## PART II

## NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The Battalion during the month of October was occupied primarily with manning and conducting local search and destroy patrols around static positions. The Battalion had responsibility for Camp Carroll, Khe Gio Bridge, Dong Ha Mt., and Checkpoint #59. In addition, the Battalion supplied 3 companies later in the month to occupy Fire Support Bases, Pete, Winchester, and Catapult.

Enemy contact during the month of October was minimal. There was one incident of incoming artillery and several enemy sightings. Company L captured 1 NVA in the NW portion of the mestern Lancaster II AC. The POW had been left behind on account of illnes by a unit moving north. The majority of findings indicated old enemy bivousc areas.

Responsibility for Camp Carroll brought the Battalion in contact with a considerable number of civilians along Route 39 and in the Camp Carroll trash dump. There were several incidents of finding suspected VC in the groups of civilians found along the road or in the trash dump. All suspects were released as innocent civilians.

On 23 October the Battalion departed Camp C rroll on an operation to the Northwestern portion of our MO. This operation was the Northwesternmost move that had been made by an Infantry Battalion to date in the Lancaster II MO. Signs of enemy activity were again minimal although Company L did capture the aforementioned POW, who stated his unit as the 1st Battalion of the 246th Regiment. The operation terminated on the 30th of October. Company L was openned to the 4th Marines, vicinity XD773566. Upon return to Camp Carrell, the Battalion preparate assume responsibility for the Con Thian, C-2 and C-3 in the Kentucky MG.

## 12. INTALLIGACE

There were several small contacts during the month of October, including the discovery of trails and several bunker complexes. On 2 October, M/3/3 found an old enumy artillery position which showed signs of recent use. Vicinity AD959536. The position appeared to be possibly boob -trapped and was destroyed by an artillery TCT. On 4 October (Oh0630H), I/3/3 apprehended 9 indigenous personnel. Vicinity YD091564. Detainees were interrogated by 15th ITT and found to be innocent civilians. They were turned over to the Cam Lo Disarick Chief and subsequently released as innocent civilians. O42120H I/3/3, Vicinity YD026562, heard 3-4 rounds of what was believed to have been AK-47 fire from the NB. Vicinities YD031559 and YD031562. Also movement was heard and a scout dog picked up a scent. They fired 1 WP round and 24 HE rounds of 60mm mortoars with unknown results. On 5 October (050015H) L/3/3, in the Vicinity YD062543, heard digging outside of the lines. They fired o rounds of Illumination and the noise ceased. A short time later, a small explosion was heard. On & October (O&1030H). L/3/3 found 1 NVA body, 1 E-tool. 1 heliet, and 2 RPG rounds approximately 2 months old in the Vicinity XD976566. Search of the body revealed no intelligence information. On 13 October (130800H), M/3/3 found a large bunker complex consiting of approximately 25 o'x3'x9' bunkers in the vicinity XDt25611. Bunkers appeared to be 1 month old and word used with in the past wook. All bunkers were reinferced with loss and dirt and contained racks built of banboo about 4" off the ground. On the tops of the bunkers were overheaded eating or sitting areas with small tables made of wood. There was a trail leading to all bunkers with a cooking site on it. The area appeared to be a rest area, not a fighting area. Everything was destroyed. On 18 October (180500H), K/3/3 observed approximately 100 civilians moving NE to MV toward the river in the vicinity IDO89579. They detained 3 of the civilians which were turned over to 15th ITT for interrogation and released by the Cam Lo District Chief as innocent civilians. On 19 October (191745H), L/3/3 observed 1 NVA meving west in the vicinity 20985567. They called an alm mortar and artillery mission with unknown results. At 191801H, L/3/3 in the vicinity XD984567 observed 1 enemy appreciation telly 100-900 meters away moving south. They called in alm and artillery mission with unknown results. On 20 October (20160th), K/3/3 observed 2 3'x8' paddle boats covered with tarpaulin containing 2 or more men each moving down the Cam Lo River in the Vicinity YDO81563. On 21 October (210700H) in the Vicinity ADE25611, N/3/3 discovered 28 bunkers, aid station, and a cooking facility which would accomodate a large force. 4 cans of plasma and homan blood and intestines were found outside of the bunkers. Company Malso heard whistle which was believed, according to the Kit Corson Scout, to be enough troop signal in area. On 24 October (241515H), R/3/3 found a trail running south. The trail had steps. Also found 2 Victingues writings on trues. First sign said, "Who" and pointed north. Second sign said, "2d Company NVA headed south." Trail was followed to 10111004 from 10111007. On 20 October (2010305), 1/3/3 found a trail running M 793621 to MD711609. Trail runs north to south at that point. Found area which appeared to have been recently occupied by t-10 enemy. Also found fresh tracks of 1 man heading north. On 28 October (281030H), 1/3/3 found a Vietnamese note in a tree in the Vicinity XD762612.

