.

A Co E patrol commenced a S/C operation in the hamlet of DUYEN SON (1) (AT 9366) at 050500H. The patrol returned to its CP at 051000H without enemy encounter.

The battalion utilized two scout sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team was with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 15 night ambushes and 16 listening posts. Seventeen day combat patrols were also conducted.

6 July 1966.

Command Group Alpha and Companies I and M were chopped to OPCON Ninth Marines at 060922H.

Third Marines assumed OPCON of Co H, 2d Bn, Fourth Marines at 061530H. The company is occupying the Co I CP position at (AT 924690) and platoon positions at (AT 922704) and (AT 930684).

Co K conducted deliberate search and destroy operations in the uncleared areas of GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970), BINH THA (AT 8871) and Grid Square (AT 8872). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co E conducted a search and clear operation in the semi-cleared area of PHUOC NINH (1) (AT 9367). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

At 062040H a Co E patrol received 15-20 rounds S/A fire from (AT 929662). The patrol checked the area with negative results.

At 062100H Co H heard 8 rounds of S/A fire and a great deal of shouting coming from the vicinity of (AT 925678). A patrol checked the area with negative results.

At 062110H a grenade was thrown into an abandoned LP at (AT 955672). A Co E patrol checked the area but found nothing.

At 062225H a Co E ambush at (AT 912674) observed several VC on Hill 22 (AT 920675). The ambush opened fire and received 10 rounds S/A fire in return. An 81mm fire mission was called in with good coverage of the target. A search of the area was made with negative results.

At 062253H the CP of Co H, 2d Bn, 4th Marines at (AT 925691) received 20 rounds S/A fire from approximately 300 meters NW. The area was searched with negative results.

The battalion utilized one scout-sniper team. The team was located with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 10 night ambushes and 13 night listening posts. Five day combat patrols were also conducted.

7 July 1966.

At 071040H a patrol from Co E, found a man sitting in the bushes on the side of the road at (AT 943679). The man had an expired temporary ID Card. He was sent to Hieu Duc district headquarters for questioning.

At 070350H the Co E position on Hill 41 received an incoming grenade from outside the wire. The area was illuminated and searched with negative results.

At 070725H a Co E patrol received an incoming grenade at (AT 921674). The grenade failed to explode. The pin had not been pulled. The area was searched with negative results.

At 072030H the Co E position on little Hill 22 (AT 921674) received light S/A fire from (AT 915675). Mortar fire and illumination was called in. Movement was observed going out of the target area.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in BINH THAI (AT 8871), AP PHUOC THOI, THON THAI LAI, and THON NINH AN (AT 9271) and THON TRUC DONG. There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co E conducted search and clear operations in PHUOC NINH (2) and DUYEN SON (5) (AT 9266), PHUOC NINH (1) (AT 9271) and THON TRUC DONG. There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co H, 2d Bn, 4th Marines conducted search and clear operations in KHUONG MY (1) (AT 9269), AN NHON (2) (AT 9069) and Grid Square (AT 9270). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

The battalion utilized one scout sniper team. The team was located with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing ten night ambushes and ten listening posts.

ENCLOSURE (7)

At 072045H a patrol from Co H, 2d Bn, 4th Marines heard an object land near them at (AT 915685). The object is believed to have been a dud grenade although it could not be found. An M-26 grenade was thrown into the probable enemy position but a search revealed nothing. As the patrol continued on its way moaning sounds and movements were heard and S/A fire was directed at the sounds. Another search was made but nothing could be found. A search of the area at first light revealed pools of blood and evidence of something being dragged away. The results of the contact were 1 VC WIA (confirmed).

At 072230H personnel in a CAC position at (AT 944684) observed a bridge burning in the vicinity of (AT 943680). Figures could be seen in the light of the fire and the CAC opened fire. The VC returned the fire and then withdrew toward a hamlet located in the vicinity of (AT 942680). At the same time a CAC ambush at (AT 947677) saw a second bridge burning about 400 meters south of the first bridge. Figures could be seen at the bridge and the CAC ambush fired on them and received fire in return. This group of VC retreated to the same area as the first group. A patrol sent out from the CAC position reached the first bridge in time to remove the burning rags which had been used to start the fire and this saved the bridge. The other bridge burned completely. The two groups of CAC personnel then joined forces and swept the hamlet to which the VC had retreated but found nothing. As the CAC returned to their position they found a trip wire across the road connected to an M-26 grenade. The grenade was disarmed. A bypass was constructed around the burned bridge commencing at first light. MSR remains trafficable.

8 July 1966.

Command Group Alpha and Companies I and M remained under 9th Marines OPCON.

At 081825H a Co E patrol halted a Vietnamese man at (AT 927676). The man ran and was taken under fire but disappeared in some trees. The patrol searched the area and found 3 VCS near the spot where the man disappeared. The VCS were sent to Hieu Duc District Headquarters for questioning.

At 080900H an Engineer sweep team found an M-26 grenade in a C-ration can at (AT 903713). The pin had been pulled. The grenade was blown in place.

A Vietnamese woman was struck by shrapnel at 081545H during an 81mm mortar registration by Co E at (AT 954667). The woman was Med Evaced. A backlash report has been submitted.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in AP PHUOC THAI, THON THAI LAI and THON NINH AN (AT 9271), THON ARUC DUNG (AT 9071) and Grid Square (AT 8971). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co E conducted search and clear operations in PHUOC NINH (3) (AT 9267), PHUOC CHAU (2) (AT 9467) and PHUOC NINH (1) (AT 9367). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

ENCLOSURE (3)

Co H (274) conducted search and clear operations in KHUONG MY (1) (T 9268), KHUONG (4) (AT 9168) and KHUONH MY (2) (AT 9069). There was one contact. At 080930H a patrol saw a man run into a house at (AT 908686) as they approached. The man was apprehended and delivered to the Hieu Duc District Headquarters for questioning.

At 082145H a CAC unit observed four men approaching the bridge at (AT 944681). A hand held flare was fired and the VC were taken under fire. The VC fled west and entered a house. The CAC took the house under fire. Several minutes later the CAC observed three lights heading south on the MSR and fired on them. The lights went out. The CAC checked the bridge and found it undamaged. One of the VC appeared to be carrying rags and the others carried weapons.

The battalion utilized one scout sniper team. The team was with Co M.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 11 night ambushes and 10 listening posts.

9 July 1966.

At 090830H a Co E patrol spotted a man in a hedgerow at (AT 904674). As the Marines advanced on the man they were taken under fire and suffered 1 WIA. The Marines enveloped the VC position killing 2 VC (confirmed). A K-50 sub-machine gun with three magazines and a Chi Com grenade were captured. Artillery was called in on the surrounding area in case other VC were in the area. A search of the area was made with negative results.

Co E conducted a search and destroy operation in the hamlet of PHUOC NINH (6)(AT 9067). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co E conducted search and clear operations in PHUOC NINH (2) and DUYEN SON (5)(AT 9266) and PHUOC NINH (1)(AT 9367). There were no contacts made.

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in BINH THAI (AT 8871) and GIAO TRI (2)(AT 8970). There was one incident as follows:

a. At 091330H a Co K patrol discovered a mine at (AT 886718). A rock in the middle of the trail was attached by a wire to second rock wedged in the bushes about 1½' off the ground. The second rock was joined by a wire to the pin of a Chi Com grenade which was also in the bushes about 1½' off the ground. The grenade was destroyed.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in the hamlets of AP PHUOC THAI, THON THAI LAI and THON NINH AN (AT 9271). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co H (2/4) conducted search and destroy operations in the hamlets of GIAO TRI (1) and (3)(AT 8870) and DONG BICH (2)(AT 9068). There were no contacts.

Co H (2/4) conducted a search and clear operation in the hamlet of PHUOC NINH (4)(AT 9368). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 090815H the villagers of TUY LOAN (1)(AT 9470), turned three women over to a CAC patrol. The women had been writing slogans on the walls of houses. The slogans, which were in Vietnamese, said "Americans came here to take your land and live on it". The women were turned in to Hieu Duc district headquarters.

Psychological Warfare Operations were conducted from 091300H to 091630H along the MSR from (AT 945698) to (AT 943663). A Psychological Warfare Team from the 241st Psychological Operations Company of the U. S. Army contacted about 2000 people through an interpreter. The following subjects were covered: "Help USMC Help You", "Report VC activities", "CHIEU HOI", and VC are endangering you by firing at Marines from your villages". In addition 2500 leaflets showing rewards for mines and booby traps were distributed as were candy and other psychological warfare leaflets (safe conduct passes and the evils of the VC). CAC personnel provided security and assisted the team in the selection of target areas.

