PAUT II NAMETIVE SUMMARY

From 1 through 4 November, the battalion continued in its mission to defend the C-2 Bridge position located in the 9th Marines AO. Routime activities consisted of heavy patrolling, ambushes, company size sweep and clear operations and installation of defensive wire and positions. On 5 November the battalion went to OPCON 3d Marines for participation in Phase I of Operation Lancastor. Battalion operations in this connection were confined primarily to platoon and company sized combet patrols conducted from a Battalion Patrol Base established on the second day of the operation. Although enemy emminition and equipment were uncovered by patrols, contact with the enemy was not made. On 10 November the bettalion was returned to OPCON of the 9th Marines for perticipation in Operation Kentucky, Phase II. On 11 November contact with an estimated WA company was made by the battalion. The enemy was ultimately driven from their bunkers at the point of contact with the assistance of artillery and air support. Directional mines were encountered throughout the attack. Following seizure, the bunker complex was consolidated and a defensive perimeter was established. at which time NVA forces commenced harrassing mortar, recoiless rifle,, and small arms fire. Incoming mortars and Chicoms continued throughout the night. The following morning (12Nov67) the battalion returned to the C-2 Bridge position. On 14 Novomber the battalion; minus one company, swept the areas east of MSR 561 along with 1/1 in connection with Phase III, Operation Kentucky. Mogative enemy contact was made. On 17 November the battalion, less Kilo Company, which was assigned OFCON to 3/4, was back in position at the C-2 Bridge. The battalion (-) war next assigned to occupy the Cam Lo Artillery Base (C-3) and Com to writing position (C-3A) on 22 November. On 24 Movember Kilo Company, with a platoon from Lima Company attached, was reassigned to OFCON of the 12th Marines. India Company was assigned to OFCON of the 11th Engineer Bettalion on 27 November, leaving the battalion with Mike Company and two platoons from Lima Company on position. Daily routing at C-3 and C-3 Bridge position consisted of security patrols and arbushes to ensure security of the position and MSR 561. The battelion was also assigned the responsibility to control traffic on the Occupation of the position also presented MSR between C-3 and A-4 the occasion for close contact with civilian personnel in a heavily populated area. This resulted in the establishment of civic action en populace control programs. Liaison was established between this command and the Cam Lo District Headquarters upon arrival at the C-3 position.

The loss of two rifle companies and one plateon resulted in difficulty meeting the multi-commitments inherent to the occupation of the C-3 and C-3 Bridge position.

Although the battalion casualties incurred as a result of enemy mortar and artillery were light during this period, an unprecidented number of casualties were taken as a direct result of friendly artillery and mortar fires.

Initial difficulties at the C-3 position have been experienced in the implemation of the Dye-Marker Plan. A lack of vehicular and heavy equipment resources have hindered anticipated progress. Indications are that these resources will soon be made available, which should accelerate construction during the following month.

1. Combat Missions Assigned:

- a. Basic Mission. To conduct missions in assigned area of operations in accordance with 3d MarDiv Operation Order 59-67 (Kentucky).
- b. On 5 November 67, 3d Bettalion, 3d Marines chopped from OPOON 9th Merines to OPCON 3d Marines for duration of Operation Lancaster 1-67 (Phase I). The battalion's mission was to assault and seize Objective "C", vicinity YD 114660, establish a patrol base and product aggressive combat/reconnaissance patrols and ambushes, and propare to establish a blocking force on Regimental Objective "C".