Translated note read, "No supplies or enemy in area and am leaving area." At 281240H, L/3/3 apprehended 1 sick NVA in a hammock in Vicinity X0778505. Interrogation of POW revealed the following information: He is a Put from the 1st Bn, 246th Regt. His battalion returned worth and left him behind because of illness. They had stayed near a river at Khe Sanh, but the Pow did not lan w if it was KSCB or SK village. He does not know if there are any other battelions in the Kho Sanh area, although he believes his battalion will be replaced by another. The Powwas forwarded to 3d Marines 3-2 for 15th ITT interrogation and medevaced to B Med, quans Tri. At 281530H, K/3/3 found a trail complex. The trail leads from Vicinity AD777628 along finger to Vicinity XD779611 and Vicinity AD776007 to XD 777596. They found a rost area in Vicinity X0776007. At 261704, 1/3/3 found harbor site with 2 fireplaces and 14 bunkers alongside a stream in the Vicinity x0763597. On 29 October (291300%), 1/3/3 found a general purpose mine in a grass but in the Vicinity XD711593. Also found 1 bunker and 2 spider traps with interconnecting trails to hut. They found 2 trails to stream and trails running to SE. The mine was destroyed. Again as during the month of September, the buttalion discovered and destroyed many bunkers and fortified areas in our AO, which were mostly newly constructed or under construction, indicating the enemy's desire to build up and occupy positions in the 3d warines AC before the full effects of the monsoons arrive and hamper their routes of infiltration into this area from the north.

# JOURNAL SUMMARY

#### October 1968

- I Oct 68 1722H In the area of YD 029563 eliments of Company I found a skeleton, also a razor and pen. Skeleton returned to Battalion Surgeon. Opinion was of Vietnamese origin.
- 2 Oct 68 0905H In the area of YD 090559 elements of Company I spotted approximately I2 persons entering tree line. A squad was sent to investigate. 4 Men, early 20's were found in a group. They were wearing utilities and straw hats. Only I of 4 would present an ID card. The 4 men were sent to Bn/Regimental S-2 for further interrogation.
  - INCOH In the area of YD 959536 elements of Company M found signs of recent enemy use of an old artillery base. M26 grenades, smoke grenades, and flares were scattered about this position. Possi bility of the area being booby trapped.
  - 1100H In the area of YD 030559 elements of Company I found I old hole on the hill, fresh tennis show and sandal tracks. They also searched along Khe Gio River. Negative results.
  - 2230H Elements of Company I heard two artillery rounds come overhead from the North. A total of 11 rounds landed in the area of Camp Carroll during the hours of 2200 to 0100. The caliber of the rounds were unknown. The rounds landed along the West side of the perimeter. A0 on station spotted the flashes from the enemy guns. A0 called in an artillery mission with unknown results.
  - 2330H Company M at Thon Son Lam received 4 rounds incoming during the hours of 1330 to 0025. Company I FO called in an artillery mission. Results unknown.
- 4 Oct 68 0745H In the area of YD 077571 a patrol from Company I was informed by civilians that 2 Americans were in a vehicle dead. The dead persons were Army from 2nd of the 94th Artillery. The vehicle was traveling from West to East towards Cam Lo. The Army took over the vehicle and bodies. Apparently, they died of a accident.
  - 2120H From Y D 026562, YD 021562, YD 031562 Company I heard shots coming from the northeast direction which had a distinct sound of being AK-47. The shots were about 1000 meters out. Movement was detected near OP2 and a scout dog picked up a scent. Fired was I round of WP and 24 rounds of HE 60mm.
- 5 Oct 68 0800H In the area of Y D 029563 OP2 discovered a Claymore mine that was set out the night before was missing. The Claymore was replaced with trip flares around it.