The battalion utilized one scout-sniper team. The team was with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 9 squad size night ambushes and 10 listening posts. There were 16 day patrols.

10 July 1966.

Co I remains under OPCON Ninth Marines. Co M returned to OPCON Third Marines at 101500H and Command Group Alpha at 111650H.

Co H (2/4) was chopped to the First Battalion at 101800H.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in the hamlets of THON TRUC DONG (AT 9171) NINH AN (3)(AT 9274) and AP DAI LA (AT 9274). At 104000H as Co K was completing a search and clear operation in the hamlet of AP DAI LA the Marines received one sniper round from a VC in black clothing located at (AT 928741). The Marines returned fire and searched the area with negative results.

Co K conducted a search and destroy operation in the hamlet of GILLO TRI (2) (AT 8970). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co E conducted search and clear operations in the hamlets of DUYEN SONG (3) (AT 9565), PHUOC NINH (1)(AT 9367) and Grid Square (AT 9166). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co H (2/4) conducted search and clear operations in TUY LOAN (2)(AT 9269) and search and destroy operations in DONG BICH (2)(AT 9068) and Grid Square (AT 9166). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

A Psychological Warfare operation was conducted from 101300H to 101430H in Grid Squares (AT 8770, 8870, 8970, 8771 and 8871). Artillery fired a two battery TOT on the HOI VUC Valley immediately followed by a Psy War helicopter which played tapes and dropped 28,000 safe conduct passes and 300,000 mixed CHIEU HOI leaflets. During the operation 4-6 rounds of S/A were directed at the helicopter from the vicinity of (AT 8870). After the helicopter left an artillery mission was fired on the suspected area with good target coverage.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 101542H Co K observed 4 VC at (AT 868702) and called artillery and 81mm mortar fire on them. There was good coverage of the target. One VC was WIA (probable).

At 102220H the CAC position at (AT 922724) received heavy automatic weapons fire from (AT 928717) and (AT 920719). The fire was returned by CAC personnel and a CAC ambush was called in to strengthen the position. At the same time a Co K platoon position at (AT 916714) also received fire from (AT 906712). The fire was returned and three figures were observed running west. Co K illuminated for both units but nothing more was observed.

The battalion used no scout-sniper with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 22 night ambushes.

11 July 1966.

Co I remained under OPCON of Ninth Marines.

Co E conducted search and clear operations in BO BAN (1) (AT 9568) and LA CHAU (2) (AT 9467). At 110915H a Co E Marine stepped in a punji trap at (AT 956686) and detonated an explosive device believed to be a Chi Con grenade. The Marine was wounded but did not require Med Evac. The explosive device was located just below the surface of the ground on the wall of the trap and was initiated by a trip wire across the top of the trap. A search of the area was made with negative results. At 111615H a Co E patrol checked a man's ID Card at (AT 948676). An interpreter with the patrol questioned the man who admitted being a VC in 1965 but claimed he was not any longer. The man was delivered to Hieu Duc for questioning.

Co E conducted a search and destroy operation in Grid Square (AT 9166). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in AP PHUOC THAI, THON THAI LA and THON NINH AN (AT 9271) and Grid Square (AT 9073). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co K conducted a search and destroy operation in the hamlet of GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the hamlets of AN NHON (2) and KHUONG MY (2) (AT 9069), TUY LOAN (AT 9370) and KHUONG MY (1) (AT 9268). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

At 111100H a CAC patrol picked up two men at (AT 936702). A PF Sgt. with the patrol was suspicious of them. The men were turned over to Hieu Duc district headquarters for questioning and later released.

The battalion used one scout-sniper team with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 14 night ambushes and 9 listening posts.

12 July 1966.

Co I was chopped from OPCON Ninth Marines to Third Marines at 121400H.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in the hamlets of NINH AN (3) (AT 9170), AP PHUOC THUAN (AT 9273) and AP HOA KHUONG (AT 9371). There were no reportable incidents.

Co E conducted search and clear operations in LA CHAU (2) (AT 9467), DUYEN SON (3) (AT 9565) and grid square (AT 9365). There were no contacts or reportable incidents.

Co M conducted a Co (-) search and clear operation in AN NHON (2) (AT 9069) based on information from PF that a VC squad was located in the area. At 120735H five men were taken into custody for interrogation at (AT 909698). At 120818H in the same vicinity six more men were questioned. They said that several guerrillas came into the town every 3 or 4 days to stay with their families. The six men were sent to Hieu Duc for interrogation.

At 120915H a Vietnamese child led a PF from CAC 32 to a hole at (AT 942712) where 11 M-79 rounds with nail firing devices were buried. The child was rewarded with 500 Piastres.

The battalion used one scout-sniper team with Co K.

The battalion continued its emphasis on night activity by establishing 10 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

13 July 1966.

Co I conducted a search and clear operation in the hamlet of KHUONG MY (4) (AT 9168) and search and destroy operations in the hamlets of CAO SUNG (1) (AT 8769) and NINH AN (1) (AT 9070). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co K conducted a search and clear operation in grid square (AT 8973) and search and destroy operations in the hamlets of GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970) and NINH AN (2) (AT 9070). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the hamlets of LA CHAU (1) (AT 9468), PHU SON (4) (AT 9463) and LA CHAU (5) (AT 9666). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

At 130800H a Vietnamese boy came to a Co K position with 48 .30 caliber carbine rounds and 5 7.62mm rounds. The boy stated that he had found the ammunition in AN TAN (AT 918707). The boy was given a 100 Piastre reward.

At 131410H the Third Bn, 1st Marines reported that one of their units had received S/A fire from (AT 964666). A Co M patrol searched the area with negative results.

At 131730H a Co K position at (AT 89727) received 15-20 rounds of S/A fire from 3 VC located at (AT 964666). A 60mm mortar mission was fired on the location and the firing stopped.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 131230H a SPAR was received and in response a CAC unit from the Third Battalion and a reinforced squad from the First Battalion were dispatched to the area in question and were in position by 131320H. A sweep of the area resulted in the apprehension of 3 VCS who were released after being identified by the Village Chief.

At 132115H a Co I position at (AT 921690) received 7 rounds of S/A fire from distance of about 10-20 meters. The area was illuminated and 4 VC were fired on but they escaped in the brush. A patrol searched the area but could not regain contact and found nothing.

At 132200H the CAC position at (AT 944684) received about 10 rounds of S/A fire from (AT 942683). The area was illuminated and 6 VC were observed running in a westerly direction. The CAC opened fire. Two VC fell as if they had been hit. A patrol searched the area found nothing. Two VC WIA (probable).

At 132200H the CAC reported a bridge burning at (AT 943668). A Co M patrol investigated but found the bridge undamaged. The cause and location of the fire could not be determined.

At 132345H a Co M patrol at (AT 921674) received 12 rounds of S/A fire from the northwest. The location of the VC could not be determined.

The battalion employed two scout-sniper teams, one with Co I and one with Co K.

The battalion established 9 night ambushes and 9 listening posts.

14 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and clear operations in KHUONG MY (2)(AT 9169) and KHUONG MY (4)(AT 9168). A search and destroy operation was conducted in AN TAN (AT 9170). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in Ap Phuoc Thai, Thon Thai Lai and THON NINH AN (AT 9271) and grid square (AT 8973). A search and destroy operation was conducted in GIAO TRI (2)(AT 8970). There were no contacts.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in DUYEN SON (4)(AT 9466), LA CHAU (5)(AT 9666) and LA CHAU (2)(AT 9467). There were no significant incidents.

At 140856H a Co M patrol discovered a mine in a paddy dike at (AT 928675). The mine was cylindrical in shape, 4" in diameter and 6" tall, and made of metal. It had been buried with the top flush with the ground and had a pressure type fuze. The mine was destroyed in place. Engineers thought the mine was of Chi Com origin.

At 140920H Popular Forces from the CAC apprehended a man at (AT 922724). The man was passing out VC literature. He was taken to Hieu Duc for interrogation.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 140952H a Co M patrol found a 3.5" rocket at (AT 952651). The round was lashed to a bamboo pole 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' above the ground, and was not booby trapped or camouflaged. Engineers arrived at 141310H to destroy the mine and received 5 rounds of carbine fire from a tree line at (AT 951649). The patrol immediately advanced and swept the area but could find nothing. The round was destroyed.