 Reference: 3d Marines Operation Frag Order (Lancaster) 1-67. Bat-talion Frag Order 56-67.
- o. On 10 November, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines chopped from OPCON 3d Marines to OPCON 9th Marines, and on 11 November commenced Phase II, Operation Kentucky. The battalion's mission was to attack northwest from an attack position south of Con Thien and seize Regimental Objective "C", vicinity YD 102693, and to be prepared to defend Objective "C" for 8-36 hours. Reference: 9th Marines Frag Order #1 (Kentucky). Battalion Frag Order 57-67.
- d. On 14 November the battalion (-) commenced Phase III of Operation Kentucky. The battalion's mission was to follow in trace of 1/1 and accupy Objective 1. On order secure objectives 3,5,7, and 9 and be prepared to conduct a tactical move to the C-2 Bridge and resume defensive positions. Reference: Frag Order #4, Operation Kentucky. Pattalion Frag Order 58-67.
- e. On 22 Nevember, the battalion (-)(rein) displaced to C-3 and C-3 Bridge positions and assumed defensive position and related security missions. Reference: Battalion Frag Order 59-67.

Significant Operations Conducted.

a. On 1. Movember 67, India Company was conducting a Search & Destroy mission west of the C-2 Bridge. During a security halt the company sent a patrol forward to recon a danger area. The squad sighted 15 NV a to their front, coordinates YD 113666, and set up an ambush.

India Company engaged an estimated enemy platoon. Artillery and 81mm missions were called. Lima Company moved but to assist India Company and made contact with the enemy, after moving thru India

Company. Fighting continued throughout the day until contact was broken. All units then returned to the C-2 Bridge position before evening.

- b. On 5 November 67 the battalion (rein) left the C-2 Bridge position and proceeded southwest towards Regimental Objective "C" in the vicinity of YD 114660. On reaching Objective "C" the battalion consolidated the objective and established a patrol base/blocking force. Reconnaissance patrols and ambushes were conducted. Numerous bunker complexes, trenches and small amounts of energy equipment were uncovered. There was negative energy contact during this periods
- c. On November 10 the battalion (rein) moved morth to an attack position located at YD 113693. At 0400H, on 11 November, the battalion moved to the line of departure under bover of darkness. The attack commenced with two companies, India and Mike, in the attack and Kilo and Line in reserve. Directional mines were encountered early during the attack and casualtics were insurred by both companies. Mike Company came under heavy fire from the enemy in bunkers located at YD 101693, the general area of Regimental Objective "C". Momentum was retained and the bunker complex was neutralized. When contact had subsided, Mike Company was pulled back to defensible terrain and Regimental Objective "C" was consolidated. Enemy small arms, recoiless rifle and morter fire wase received throughout the remainder of daylight hours. Probes comtimed through the night accompanied by heavy incoming morters and Chic merenados. Enemy contact ceased prior to daylight and on order, at first light on 12 November the battalion returned to the C-2 Bridge position.
- d. On 14 Movember the battalion (-)(rein) moved from 6-2 Prices north to a position below Con Thien and following in trace of (/), seized Objective 1. On order the battalion, with 1/1 to the east, seized Regimental Objectives 3.5.7.8.9. and 10, with negative energy contact. On seizure of Objective 10, the battalion, on order, returned to the 0-2 Bridge position.
- sition to C-3 and C-3A positions. Lima Company was the lead company with the remainder of the battalion following in trace. The movement to the new position had negative examy contact. On reading C-3 and C-3A the battalion established a defensive position and related missions.

- (1) Class I The battalion presently maintains 7 days of Crations on its position at Cam Lo. A daily resupply also provides mail, cannot juices, cannot fruit, fresh fruit; SP packs and fresh milk when available.

this battalion. As an example, the battalion has only 8 B-6 MOS 0369's as compared against the manning level authorization of 20.

12. Intelligence.

During the first part of the month of November, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines occupied positions at the C-2 Bridge. On 1 November, the 3/3 Command Post, at YD 127671, received approximately 12 rounds of 60mm mortar fire. Later in the day, India Company engaged an estimated NVA plateen. Results were 11 enemy KIA (conf), 12 NVA KIA (prob) and an assertment of enemy gear captured. During the month of November the battalian conducted plateen and company size patrols uncovering numerous fighting holes, trenches and bunkers. The battalian participated in multi-battalian operations in the 9th Marines area of operation.