In the area of YD 062543, Hallmark Y reported digging sounds about 150 meters in front fo their lines. 6 rounds of 81mm mortar were fired and the sound ceased. Approximately 10 minutes later, a small explosion was heard in the same area the digging was heard. About 35 meters from the line.

- 7 Oct 68 0930H Elements of Company M discovered a trail showing signs of recent use from YD 971550 to YD 98134 running parallel with the river.
  - 1815H Elements of Company F in the area of YD 090577 confiscated 15 cans of "C" rations from a civilian.
- 8 Oct 68 1030H In the area XD 976588, elements of Company L found 1 body, 1 E-tool, 1 helmet, and 2 RPG rounds. All were approximately 2 months old. Everything was buried where found.
  - 1615H Elements of Company M found enemy gear and fighting holes that appeared to have been very recently dug. All was destroyed.
- 10 Oct 68 1100H In the area of FSB Pete Company L found a M26 grenade, attached to a trip wire. This is against present policies. The booby trap was removed.
- 11 Oct 68 0230H In the area of YD 087574 elements of Company K observed about 75 civilians moving east to west. The element of Company K was too small to stop them.
  - 0630H In the area of YD 085572 elements of Company K spotted about 300 civilians moving east to west on route #9. The civilians were stopped and moved back to Checkpoint #59.
- 12 Oct 68 No report
- bunker complex approximately 25 bunkers. The bunkers were more then one month old, still being constructed. The bunkers were used last about 2 or 3 days ago. All reinferced with logs. Bunkers were constructed of bamboo about 4 inches off the ground on top of the bunkers was a eating or sitting area. The bunkers had roofs and contained small tables made of wood. There were bunkers on both sides of the hill with steps leading down to all of them. On the beginning of one trail was one cooking site, with places dug in ground for pits. Also found empty C-ration cans, I pick, I nozzle for a gas mask, I broken poloroid camera, I Chinese soft pover, cooked rice, and I small lantern. The area proved to be a rest area and not fighting bunkers. The bunkers were destroyed.
  - 0830H In the area of XD 970597 elements of Company L discoverd one NVA body estimated killed 26 Aug 68, Chicom grenades, 2 AK-47 magazines, and 2 NVA E-tools. The enemy body and equipment was buried. The area showed negative signs of recent use.
- 14 Oct 68 1130H In the area of XD991576 elements of Company L spotted 2 NVA

dressed in comouflage light brown utilities, without weapons, moving north, Unable to use supporting arms due to visibility.

16 Oct 68 1135H In the area of XD989585 elements of Company L spotted 6 NVA and fired a spotter round and received small arms fire. Fire was returned with 81mm mortar mission. Negative results.

17 Oct 68 0500H In the area of YD 089579 elements of Company K observed approximately 100 civilians moving NE to NW towards the river. 1 Male, 1 female and 1 child were detained the rest were turned back.

The civilians were not carrying anything.

0900H In the area of XD977587 elements of Company L found I ladder and other building materials, estimated to be one month old.

All materials were destroyed.

18 Oct 68 1550H In the area of XD916610 elements of Company L found 1 empty package of cigarettes (Vietnamese), empty rice bags made in South Vietnam, 1 Marine bush ax. Signs of South Vietnamese and U. S. eccupation of the area. The fighting holes hadn't been used lately.

19 Oct 68 1745H In the area of XD 984567 elements of Company L observed 1 enemy moving across the stream moving towards a treeline at approximately 800 to 900 meters, moving in a Southern direction. Mission of 81mm mortars and 105 artillery was called. Results unknown.

20 Oct 68 1608H In the area of YD 093561 elements of Company K spotted 3 8x10 foot paddle boats covered with tarpaulin with 2 or more men in each boat. The boats were moving too rapidly down the river to stop them.

21 Oct 68 0700H In the area of KD 825611 elements of Company M while on partol to blow bunkers found on 13 Oct., also found additional bunkers further down the valley. Found 2 large bunkers, a messhall and a small hospital. The kitchen was located on one end. Sides of the kitchen had 6 foot holes dug out of the walls to fit pots Smoke escapes coming out about 30 feet from the bunker itself. At the other end was a sleeping area for 3 people. Between the kitchen and sleeping area was an eating area for about 20 people with a large bunker underneath. The messhall was capable of feeding a large number of people. Also found a hospital bunker complex with the capability of sleeping 10 underground. The sign on top was large enough to treat 10 to 15 people. Human blood

and intestines found outside the bunker. Corpsman estimated blood to be about two days old. Also 4 cans of plasma were found in the bunker. One was opened 3 weren't. Also along Route \*9 there have been at least two reports of indigenous personnel carring rifles and RPG launchers camouflaged in their bundles of wood.