At 141020H helicopters received small arms fire from (AT 893707). An artillery mission was fired with good target coverage.

At 141300H a Co I patrol observed a man hiding in heavy brush at (AT 909706). The patrol opened fire and then searched the area with negative results.

At 141525H Co I personnel riding in a Mighty Mite at (AT 949719) received 5 rounds of S/A fire from (AT 948717). An H&S Co patrol was sent to the area and conducted a search with negative results.

At 141630H Co I personnel at (AT 938705) apprehended a man without an ID Card. The man was sent to Hieu Duc district headquarters for interrogation.

At 142054H a Co M OP at (AT 953668) received one fragmentation grenade and returned 6 rounds of S/A fire. The area was illuminated by 81mm mortars and a tank searchlight. Movement could be seen in the hamlet of LA CHAU (4) but nothing significant was observed.

In a follow up action on the SPAR of 13 July a CAC platoon returned to the search area at 141000H and maintained observation on a suspected house in the area. Shortly after 141500H an ARVN Captain and 12 MSS personnel from I Corps arrived on the scene and conducted a detailed search of the house and the area surrounding it, with negative results.

The battalion used two scout-sniper teams, one with Co I and one with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 11 squad size night ambushes and 12 listening posts.

14 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared hamlets of THU LOAN (1)(AT 9370), KHUONG MY (2) and AN NHON (2)(AT 9069) and KHUONG MY (1)(AT 9168). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared hamlets of THON TRUC DONG and THON NINH AN (AT 9271). Search and destroy operations were conducted in the uncleared hamlets of GIAO TRI (2)(AT 8970) and BINH THA (AT 8871). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared hamlets of LA CHAU (5)(AT 9666), PHUOC NINH (1)(AT 9367) and PHUOC NINH (2) and DUYEN SON (5)(AT 9266). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 150435H a Co M ambush at (AT 918678) had 4 rocks thrown into its position. One person then fled to the northwest. Two M-79 rounds were fired and the area was searched with negative results.

At 150745H a Marine in a Co K patrol detonated a mine of unknown type at (AT 902712). The Marine was KIA and Medevaced. The mine apparently had a pressure type fuze and was buried in the trail. The size of the crater indicated a charge of about 1/2 pound of TNT. Rusty metal fragments in the area indicate that the charge may have been wrapped with pieces of metal.

Based on a patrol leader's report of possible VC harbor site at (AT 907701) an artillery mission was fired 151330H. Four secondary explosions were observed. A patrol searched the area but found nothing.

At 151715H the Commanding Officer of Co M was approaching the Co CP in a Mighty Mite and observed a Vietnamese man walking toward the CP. When the man saw the vehicle he changed his direction. The man was stopped and searched. He was carrying two M-26 grenades and had no ID Card. He admitted being a VC. The VCC will be forwarded to ITT in the morning.

The battalion employed two scout-sniper teams, one with Co I and one with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize after dark activity by establishing 13 night ambushes and 10 listening posts.

16 July 1966.

Co I conducted a search and clear operation in the hamlet of GIANG MY (4) (AT 9168). Search and destroy operations were conducted in the hamlets of DONG BICH (1)(AT 8968) and PHUOC NINH (7)(AT 8967). There were no contacts.

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the hamlets of NINH THA (AT 8871), GIAO TRI (2)(AT 8970) and NINH AN (2)(AT 9071). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the hamlets of DUYEN SON (1) (AT 9366), DUYEN SON (3)(AT 9565) and DUYEN SON (2)(AT 9566). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

At 160010H a Battery A listening post at (AT 938722) heard movement to its front. Illumination was fired and 8-9 persons were observed. Two fragmentation grenades were thrown at the VC who fled toward the west. A patrol was dispatched from H&S Company to attempt to intercept the VC but they were unable to make contact.

At 161000H two children tripped a wire on a trail at (AT 896680) detonating a mine, which killed one child and wounded the other. The wounded child was brought to Co I and Medevaced. A patrol went to the scene and found the trail marked with signs in Vietnamese which said "Do Not Enter".

At 161400H a CAC patrol found and destroyed a punji trap at (AT 944673). The pit was 1'x1'x1/2' in size.

ENCLOSURE (3)

County Fair 3-10 was concluded at 161830H. No contact with VC or VCS was made. Medical treatment was given to 193 persons. 308 adults were screened and all had valid ID Cards. Two caves approximately 2'x3'x8' were destroyed. The villagers seemed pleased by the opportunity to speak with the District officials and by the visits of the Regimental and Battalion Commanders.

At 162040H a Marine in a Co I patrol detonated a mine at (AT 921691). Five Marines were wounded, two of whom were Medevaced. The patrol had just left the company position. A pop was heard and the device went off approximately 2' in the air. The area will be checked at first light.

At 162130H Co M called an artillery illumination mission at (AT 918678) to check movement in the area. Nothing was observed.

The battalion used two scout-sniper teams, one with Co I and one with Co K.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 12 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

17 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and clear operations in the villages of KHONG MY (2) (AT 9169), TUY LOAN (1) (AT 9370) and DONG BICH (1) (AT 8968). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in the villages of GLO TRI (2) (AT 8970), (AT 9073) and THON TROC DONG (AT 9171). There were no contacts.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the villages of PHUOC NINH (3) (AT 9267), PHU SON (1) (AT 9465) and DUYEN SON (3) (AT 9565). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

At 170115H Co I OP at (AT 923694) observed approx 10 VC. Fired 3 rounds of 81mm mortar and searched area, with negative results.

At 170209H Co I, 1st Plt position (AT 927685) received 1 round S/A fire, fire was not returned, no casualties.

At 170200H Co I LP at (AT 922691) observed 3 VC moving on line in easterly direction. Illuminated area and fired 2 rounds of 3.5 WP, sweep area with negative results.

At 171115H Co I vehicle proceeding west on road at (AT 937687) received 10 rounds of S/A fire. No casualties, area checked with negative results.

At 171200H Co M patrol apprehended 4 women VCS without ID cards at (AT 916574), taken to Hieu Duc Headquarters.

At 171430H Co I patrol found two M-26 grenades, about 20 feet apart, one lying on ground in open, one was in bottom of 3'x3' hole. Neither booby trapped and blown in place.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 171115H CAO 33 patrol received 10 rounds of S/A fire at (AT 949679). One SF WIA. Search could not establish contact.

At 171525H Co I patrol received one grenade from rear at (AT 909693), one USMC WIA, Medevaced. Area searched, contact could not be established.

At 171730H Co I patrol sighted one elephant to their West at (AT 885688). Arty mission called, with neg results as contact lost.

At 171730H 3 members of "W" Battery returning from Hill #41 received 2 rounds of small arms fire over their head at (AT 938640). Returned 18 rounds of S/A fire.

At 172145H Co K LP observed one man approach position at (AT 901717). Threw 2 grenades at VC and small arms fire, patrol checked area with negative results.

The battalion used two scout-sniper teams, one with Co I and one with Co K.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 16 squad size night ambushes and 13 listening posts.

18 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operations in the villages of DONG BICH (2) (AT 9068), KHUONG MY (4) (AT 9168) and PHUOC NINH (6) (AT 9067). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the villages of GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970), and NINH AN (1) and (2) (AT 9070). Search and clear operations were conducted in the villages of AP PHUOC THAI, THON THAI LOI and THON NINH AN, (AT 9271). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the villages of PHUOC NINH (3) DUYEN SON (5) (AT 9266), NUI GOC KHA, DUYEN SON (1) (AT 9366) and LA CHAU (2) (AT 9467). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

At 181435H Co C 3d Recon Bn patrol observed at (AT 888688) 11 Vn moving in column up and back down ridge line. All were carrying something but could not determine exactly what. No action taken by recon patrol.

The battalion used two scout-sniper teams, one with Co I and one with Co K.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 17 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

19 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operations in the villages of CAO SUNG (1) (AT 8769), AN NHON (2) (AT 9669), and KHUONG MY (2) (AT 9069). Search and clear operations were conducted in PHUOC NINH (4) (AT 9368).

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 190650H Co I patrol received 3 rounds of sniper fire from East (AT 913705). Contact could not be established with VC and patrol continued, no casualties.

At 191315H Co I patrol discovered one 81mm mortar round buried nose up on the trail at (AT 922698). Destroyed in place.