Another significant enemy contact occurred on 11 November when the battalion encountered automatic weapons, small arms, sniper, 60pm morter fire and numerous booby-traps at YD 100706. The enemy unit was estiminated to be an NVA company: (After the battalion.obj. ectivo was taken, receiless rifle and morter rounds were recovered indicating that the mortars and recoiless rifles were withdrawn during the engagement). Enemy losses numbered 10 NVA KIA (conf).

Although the engaging unit was unidentified, the general operating area of the 7th Bn, 90th NVA Reg't is to the west and the 9th Bn, 90th NVA Reg't to the north of the C-2 Bridge. The 27th Imdependent Bn. has been operating to the east of MSR 561 in the 9th Marine: 40.

On 22 November, the battalion moved to C-3 and C-3A to assume defensive positions. Listening posts, ambushes, scout-sniper teams and plateon and company size patrols resulted in negative enemy contact although reports indicated at least one NVA company in the 3/3 operational area. Intelligence reports and mining incidents revealed the presence of NVA/VC units of unknown size operating in the Cam Lo vicinity. Other intelligence sources indicate the villages are less than law Vu, Thon Bac Binh and Thon Quat Xa to have active NVA/VC units.

13. Communications

a. General. During the month of November the Communications Platoos operated both wire and radio communications in the field and rear areas. On Operation Kentucky wire was run to the rifle companies as well as maintaining the normal battalion, regimental and admin nets. On 22 November the battalics displaced to the Cam Lo Artillery Base where a communications system was already established. Switchhourds were given to Lima and Kilo Companies who maintain positions outside the battalion perimeter.

t. Training. Most training that took place was on the job because of the nature of the battalion's operations during this pericd. A constant effort is being made to expenderain wire and radio personnel. New radio personnel are training with the rifle companies.

c. Communications Equipment Status. There was a large impurt of H-189 handsets for the PRO-25 this month. The following is a list of major combat essential gear that is not operationally ready:

d. Problem Areas. Whip and tape antennas remain in short supply. Nine AN PRC-25's previously mentioned in last months report have not yet been replaced. This imposes an unrealistic handicap in controlling maneuver elements during operations.

14. Monther. The weather for November was generally warm and fair, with sporadic rains increasing in frequency toward the end of the month. The average high temperature was 80 degrees with an average low of 70 degrees. The normal humidity was 80% with 11.63 inches of rain recorded. The wind was generally from the north/northwest at an average speed of 8 knots. Visibility averaged 6 miles.

15. Fire Support.

- a. During the month of November the battalion participated in two operations, Lancaster and Kentucky, and moved to a new position at Cam Lo Artillery Base. No new "Night Defensive Fires" were planed for the new position because the fire plan submitted by the unit relieved was excellent.
- b. Problem Areas. During daylight hours, firing clearance for certain areas of the present area of operation is required from the Cam Lo District Headquarters. At times, particularly the early morning hours, some difficulty has been experienced in contacting District Headquarters by radio, which could under pressing circustances, at best substantially reduce reaction time.

16. Air Support

- a. First Marine Aircraft Wing contributions to the mission of the 3d Battalion, 3d Marines during the month of November included: close and directair support, aerial observation, recon overflights, aerial resupply, medical evacuation and TPQ-10 missions. The 7th Air Force provided aerial observations and B-52 strikes.
- b. On the 11th of November at 1000H, Percentage Charlie, an AO requested by the battalion, ran four airstrikes on enemy positions at coordinates YD 100706. The Marine aircraft expended 20,750 lbs. of ordnance and greatly reduced the enemy fire being placed on the battalion from this position.
- c. An aerial overflight was used to familiarize the Battalion Operations Officer with the terrain during Operation Lancaster.
- d. During Operation Lancaster and Kentucky the battalion was constantly supported by aerial observation aircraft from the Dong Ha and Phu Bai bases.
- e. On 11 November a MedEvac helicopter crashed in the battalion landing zone at YD 101701 while evading enemy fire. The crew escaped injury and was later evacuated by other helicopters. A H-53 helicopter was sent to extract the downed aircreft. The H-53 was receiving enemy auto-matic weapons fire at the time of the extraction and was forced to release the H-34, which subsequently caught fire and burned.

