NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of August the 3d Battalion, 3d Morines conducted security and anti-infiltration operations in the Lancester II AO. There were light contacts gained with the enemy during the first part of the month and several heavy contacts made during the

latter pert of the month.

On 2 August the Alpha Command group and Companies "L" and "I" departed Fire Base Margo and joined the Bravo Command group and Companies "R" and "M" at Fire Support Base Joan. A defensive posture was "maintained at FSB Joan with A August when the Battalion was lifted by helicopter to the vicinity of YD 111503 in the Cam Lo area. One Company (Company "K") was given the mission of providing security for the Cam Lo Resettlement area while the Battalion (-) took up positions northwest of Cam Lo to block enemy infiltration routes and conduct search and destroy missions. During this period there were several sightings of enemy personnel and two incidents of incoming enemy morter fire.

On 9 August Company "K" was relieved of the responsibility for the Cambo Resottlement area and commenced a heliborne assault landing on Hill #162 (YD 070635). The landing was made without incident or enemy contact at 1145H. Company "K" linked up with Battalion elements at approximately 1430H. On the ovening of 9 August the Battalion C.P. and Companies "M" and "K" received an estimated 20 rounds of 60mm mortar fire from the vicinity of YD 064644. Bight WIA's med evac were sustained. During the period 4 - 12 August over 280 bunkers were destroyed and numerous enemy equipment captured along with four individual and one crew served

weapen.

On 12 Angust the Battalion returned to Camp Carroll and assumed the mission of security for Carroll, Thom Son Lam, Khe Gia

Bridge, Dong Ha Mountain OP on' Route #C.

The Battalion (-) moved by motor march on 15 August to the vicinity of TD 085593 and operated in this area until 19 August. During this period there were four light contacts with the enemy which resulted in eight NVA KIA confirmed, six individual and one crew served waspon captured. Numerous bunkers and enemy equipment were found.

On 10 August the Bettalion (-) moved to the area of the Rockpile and the following morning moved to establish Company Patrol Bases and conduct patrol operations in the vicinity of the Razorback.

Battalion elements gained contact with the enemy on ten occosions and came under heavy artillery and mortar fire during this period.

There was one incident where b ttalion elements received fire from a direct fire we apon.

On 21 Amoust Company "M" engaged an estimated enemy squad in the vicinity of XD 979589. The enemy was engaged with small arms, and automatic weapons, the enemy broke contact and Company "M" elements searched the area and found six NVA KIA along with weapons and equipment. Three friendly "NA were sustained.

On 23 Aurust a large messing area was discovered at XD 970597. The area had space for approximately 300 personnel. A stove system with underground smokestacks had been constructed. The area appeared to be newly built. On 25 August the Bravo Command group and elements of Commany "K" departed Camp Carroll and joined the Battalian.

On the evening of 26 August Company "L" begin to receive artillery and approximately 45 minutes later was probed by 35 - 50 NA. The contact was initiated by a Company "L" listening post which suffered three MIA. The enemy was engaged with artillery, small arms and automatic weapons fire. The contact resulted in 12 friendly WIA. The area was searched at first light and five NVA KIA were confirmed. Four crew served weapons and one individual weapon was captured. The bodies of the MIA's were recovered.

Between the hours of 2000H 2100H the same ovening Companies "I", "K" and the Bravo Command group received fire (five rounds) from a direct fire weapon which was believed to be firing from a care on the Razorback. Artillary missions were called with unknown results. A friendly artillary round impacted in Company "I"s lines during a fire mission at the enemy direct fire weapon resulting in four WIA.

On 27 August at 1915H the Battalion rear at Camp Carroll sufficed three KIA and two WIA from enemy 130mm artillery. The casualties were from the 81mm mortar platoon. The same evening Companies 'I'. "K" and the Brave Command group received 15 - 20 rounds of 130mm artillery which resulted in seven KIA and five WIA.

Puring 28 and 29 August there were three light contests with the enemy which resulted in one NVA KIA along with centure! equipment.

on the afternoon of 30 August Company "M" elements engaged approximately six NVA who were moving toward the Company "M" position, the enemy was engaged with artillery, martars and small arms. A sweep of the area of contact disclosed two NVA This, one individual weapon and documents. On the evening of 30 August Company "L" in the vicinity of XD 355591 received Chilom granades on the position. A listening post sighted the NVA and engaged with

M-79s and small arms. At approximately the same time Company "M" received a probe from an undetermined number of NA, they were engaged with small arms and granades and withdraw. The areas of contact were searched at first light, nothing was found in Company "L"s area, Company "M" discovered NVA granades, magazines and equipment. On the night of 31 August Company "M" received small arms fire on the position, a claymore mine was detonated and granades were thrown by Company "M" elements and the fire ceased. A search of the area was made on 1 September with negative results.

During the period 20 - 31 August the Battalion accounted for fifteen NVA confirmed, captured nine individual, three crew server, weapons and destroyed approximately ninety bunkers.

12. Invelligence.

During the month of August the Battalion participated in search and destroy operations in the Cam Lo, Razorback and Mutters ridge area. Contact was at a minimum and elements of the Battalion had only one large engagement with the enemy. The Battalion in the earlier part of the month took very little incoming, however the incoming increased during the latter portion of the month.

During the first few days of the month the Battalion was at FSB Margo and FSB Joan. They maintained a defensive posture while sending out patrols. They were then helilifted to the Cam Jo area to begin search and destroy operations while leaving one company at the Cam Lo District Headquarters to work with the PF's. The Battalion found many bunkers and fortified areas and captured large amounts of enemy equipment. Elements of the Battalion received incoming on one occasion. Company "M" while getting set in their night position received 15-20 rounds of 82mm mortars resulting in light casualties.

The Battalion returned to Camp Carroll for rehabilitation and then returned to the Cam Lo area to continue operations They continued to uncover enemy bunkers and gear. There were a few light contacts however, only small enemy units were involved. The Battalion then moved to the Razorback and Mutters ridge area. In this area elements of the Battalion had one large contact and the Battalion was subjected to enemy 82mm mortars and 130mm artillery.

Company "L" while returning from a light contact with a few enemy were followed by a large enemy element. Company "l" left a

listening post out which was overrun by the enemy. The enemy then engaged Company "L" with recoiless rifles, morters and automatic weapons. Company "L" employed small arms, 81mm morters, artillery and requested fixed wing against the enemy. The enemy broke contact after inflicting severe casualties on Company "L". The enemy continued to probe the lines throughout the night and final contact was ended in the early morning. During the time of this contact, the rest of the Battalion was receiving enemy mortar and artillery fire.

The bunkers that were found during the month were well camouflaged and were overheaded. The majority of these bunkers were fairly new and there was a large amount of equipment found in them.

In addition to the mortars and artillery used against the Battalion, the enemy used direct fire weapons in the latter part of the month.

The enemy appears to be building up in these areas, possibly for operations during the monsoons. Infiltration routes leading into these areas from the north have shown a marked increase in use curing the month of August.

13. Communications. During the month of August the Battalion operated almost continually in the field. Work continued at Camp Carroll to clean up excess wire, provide lighting to the Company areas and power for the freezers in the Battalion messhall. RT-524's were set up on the Battalion administrative net to Dong Ha and Camp Carroll to ensure reliable communications. It was noted that traffic on this net has increased substantively and a circuit log was instituted at both stations to record all transmissions and minimize repetition.

a. Training and Personnel. The communications platoon lost one wireman KIA this month. It received 10 badly needed 2531's and two (2) 2847 technicians. These men were immediately brought forward to Camp Carroll for training. Cross training between wire and radio sections continued.