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the villages GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970) and NINH AN (1) and (2) (AT 9070). Search and clear operations were conducted in THON TRUC DONG and THON NINH AN (AT 9171). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the villages of PHUOC NINH (2) and DUYEN SON (5) (AT 9266). PHU SON (2) and (3) (AT 9564) and DUYEN SON (3) (AT 9565). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co I in conjunction with HIEU DUC District Forces conducted search and destroy operations in the uncleared areas of grid squares (AT 9169), (AT 9069), (AT 9168), (AT 9068), (AT 9167) and (AT 9067). There were no contacts.

The battalion used two scout-sniper teams, one with Co I and one with Co K.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 16 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

The following significant fires were fired in 3/3 sector;

- a. TOT at (AT 886678), VC Patrol route at 192000.
- b. TOT at (AT 898678) and (AT 897677), VC Patrol route at 192045.
- c. Zone fire (AT 894685) and (AT 898685), VC Mine field at 192115.

20 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operations in villages of AN NHON (1) (AT 8969), and DONG BICH (1) (AT 8968). Search and clear operations were conducted in TUY LOAN (1) (AT 9370).

At 201300H Co I patrol observed one VCS to front, challenged and man began to run. Patrol pursued VCS and received 4 S/A rounds from (AT 906676) and searched area with negative results.

At 201320H 2d plt Co I located (1) 105mm round in vicinity of perimeter wire. Round had not been fired and located two feet from round was a wrist watch, (calendar type) stopped on 27 June. Neither were booby trapped and were blown.

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the villages of GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970) and grid square (AT 8773). Search and clear operations were conducted in AP PHUOC THAI (AT 9271).

At 200720H Co K patrol found (1) 105mm round (AT 903712) buried in ground, no evidence of being booby trapped. Blown in place.

ENCLOSURE (X)

At 200915H Co K patrol approaching tree line (AT 895704) observed a man-made barrier in tree line. Fired one M-79 round and had secondary explosion from Chi Com grenade.

At 201005H Co K patrol tripped what is believed to be a directional type mine at (AT 895709) sustaining 4 WIA, (2 U. S., 1 ARVN, 1 civilian). Mine was approx 7 feet above ground and initiated by rock fall type device.

At 201245H Co K plt on Hill #92 received approx 25 rds S/A fire from (AT 879718), returned 150 rds S/A fire, and 54 rounds of arty. Patrol immediately searched area with negative results.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the villages of DUYEN SON (1) (AT 9366), DUYEN SON (3) (AT 9565), and DUYEN SON (4) (AT 9466). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

At 201355H Co M on Hill #22 received 7-10 rounds of S/A fire from (AT 955678). Squad sent to area and patrol received 15-20 rounds S/A fire from (AT 954673), returned fire with S/A fire and M-79. Searched area with negative results.

The battalion used three scout-sniper teams, one each with Co I, K and M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 14 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

21 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operations in the uncleared areas of NINH AN (1) and (2) (AT 9070) and BINH THU (AT 8871).

At 211200H Co I patrol found torn and bloody utilities at (AT 905704). On 15 July an arty mission was fired on this area and secondary explosions were observed. Patrol estimated one VC KIA (prob) from artillery fire.

Co I conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of PHUOC NINH (4) (AT 9368), and KHUONG MY (4) (AT 9168). There were no contacts.

Co K conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of AP PHUOC THOI and THON THAI LOI (AT 9271). There were no contacts.

At 211600H Co K patrol being covered by sniper team had VC male run out ahead of patrol at (AT 897718). Sniper team fired 3 rounds at a distance of approximately 400 meters with VC being killed. Body was searched and contained no ID Card but 800 cigarettes.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of DO BAN (1) (AT 9568), PHUOC NINH (2) and DUYEN SON (5) (AT 9266) and DUYEN SON (4) (AT 9466).

At 210510H Co M patrol returning to CP observed a light in a house at (AT 954654). Patrol investigated and found 2 men, one woman and a child. Both men attempted to escape and were physically restrained by the patrol members. During the scuffle one man dove out of the window, was fired upon by the security element posted outside but escaped in the darkness; probably a WIA. Patrol pursued but lost man in the undergrowth. The captured VC had in his possession 1 M-26 grenade, 1 Chi Com grenade, medical supplies and documents. Upon interrogation VC stated his name was CAO KHOA age 19 from DHU SON and that he was a VC assistant corporman. Said that the escaped man was named THINH and also a VC corporman. All captives sent to Hieu Duc for shipment to ITT, the patrol returned to Co M CP.

The battalion used three scout-sniper teams, one each with Co I, K and M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 14 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

22 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operations in the uncleared areas of grid squares (AT 9070) and (AT 9869). Search and clear operations in the semi-cleared area of DUONG LAM (1)(AT 9469) was also conducted. There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the uncleared area of (AT 0970). Search and clear operations were conducted in the semi-cleared areas of THON THAI LOI (AT 9271) and grid square (AT 9073). There were no contacts.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of PHUOC NINH (1)(AT 9367), DUYEN SON (2) and (3)(AT 9566) and (AT 9565). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

At 221800H Vn male child tripped a pull type firing device on unknown type grenade at (AT 945672) while walking in a field. Child sent to BAS for treatment; area checked with negative results.

The battalion used three scout-sniper teams, with Companies L, K, and M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 15 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

23 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operations in the areas of NINH AN (1) (AT 9070), KHUONG MY (2)(AT 9169), DONG BICH (2)(AT 9068), KHUONG MY (4)(AT 9069) and general vicinity grid squares (AT 9170) and (AT 9069). Search and clear operations in the semi-cleared area of KHUONG MY (2) in vicinity grid square (AT 9268) were also conducted.

At 231000H Co I squad patrol at (AT 909686) found 2 3'x3 1/2' propaganda signs nailed to trees. The area was searched for possible booby traps with negative results. The signs were removed and sent to S-2.

ENCLOSURE (3)

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the areas of NINH AN (2) (AT 9071), GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970) and general vicinity grid squares (AT 9070), (AT 8870) and (AT 8971). Search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of THON NINH AN, THON TRI LOI, THON TRUC DONG, in general vicinity of grid squares (AT 9171), (AT 9271), (AT 9172), (AT 8972) and (AT 8973) were also conducted.

At 231650H Co K squad patrol found at (AT 921711) one 81mm mortar round HE. Believed to be rigged for pressure release anti-personnel mine. Mine was blown in place, area searched with no other findings.

Co M conducted search and destroy operations in the areas of DUYEN SON (3), DUYEN SON (2) in the general vicinity of grid squares (AT 9566), (AT 9565) and (AT 9666). Search and clear operations were conducted in PHUOC NINH (3) and PHUOC NINH (2) in general vicinity grid squares (AT 9267) and (AT 9266). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

At 230235H a 7th Engineer M-51 dump truck at (AT 927743) had one grenade thrown into the cab of the truck as it was driving along route 5. The driver jumped out before the grenade exploded, no further contact.

The battalion utilized three scout-sniper teams, one each with Co I, K and

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 14 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

24 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operations in the areas of NINH AN (1), KHUONG MY (2), DONG BICH (2) and KHUONG MY (3) in the general vicinity of grid squares (AT 9070), (AT 9069), (AT 9068), (AT 9168), (AT 9169) and (AT 9171). Search and clear operations were conducted in KHUONG MY (1), PHUOC NINH (4), TUY LOAN (1) and (2) in vicinity of grid squares (AT 9268, 9368, 9269, 9369, and 9370). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the areas of NINH AN (2) and GIAO TRI (2) in general vicinity grid squares (AT 8971, 9070, 9071, 8970 and 8870). Search and clear operations were conducted in THON NINH AN, THON TRI LOI, and THON TRUC DONG in the general vicinity grid squares (AT 9171, 9271, 8972 and 8973). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co M conducted search and clear operations in the areas of PHUOC NINH (1) (AT 9366), DUYEN SON (3) and PHU SON (2) in general vicinity grid squares (AT 9566 and 9565).

At 240920H Co M squad patrol discovered one punji trap 1'x2'x18" at (AT 955551) containing one Chi-Com grenade with a pull string device inside the trap. Two VC males were observed watching the patrol in a suspicious manner. Two VCS were apprehended and one VCS directed to disarm the grenade by the patrol. The grenade was disarmed by the VCS and he immediately throw it into the bushes. A search was made immediately by the patrol and the VCS, where upon the patrol found the VCS standing on the grenade trying to hide it. Both VCS were then directed to accompany patrol to Co M CP.