The terrain we will emcounter in our new AO will differ from the terrain in our last AO. Thick undergrowth will predominate the area with scattered areas of elephant grass and campoy. The greater number of streams in the area which will swell to impessability during the monsoone should be noted. Boute 9 is also subject to the ill effects of the monsoone.

Tab 1 Intelligence overlay

1. ENEMY PORCES.

There are indications that the enemy may be planning a resurgence of activity during the next two weeks period; very possibly to coincide with the lunar period between 20 and 25 Sept. It again seems likely that the increase in activity will be designed to pull friendly forces into

outlying areas, leaving population centers more vulnerable.

- (b) An agent report of 18 Sept puts a WC unit of 30 IF WC and 45 WC district sappers in the 165578 area (SW of Cam Lo). Their mission s are: 1, collect information from rock workers along Rout e #9. 2, Induce children to gain information from convoys. 3, observe allied operations along Route #9 and mine Route #9. The possibility of WC activity is supported by a report from the Gio Linh area of NVA moving into villages at night and holding propaganda meeting dressed as civilians. S-2 comment, "The less contact we have with civilians the better". The large number of civilians in the Route #9 area give the VC an excellent atmosphere to work in.
- (a) The 64th Regt., the unit we were in contact with NW of ABOUT CAO, (Hill 190) has come back down south. Continued reports (Radio Intercepts) place elements of the 64th on and above the NW edge of our AO; Asizeable element of the 64th is indicated. The first report of this unit was on 12 Sept. and indications are that they are heavily entrenched at this time and itself to reinforce and contact to the west. NW or north. By the same token this unit is capable of hitting Cam Lo and resettlement areas. Their mission has been to avoid contact.
- (d) An APD flight (Sniffer) of the 18th returned heavy readings from the 08-11 and the 60-72 grid lines. D/I/II 005636 213ep 13WIA 11KIA

(e) Recon Activity

- (1) Hasty Foot upon insertion detonated a booby trap then observed 3 NVA to the NW carrying 1 RPG and rounds. The team was extracted.
- (2) 011647 Coral Bush made contact with 5-6 NVA. Small arms resulting in one NVA KIA, team extracted.
- (f) There has been an impresse in the utilization of 82mm mortars throughout 3dMarDiv AO.

2. TERRAIN.

- (a) The terrain in the Dong Ha, About Cao and North area is difficult to travel in. There are numerous bald spots but the areas are studded with extremely steep slopes and draws and many can opied areas. Maps do not indicate all comparts and streams.
- (a) We are still in the SW monsoon. We expect periods of rain of longer and larger duration until early or mid-October when the NE monsoon begins. Periods of clearing after rans will continue to diminish until the inception of the NE monsoon. Rivers will become less forable as the NE monsoon comes closer.

4. The Emmy Situation for TSL.

- (a) The 52d Regiment, 320th Div. continues to show up in the Order of Battle from the URS reports to be heavile placed in the area 4 to 5 clicks west of TSL and spread over a large area extending futher west and mostly on a north to south axis, however, the activity around TSL during the past 30 days does not comfimm these reports as there has been little enemy activity in the TSL area as reported.

  - (10) 15Sep68 Grid 984546 1/3 received 2 roun's of 82mm morter
- (11) 15 Sep68 Grid 9955 Company "H" 3/3 received 2 rounds of 82mm morter at TSL LZ.
- (12) 19Sep68 C/1/3 received 3 roun's of artillery believed to be 100mm rounds. Identifying the incoming rounds at TSL to be 100mm rounds which was later proven to be an erroneous report the rounds actually came from a soviet built 82mm Recoiless Gun. A detailed analysis of the crater and shell fragments verified this fact. This weapon has a maximum horizontal range of 4,470 meters. It was fired from an azimuth of 4950 from the Rockpile, however the actual point of firing has not been determined.