JOURNAL SUMMARY

Ollow67 - The C-2 Bridge position received approximately 12 rounds of enemy 60mm mortar fire from coordinates YD 134664. Fired 81mm mortar and artillery mission, results unknown. India Company uncovered U. S. ordnance at coordinates YD 114654. Ordnance appeared to be company resupply site. Uncovered was (20) cases 81mm mortar ammunition, (4) cases M-69 ammunition, (20) cases M-26 grenades, (1) case of pop-ups, (4) cases claymores, (10) cases S/A ammunition, and (70) 60mm mortar rounds, All ordnance was blown in place arcept (3) cases claymores. It 1200H India Company sighted (15) NVA to their front at coordinates YD 113666. India Company set up ambush.

India Company at 1230H engaged with estimated enemy platoon. Artillery and 81mm mortar missions requested and air support was called in. Lima Company prepared to move out to assist India Company. India Company found at coordinates YD 113667, (1) gas mask, (1) diary (NVA), 2 NVA packs, (2) Hammocks and some rice. All gear was forwarded to Battalion S-2. Lima Company made contact with the enemy after moving thru India Company and reported the enemy appeared to be well dug in. India Company broke contact with the enemy at 1450H. Lima Company continued to call artillery, 81mm mortar missions and gunship missions in the area. At 1600H all elements of India Company and Lima Company returned to C-2 Bridge. Contact resulted in (6) USMC KIA, (14) USMC WIA (MedBvac), (1) USMC NIA and (18) USMC (minor). Enemy casualties (11) NVA KIA (com), 12 NVA (prob).

O2Nov67 - India Company at 1130H recovered (1) MIA at considerates
YD 116666. Sent body to Bong Ha and listed as (1) KIA. India
Company uncevered at coordinates YD 117667 an assertment of enemy
equipment. Enemy equipment forwarded to Regiment.

At 1350H, C-2 Bridge position received incoming 68mm mortar rounds. Approximately (53) rounds were counted, from coordinates YD 117665 and YD 139672. Ptillery and 61mm mortar missions fired. results unknown.

O3Nov67 - Mike Company, at 0835H, found booby-trap at coordinates YD 136674. Booby-trap was M-26 grenade with trip wire thru ring. Grenade destroyed in place.

04Nov67 - At 1235H, 3d Battalion, 4th Marines at C-2, detected movement with a FPS-5 at a range of 1390 meters and 6200 mils. Fired 81mm mortar mission, results unknown. At 2030H, 3d Battalion, sen Marines sighted 2 secondary explosions from radar controlled missions

at C-2. C-2 continued firing missions, resulting in 3 more secondary explosions.

O5Nov67 - At 0600H, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines chopped OFCON from 9th Marines to OFCON 3d Marines for duration of Operation Lancaster, (Phase I). At 0545H Mike Company moved to establish a blocking power sition at YD 108670 to cover the exposed flank of the battalion. At 0615H. Wile Company departed position and moved southwest to Regimental Objective "C", India Company followed in trace. Command Group Alpha and Lima Company moved from position at 0950H and proceeded to Regimental Objective "C". At 1130H, the battalion established a patrol base at YD 114671. At 2145H, India Company's ambush sighted small secondary explosion as a result of an artillery mission.

O6Nov67 - Mike Company uncovered two 82mm mortar pits approximately 1 week old and two 82mm mortar rounds at coordinates YD 116672, both rounds were buried. Mike Company, at 1140H, found one letter with Vietnamese writing on it, also found were NVA footprints approximately two days old. Letter forwarded thru proper channels.

OSNov67 - Lina Company, at coordinates YD 117658, uncovered a base camp consisting of (25) fighting holes approximately two weeks old. Enemy equipment uncovered in vicinity consisted of (2) boxes 7.62 annunition, (3) boxes 82mm mortar fuses. Area was searched, no sign of recent use. Destroyed fighting holes and buried equipment. There were no other significant events.