ENCLOSURE (4)

At 241000H Co M Sgd patrol returning to CP with 2 VCS had one VCS trip a wire across the trail detonating 1 M-26 frag grenade. 1 Marine WIA and 1 VCS WIA, requiring Medevac. The area was immediately searched (AT 954664) and a second M-26 grenade was found rigged with a wire to act as a chain explosion along with the first, but only one had detonated. The second grenade was disarmed by the patrol.

At 241014H 3d Recon Bn, Co C patrol ambushed 7 VC (AT 833665) that were armed. Ambush resulted in 1 VC KIA (Conf) and 3 WIA (Prob) in addition to capturing 2 grenades and one cartridge belt.

At 241428H a fire mission was fired on a reinforced concrete bunker with 8", at (AT 886686). The target was destroyed.

At 242140H Co I CP picked up movement on AN/TPS 21 at (AT 922696). Area illuminated with 81mm and 3 VC observed. Fired 81mm HE at the VC and dispatched a patrol to check out the area. Patrol had negative results in the search.

At 242130H a PF from CAC 31 walked into the Vn Hospital at (AT 945700) and recognized a male patient as a known VC. The VC had turned himself into the hospital this afternoon due to malnutrition. A guard was placed on the VC for disposition when well enough.

The battalion utilized three scout-sniper teams with Co's I, K and M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 13 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

25 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operation in the semi-cleared areas of NINH AN (1), KHUONG MY (2), LONG BICH (2) and KHUONG MY (3), in grid squares (AT 9070, 9169, 9068 and 9167). Search and clear operations were conducted in the semi-cleared areas of KHUONG MY (1), PHUOC NINH (4), TUY LOAN (1), TUY LOAN (2), in grid squares (AT 9268, 9368, 9370 and 9269).

At 251445H Co I sqd patrol detonated an explosive device, type unknown at (AT 903708). Device was 1' off trail and buried in ground, detonated by a trip wire 36" long causing a 2'x3' crater in ground. 2 U.S. WIA and 1 ARVN, search of area was negative after med evac.

Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the semi-cleared areas of NINH AN (2), GIAO TRI (2) and BINH THA in grid squares (AT 9070, 8970, 8971, and 8971). Search and clear operations were conducted in the semi-cleared areas of THON NINH AN, NINH AN (3), in grid squares (AT 9171, 9170 and 9071).

At 250745H Co K sqd patrol found one M-26 grenade at (AT 903709), in a G-ration can with a trip wire attached across the trail. Grenade blown in place.

Co M conducted search and destroy operations in the semi-cleared areas of PHUOC NHON (2), DUYEN SON (1, 2, 4, & 5), PHU SON (1 & 2) in grid squares (AT 9166, 9266, 9366, 9165, 9265, 9466, 9566, 9465 and 9464). There were no contacts.

ENCLOSURE (3)

CAC 31, 32 & 33 conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of DUONG LAM (2) (AT 9569, 9469) THON PHUOC HUNG (AT 9172, 9173), LA CHAU (2) (AT 9467, 9468).

At 251710H CAC 32 patrol found a Chi-Com grenade rigged with a trip wire at (AT 923715). Wire was removed and found a hook on the end of the grenade. Patrol returned with grenade.

The battalion used three scout sniper teams, one each with Co's I, K, and M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 15 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

26 July 1966.

Co M conducted sqd size search and destroy operations in the semi-cleared areas of PHUOC NHAN (2), DUYEN SON (1), (2), (4) & (5), PHU SON (1) & (2) in grid squares (AT 9166), (AT 9366), (AT 9566), (AT 9466, (AT 9266) and (AT 9465).

At 260343H an explosive device was detonated in the vic of a Co M sqd patrol at (AT 958674). A wire was found and traced, but could not find a detonating device or any personnel in the area. Located was a jug from a SID and a yellow plastic object 1" in diameter. Explosive device was determined to have been a home made mine.

CAC 31, 32 and 33 conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of DUONG LOAN (2) (AT 9569, 9469), THON PHUOC HUNG (AT 9172, 9173), LA CHAU (1) & (2), (AT 9467, 9468). There were no contacts.

At 260645H a PF from CAC 32 while enroute home, found at (AT 928712) (1) Chi Com grenade with a trip wire leading across the path. Chi-Com grenade was placed to side of the path in the bushes. PF disconnected wire and brought grenade into CAC 32.

The battalion utilized three scout-sniper teams, one each with Co's I, K, and M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 15 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

ENCLOSURE (3)

Co I conducted sqd size search and destroy operations in the semi-cleared areas of NINH AN (1), AN TAN, KHUONG MY (2), (3) & (4), PHUOC NINH (6), DONG BICH (2), in grid squares (AT 9070, 9170, 9169, 9167 9168, 9067 and 9068). Search and clear operations were conducted in the semi-cleared areas of KHUONG MY (1) and PHUOC NINH (4) (AT 9268 and 9368).

At 270935H Co I sqd patrol was approached by PF's who said a VC was in a camouflaged hole at (AT 926695). As patrol approached hole, a PF threw grenade inside resulting in the VC coming out of another entrance and attempting to run. Patrol then wounded VC and captured him. Search of the cave revealed a tunnel leading back about 10 ft. from the hole. At the end of the tunnel was a bunker 6'x6'x5' with a small camouflaged entrance. There were no weapons or grenades discovered. The VC's name is THI LUOM, born in 1949. He was forwarded to IFF and the cave was destroyed.

At 271515H Co I, 2d Plt was notified by Vn civilian of the location of an explosive device. Patrol sent to investigate and found a homemade mine at (AT 918708). Mine was in a metal container 6" long and 2" wide with a pressure type detonator. It was destroyed in place, with the civilian being awarded 500 Piastres.

At 272150H Co I perimeter positions observed 2 men running from outside of the perimeter into a wooded area at (AT 920703). Pursued by fire, did not observe any hits, and dispatched sqd to search area utilizing constant 81mm illum. As sqd swept area at (AT 919701) to a pagoda at (AT 922702) the patrol observed one man enter the pagoda. The patrol received 3 rds of S/A fire from the pagoda and returned fire with M-79 and M-60's. A search was immediately made of the pagoda, no one was discovered but the grass was trampled at rear of pagoda as if someone had recently departed.

Co K conducted sqd size search and destroy operations in the semi-cleared areas of GIAO TRI (2), BINH THAI (AT 8970, 8971, 8871 and 8872). Search and clear operations were conducted in THON TRUC DONG, THON THAI LAI, THON PHUOC HUNG (AT 9171, 9271, 9072, 9172 and 9073). There were no contacts.

CAC 31, and 33 conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of (AT 9470), THON PHU HO (AT 9174, 9173, and 9272), LA CHAU (1 & 2) (AT 9467) and (AT 9468). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

The battalion utilized three scout-sniper teams, one each with Co's I, K & M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 12 squad size night ambushes and 11 listening posts.

CAC 31, 32 and 33 conducted search and clear operations in DUONG LAM (1) (AT 9468) (AT 9469), AP HOA KHUONG (AT 9272, 9372) and LA CHAU (1) (AT 9460). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Search and clear operations were conducted in LA CHAU (3) (AT 9567), LA CHAU (5) (AT 9666), DUYEN SON (2) (AT 9566). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

CAC 31, 32 and 33 conducted search and clear operations in DUONG LAM (1) (AT 9469), DUONG LAM (3) (AT 9569), THON PHUOC HUNG (AT 9173, 9172), LA CHAU (1) (AT 9460, 9467). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

ENCLOSURE (5)

At 290700H HIEU DUC District PF's acting as a blocking force tripped (1) M-16 or similar type mine while moving into position at (AT 953653). 1 PF KIA, and 3 PF WIA med evaced.

At 290750H HIEU DUC District PF's and CAC 31 & 33 on a combined search operation discovered (1) Chi-Com AP mine rigged with a trip wire at (AT 956654). Mine was disarmed.

At 290815H HIEU DUC District PF's and CAC 31 & 33 commenced search of village at (AT 953653). A cave was located under a house with 3 VC in the cave in addition to 2 VC located in the house. An arms cache was found in a hole near the cave containing: 2 M-14's with selectors, 8 M-79 rds; 4 Chi-Com grenades, 2 sandbags of U.S. 7.62mm S/A ammo (est 2500-3000 rds), 30x30 dal. tracer rds and 2x3 prong detonators for U.S. M-16A1 mines. The 5 VCC were apprehended and taken to HIEU DUC District Hdqs for interrogation along with the weapons and arms.

At 291500H Vn female reported to Hill 22 the location of 2 81mm rounds. Patrol dispatched and located 2 duds at (AT 951662). Vn civilian was awarded 600 Piastres.

The battalion utilized three scout-sniper teams with Co's I, K, and M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 14 squad size night ambushes and 12 listening posts.

30 July 1966.

Co I conducted search and destroy operations in the semi-cleared areas of AN TAN (AT 9170), KHUONG MY (2)(AT 9169), KHUONG MY (3)(AT 9167) KHUONG MY (4) (AT 9168), TUY LOAN (1)(AT 9370) and vic grid square (AT 9260). Co K conducted search and destroy operations in the semi-cleared areas of GIAO TRI (2)(AT 8970), NINH AN (2)(AT 9070), NINH AN (3)(AT 9170), and vic (AT 8972, 8973, and 8974). Search and clear operations were conducted in THON TRUC DONG (AT 9171), THON THAI LOI (AT 9271) and vic (AT 9072) and (AT 9073). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

Co M conducted search and destroy operations in the semi-cleared areas of PHU GOC KHA (AT 9366), PHUOC NINH (1)(AT 9367), LA CHAU (2)(AT 9467), LA CHAU (3)(AT 9567) and DUYEN SON (3)(AT 9569). Search and clear operations were conducted in LA CHAU (4)(AT 9566) DUYEN SON (2)(AT 9566) and LA CHAU (5) (AT 9666).

At 300847H Co M patrol discovered a freshly dug punji pit at (AT 961661). The pit was 1' long, 1' wide and 3' deep. The pit was on a trail and camouflaged with bamboo strips and dirt. A search of the area revealed no warning sign or markings. The punji pit was destroyed.

ENCLOSURE (3)

At 301030H an informer came to Hill 22 (AT 952667) and reported that a VC had wanted to surrender but got scared at the last minute and turned himself into the RF at (AT 937663). VC had been taken to Hieu Duc Hdqs and will be turned over to Co M on 1 August after questioning by Hieu Duc.

At 302018H Co M 3d Plt position received 5 rds of S/A fire (AT 955664) from the vic of (AT 937663). No further contact established, utilizing "black" light from tank to sweep area.

CAC 31, 32 and 33 conducted search and clear operations in the semi-cleared areas of DUONG LAM (2) (AT 9569), AP PHUOC THUAN (AT 9373), AP HOA KHUONG (AT 9372) and grid squares (AT 9273, 9272) and LA CHAU (1) (AT 9468) and LA CHAU (2) (AT 9467). There were no contacts or significant incidents.

At 300345H CAC 31 PF observed unknown number of VC at (AT 946697) which were taken under fire, results unknown.

At 300400H CAC 31 sqd dispatched to DUONG LAM (1) (AT 946694). They found 200 meters of punji stake fence burned and another 200 meters destroyed. The villagers told the PFs that 10 VC had destroyed the fence by using inner tube and gas soaked rags to burn the fence. At 300530H 48 villagers came into the CAC 31 position bringing 15 sheets of propaganda material that had been distributed in the area of the village. A further search produced no results.

The battalion utilized three scout-sniper teams, one each with companies I, K, and M.

The battalion continued its emphasis on after dark activity by establishing 14 squad size night ambushes and 12 listening posts.

31 July 1966.

Security was provided for the road sweep team at Hieu Duc District Hdqs and Hill 41 complex with no significant incidents.

At 311625H Co K sqd patrol discovered at (AT 892714), (2) caves 2' to 4' wide and 5' deep. The caves were not camouflaged and appeared to be old. Both caves were destroyed by demolitions.

(7) Combined Action Company Platoons 31, 32 and 33 are located at (AT 945698), (AT 921724), and (AT 944683) respectively, conduct patrols and ambushes in defense of assigned villages/hamlets.

(8) Hieu Duc District Headquarters is located at (AT 934689).

(9) Btry _____ 1st Bn, 12th Marines direct support.

(10) Light Section _____ Plt, Co A, 3d AT Bn direct support.

(11) Det, _____ Plt, Co A, 3d Engr Bn direct support.

(12) _____ Plt (-), Co A, 9th MT Bn direct support.

(13) _____ Plt, Co A, 3d Tk Bn direct support.

c. Attachments and Detachments. Annex A (Task Organization)

d. Assumptions

- (1) That the enemy has the capability of attacking stabilized positions within the TAOR with forces ranging up to Bn size.
- (2) That weather conditions may preclude reinforcement by vehicular or helicopter means.
- (3) That the stabilized positions are so organized that they can sustain attack until reinforced by other units.
- (4) That an attack in strength will emanate from the northwest, west, or southwest.

2. MISSION. On order, designated units of 3d Bn, 3d Marines reinforce attacked units or provide blocking forces to repulse enemy attack or to preclude enemy withdrawal.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operation. This plan provides for expeditious movement of friendly forces in the Bn ZOA so as to provide physical reinforcements to a unit under attack or to place troops in designated blocking positions to prevent or impede enemy reinforcement or withdrawal. The Bn ZOA is divided into 5 sectors each containing predesignated blocking positions and reinforcing routes. While normally the nearest unit will on order move to support an adjacent unit under attack the plan is still flexible in that it allows the Bn Commander to employ any available forces as required.

b. 1st Company (Company located in Sector 1).

- (1) Be prepared to reinforce, on order, unit at position 1, 2, or 3 of Sector Five (See Appendix 5, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).
- (2) Be prepared to occupy blocking position, on order, at position 5A, 5B, 5C, 5D or 5E. (See Appendix 5, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).
- (3) Be prepared to reinforce, on order, unit located at position 1 of Sector Two. (See Appendix 2, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).
- (4) Be prepared, on order, to move by helicopter from Company LZ to blocking position 2A, 2B, 2C, 2D or 2E. (See Appendix 2, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

c. 2d Company (Company located in Sector 2).

- (1) Be prepared to reinforce, on order, unit located at position 2 or 3 of Sector One. (See Appendix 1, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

(2) Be prepared, on order, to move by helicopter from Company LZ to blocking position 1A, 1B, 1C or 1D (See Appendix 1, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

(3) Be prepared to reinforce, on order, unit located at position 1 or 2 of Sector Three. (See Appendix 3, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

(4) Be prepared, on order, to move by helicopter from Company LZ to blocking position 3A, 3B, 3C or 3D. (See Appendix 3, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

d. 3d Company (Company located in Sector 3).

(1) Be prepared to reinforce, on order, unit located at position 2 or 3 of Sector Two. (See Appendix 2, Annex C, (Operation Overlay)).

(2) Be prepared, on order, to move by helicopter from Company LZ to blocking position 2A, 2B, 2C, 2D or 2E. (See Appendix 2, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

(3) Be prepared to reinforce, on order, unit located at position 1 of Sector Four. (See Appendix 4, Annex C, (Operation Overlay)).

(4) Be prepared to occupy blocking position, on order, at position 4A, 4B or 4C. (See Appendix 4, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

e. 4th Company (Company located in Sector 4).

(1) Be prepared to reinforce, on order, unit located at position 1 or 2 of Sector Three. (See Appendix 3, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

(2) Be prepared to occupy blocking positions, on order, at position 3D or 3E. (See Appendix 3, Annex C, (Operation Overlay)).

(3) Be prepared, on order, to lift one or two platoons (-), as ordered, by helicopter from Company LZ to blocking position 3A, 3D, 3C or 3D. (See Appendix 3, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

(4) Be prepared to reinforce, on order, unit located at position 2 of Sector Four. (See Appendix 4, Annex C (Operation Overlay)).

f. Bn Reserve.

(1) H&S Co (-)

(a) Be prepared to provide platoon (-), on order, for employment within the Bn TAOR.

g. Coordinating instructions.

(1) Each company develop local reinforcing/blocking force plans within own ZOA and provide this HQ with copy.

(2) Companies be prepared to provide reinforcing/blocking force comprised of one or two platoons (-). Size of unit to be prescribed by this Hq on execution.

(3) The commander of the unit under sustained attack be prepared to give this Hq an estimate of the situation to determine the priority of:

- (a) Physical reinforcement of position or
- (b) Occupancy of blocking positions by other friendly units.

(4) The specific unit to be reinforced or blocking position to be occupied will be prescribed by this Hq on execution.

(5) ALO be prepared to request helicopters to lift up to two platoons from any specified LZ into a blocking position.

(6) Marking of LZ. Annex D (Air Support).

(7) Units ordered to reinforcing/blocking positions notify this Hq time move commences and time position occupied.