09Nov67 - At 1100H the battalion started moving to Regimental Objective "F", at coordinates YD 115685, YD 108678, YD 119679, IAW Operation Lancaster. At 1130H, Mike Company uncovered numerous fighting holes at YD 109669. Found also were (2) 82mm mortar rounds which were destroyed in place. Air strikes and artillery called in after which Mike Company engaged the enemy in a firefight. Mike Company sustained (5) USMC WIA's (Medewac) and the enemy casualties were (10) NWA KIA (conf). During the process of MedEvacs, at 1045H, a helicopter was downed when it a tall rotor hit a tree at coordinates YD 101701. Crew members were put aboard MedEvac helicopter and returned to Dong Ha.

1. Situation.

a. Enemy Forces. Enemy artillery and morters always imminent,

b. Friendly Forces.

(1) 9th Marines AO remains the same. Operation Kentucky continues.

- (2) Two companies 3/4 located at C-3 and one company located at C-2 area.
 - (3) 1/1 assumed control of Con Thien
 - (4) Foxtrot, 2/12 provides direct support for this movement.
- (5) 3/4's mortars provide direct support for that portion of our movement south of C-2 position.

c. Attachments and Detachments

- (1) Kilo Commany 3/3 remains to OFCON 3/4 at C-2 position.
- 2. <u>Mission</u>. At H-Hour displace, Bn (-)(Rein) to C-3 and C-3 Bridge positions and assume a defensive position and related security missions.

3. Execution.

a. Concept of Operation

- (1) Battalion (-)(Reix) will move from C-2 Bridge position to C-3 and C-3 Bridge position and assume a defensive position.
- (2) One company and Command Group "A" will follow in trace of lead company and assume defense of C-3 area.
- (3) One company will move south to C-3 Bridge position and assume defense of that position.
- (4) One company and one 81mm mortar section will remain in position at C-2 Pridge until relieved by 3/4, at which time one company (rein) will move to C-3 and assume defense of the C-3 area. At this time, the 81mm mortar section will join Kilo Company at the C-2 position.
- b. Lima Company (Rein) is designated as the lead company for the battalion. Flank security will be established as far as C-2 area and then redeploy south to C-3 Bridge position. Report to battalion when the company assumes control of that position. Constitute reaction platoon on arrival.
- o. India Company (Rein) follow in trace of the lead company on order. On reaching C-3 meet guides as pregranged and assume defensive positions.

- d. Mike Company (Rein) remain at the C-2 Bridge position until relieved by 3/4, at which time transport Ly trucks to C-3 position and assume defensive positions.
- e. 106's will be mule mounted and move out in column, spread out, on order. Move in trace of Lima Company. One section displace to C-3 Bridge position on order for attachment to Lima Company. Platoon (-) occupy defensive position at C-3 position.
- f. 81's (-) move in trace of Command Group Alpha, on foot, less personnel assigned cover initial movement will move to C-2 position for attachment to Kilo Company on order and one squad to the C-3A position for attachment to Lima Company. The remainder of the Platon will establish positions at C-3 position.

g. Coordinating Instructions

(1) D-Day - 22Nov67 (2) H-Hour - 0700H

(3) Reference Points - Animals 1465, Fish 1562

(4) All units be prepared, on order to assume security commitments at C-3 and C-3 Bridge, to include road security and sentinal posts.

(5) Formation for march will be streggered column with such

march unit responsible for its own security.

(6) The following check points have been established:

CP #1 - C-2 position; CP #2 - Hill 52; CP #3 - C-3 position; CP #4 - C-3 Bridge

4. Aministration and Logistics

- a. Turn in all excess gear by 0900H on 21Nov67
- b. Stage fighting hole covers and engineer tools
- c. Inventory all ammo in position insuring all personnel have BA. All extra ammo will be centralized.

5. Command and Comminications

- a. Command Group Alpha will move in trace of Lima Company
- b. The battalion TAC net will be guarded at O600H.