(8) Units ordered to lift by helicopter may expect about a 2 hour interval between time of warning order and arrival of helicopters into Company LZ. Stage troops at LZ as soon as possible in the event helicopters arrive sooner than expected.

(9) Unless otherwise specified, reinforcing/blocking forces will move by foot by the most direct route to assigned position.

(10) When moving on foot to assigned position avoid roads insofar as practical to thwart the VC tactic of emplacing ambushes along expected route of reinforcement.

(11) In the event reinforcement occurs the senior officer present will assume command of the combined forces.

(12) Artillery Fire Support. Annex B (Arty Fire Support).

(13) This plan effective for planning on receipt and for execution on order.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

a. All troops of reinforcing/blocking forces carry BA of ammunition, entrenching tool, and two full canteens.

5. COMMAND AND COMMUNICATIONS-ELECTRONICS

a. Pyrotechnic signals

(1) Need reinforcements - Red Star Cluster (one signal is fired)

(2) Identification of reinforcing unit arriving in battle area - Green Star Cluster, White Star Parachute, Green Star Cluster. Fire in rapid succession.

b. Units reinforcing or assuming blocking positions will guard Battalion Command Net and the Command net of the unit being reinforced.

c. Two radio operators with radios to be furnished H&S Co reserve platoon by Communications Platoon.

SECTOR 2

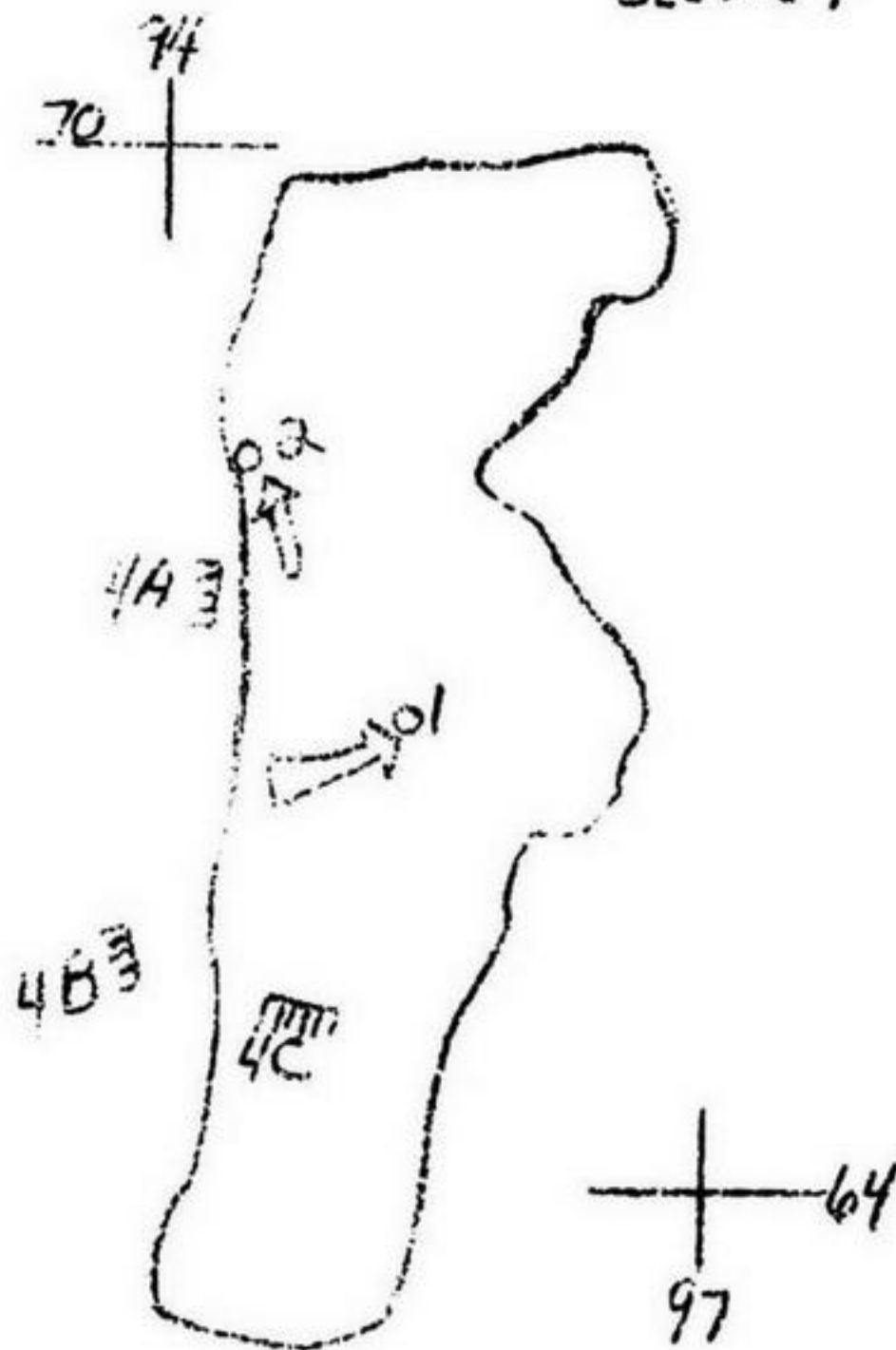


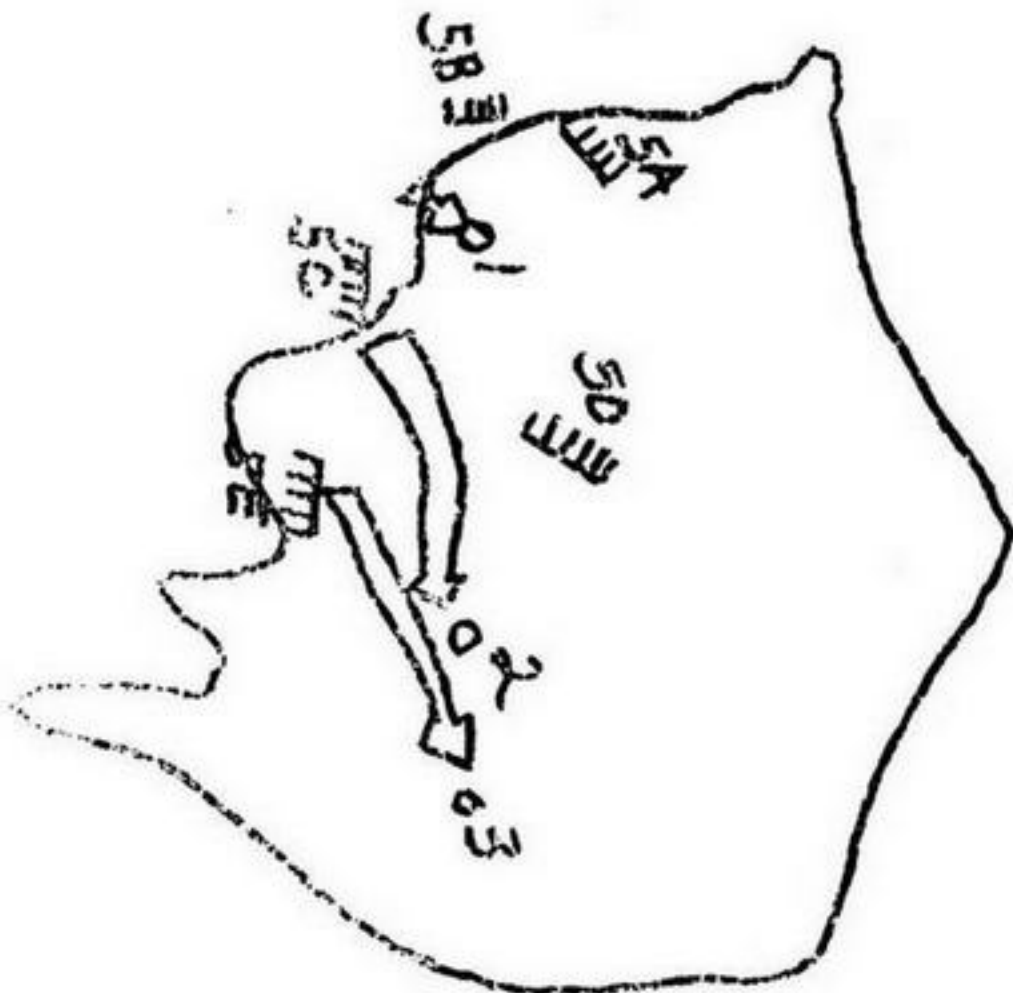

1. FMEW provides close air support, aerial observation, helicopter and service support as required.
2. Air support requirements will be requested by battalion through the BASC on the tactical air request net or the helicopter request net using the proper request form. (Appendixes 3 & 4).
3. Close coordination will be made with the Artillery Liaison Officer/Bn FSCC to insure:
 - a. Maximum safety of approach and departure routes within the TAOR during artillery fire missions.
 - b. Artillery preparation of designated LZ prior to the landing of helicopters, if required.
 - c. Proper illumination of designated LZ immediately prior to landing of helicopters, if required.
- (1) Illumination of LZ's to be accomplished by artillery illumination flares fused for low level activation (50-200 ft) to allow flare to contact ground in LZ area.

- (3) 2nd succeeding waves will be guided in by hand illum and flashlights.
4. Company landing zones will be illuminated by hand illumination and flashlights at pilots request.
5. Helicopter pilots will be briefed as to Artillery Battery Firing, Gun-Target Line, maximum ordinate, and duration of any artillery fire mission in progress in TAOR. Approach and retirement routes to be determined by pilots from above information.
6. All air support requests will be approved by the Battalion Commander.

7. Intelligence.

On intelligence sources, Division INTSUMS and PERINTREPS, stated there were two VC battalions in, or in close vicinity to, the operation area. These were identified as the R-20 and V-25 Battalions. In the area of the foothills where this battalion took up its blocking positions, there was little or no vegetation, the only cover and concealment offered was the irregularities of the terrain. Hill #148 was the critical hill mass in our area. The weather was clear, hot, and dry with temperatures ranging from 75° at night to 100° during the day.

8. Mission. To establish blocking position along southern portion of Phase II Sector and to be prepared to conduct offensive operations on order.

9. Concept of Operation. Bn Cmd Group A, Co I and Co M land by helicopter in objective area and establish a blocking position from (AT 940500) to (BT 517); prepared to conduct offensive operations on order.

10. Execution.

a. Sequence of events: Warning order received at conference 3d Marines Hdq at 041830H July. 3d Marines Frag Order 13-66 received 052315H and 9th Marines Frag Order 060550H. 3d Bn, 3d Marines (-) (Rein) chopped to OPCON 9th Marines at 061040H July upon start of helilift from 3/3 TACR to objective area. By 061145H the Bn had landed and secured the LZ without opposition. Bn CP was established at (AT 969501). Co M established a blocking position from (AT 943493) to (AT 967504). Co I established a blocking position from (AT 969504) to (BT 000517). At 061253H about 200 villagers were seen moving east along road from (AT 974517) to (AT 992517) Co I dispatched one plt to intercept them at (BT 003519). Co I plt did not see any suspicious persons in group and allowed refugees to proceed. At 070805H another large group of refugees was seen heading east at (AT 991516). Co I dispatched a plt to investigate and then allowed them to proceed. While investigating refugees the plt observed 10 males at (AT 989519). The men fled in a northerly direction and disappeared into the brush within a few minutes. The plt fired small arms at them with unknown results. At 081300H Co I found a 250 lb bomb buried in the road at (AT 972506) nose up. The fuse well was empty and the bomb appeared to have been buried for considerable period of time. It was destroyed in place.

At 031630H Co I displaced to a new blocking position at (AT 975517). Co M shifted easterly to block from (AT 951491) to (AT 971502). At 091100H Co I located a 250 lb bomb minus tail assembly at (AT 982518). Bomb was lying on ground in tree line partially concealed by leaves. It was destroyed in place. At 091300H Co M displaced to new blocking position on right flank of Co I. At 091315H Bn Cmd Group displaced. By 091410H Bn was in position as follows: Co I (AT 975518) to (AT 985518). Co M from (AT 985518) to (AT 997518). Bn CP at (AT 987517). At 101230H Co M found an M16A1 mine buried on the road at (AT 989517). It also appeared to have been in place for a long period of time. It was destroyed in place. At 101515H Co M and Bn Cmd Group started helilift back to 3/3 T4CR. Co I chopped to OPCON 1st Bn 3d Marines at 101600H. Co M and Bn Cmd Group chopped to OPCON 3d Marines on completion of helilift at 101700H. Co I returned to 3/3 T4CR at 121400H and chopped to OPCON 3/3.

11. Results. Due to lack of enemy contact no results were apparent to this unit. The only casualties suffered were 4 heat casualties: Co I (1), Co M (1), H&S Co (1), and 1st Anglico (1).

12. Administrative Matters.

a. Supply. An initial supply of one day MCI, two full canteens and a BA of ammo was carried by individuals. 81mm Mortar Sections carried HE and WP only in the event enemy contact was made on landing. Resupply of 81mm Illumination was requested after blocking positions were established. All resupply was furnished by helicopter.

b. Maintenance. Some maintenance problems were encountered on communications equipment. Maintenance that could not be accomplished in the field was resolved by lifting the equipment to Bn rear area and receiving like items in the field.

c. Treatment of casualties and evacuation and hospitalization. The only casualties were heat casualties and they were evacuated to the Medical Bn by helicopter.

d. Transportation. CH46 helicopters were utilized in transporting the Bn to and from the operation area. No vehicular transportation was available to the Bn.

e. Communications. It was found that several "dead spots" were located in the operation area. It was necessary to move away from these places to establish reliable radio communications. Wire communications were used sparingly due to the wide area covered by the Bn (7000 meters) and limitations on the amount of wire that could be carried by the number of personnel available. Several cases of BA-270 batteries were found to be completely dead and, due to the heat, the useable life of BA-279 batteries was only 6 to 8 hours.

f. Medical evaluation. During summer operations the wearing of body armor contributes significantly toward heat exhaustion.

13. Special Equipment and Techniques. N/A

14. Commanders Analysis. Although the enemy did not attempt to penetrate this Bn's blocking position the presence of the Bn in this position may have deterred the enemy from attempting an escape to the south from the sweeping forces. The two companies of this Bn were spread very thin in order to cover the assigned blocking position (nearly 7000 meters). Due to this extended position an enemy attempt to break through in force might have been partially successful.

15. Recommendations. That in future operations the blocking forces be assigned an area commensurate with the strength of the blocking forces.

MARINE CORPS MATTERS

1. In accordance with reference (a) the following matters are submitted:

a. Helilift of 3d Bn, 3d Marines into objective area.

(1) Problem. During the initial planning conferences it was planned that this Bn would be lifted in the following order: Company I, Bn Cmd Group "A", and Company M. The actual lift was made by lifting out Co I, Co M and then the Bn Command Group. This placed two companies in the objective area with a 30 minute delay before arrival of a command group. Apparently, somewhere between the helilift request by the Bn and the briefing given HMM 164, the order of lift was inadvertently changed. When the helicopters landed in the Co M area for pick up instead of the Bn CP area the Bn ALO was unsuccessful in getting the pick up changed to the proper order. ALO talked to helos on HD net Crimson. Pilot stated his men were briefed to pick up battalion in certain order, contrary to battalion request, and they could not change this order of lift.

(2) Recommendations. That the helicopter squadron have the flexibility to make a change from their briefing order if requested by the unit being lifted when the tactical situation warrants such a request.

b. Resupply.

(1) Problem. Due to the wide dispersion of the Bn it was requested that specific items of resupply be brought by helicopter to three LZ's. The requested supplies either failed to arrive, went to the wrong LZ, or were not in the quantity ordered. A few examples out of the many discrepancies were: 81mm mortar ammo landed in the chly LZ that did not have mortars, one unit getting too many MCI's while another unit recieved an insufficient amount, requesting 12 batteries and getting 12 cases of batteries, etc. In one instance an emergency resupply was requested at 1630 and did not arrive until about 2330. When the supplies did arrive many of the items were part of the normal supply request and not included on the emergency request.

(2) Recommendation. That supplies be segregated by LZ at the area where they are to be picked up and the helicopter pilot be informed as to what unit and LZ the supplies are to be delivered. It is also recommended that emergency supply requests be given prompt and careful response.

c. Artillery Registration of Defensive Fires.

(1) Problem. On the first day in the objective area, artillery fire could not be registered for night defensive fires due to the fact that the same frequency for the conduct of fire net was assigned to this Bn and one other. The net was so tied up with traffic that in the few hours left from the time the Bn was in blocking position and nightfall the fires could not be registered.

(2) Recommendation. That Bn's be assigned different frequencies for the conduct of fire net. The lack of registered defensive fires and the wide dispersion of organic units could have been a serious weakness if the enemy had attacked in strength during the hours of darkness.


