## NAR TITAL CON. ISA

The Battelion continued S/D operations in the Montucky 'O. On 4 23157 December, Co I executed an ambush north of C-2 Bridge resulting in 2 WAAVC "I"s. & moderate amount of old ordnance was discovered and destroyed. The Battalion was OPCON to Task Force "atol an "ask "area Breve during the first mort of the month. On 14 December, the Bettalion moved to in Hos and was OPCON to Task Force Yankee for Operation Taylor Common. The Battalion made a helicopter assualt 18 December on Hill 375 at 7C167365 and set up Combat Base Mace. Company patrol bases were established in the area and 3/D operations were conducted. Large amounts of modical equipment, weapons, uniforms, and ammunition were uncovered. These supplies were found in numerous bunker and hut complexes which were searched and destroyed upon discovery. Most of the complexes were used for R&R centers ond were not sot up for combat defense. Although many trails and complexes have been found in the Battalion 40, actual enony contact has been limited to occasional fire fights with small units of 3-5 people. Indications are that the WWW/VC main force has left the area while operations are being conducted and only small unit harassment forces have been left to contend with.

During the month of Decomber, there were no problems in obtaining Class V. Until the 14th of the month Class V was drawn from the AP at Quang Tri. Ifter moving to in Ica on the 14th, the source of supply became the LSU Class V dump at in Hea.

(3) Resupply

From the 1st to the 14th of December, the Battalion was resupplied exclusively by ground transportation. (fter moving to in Toa on the 14th and commencing perticipation in Operation Taylor Common, the Battalion was resupplied in the field by helicopter. For the first half of the month of December. the Battalion was operating out of Con Thien and contacts were small unit incidents. The second half of the month, the Battalion moved from Con Thien to 'n Hoa, southwest of Da Mang. On 20 December 68, the Battalion commenced Operation Taylor Common. Meny bunker and hut complexes were found ranging from platcon to possibly battalion size. M, 3/3 on 211500H found a hut and bunker complex at 20153379. The area had a small mosshall and 1 hut was an aid station. The complex was approximately 1 month old and had been used by approximately 20 people. On 2213501, K, 3/3 found a hut and bunker complex at 7C162385. This area was extensive with messhell facilitios, medical huts, an' a grain mill. Also found were medical supplies, printing material, end assorted documents. The messhall huts wars 75'x25'. Upon finding this complex K, 3/3 had contact with 2 enemy vicinity 20 162385. One way illed and his weapon, a new AK-47 with 3 magazines, captured. On 2915001, L, 3/3 coordinates 20138353, while crossing a stream, 1 ed alamants ran into a house. A search of the house produced 1 basket of clothas, 3 SKS, and 1 carbine. There were also 4 other huts containing medical goar, documents, and new womens clothes. One hut had 2 built-in stoves. 1 'K-47 and 3 carbines were found bahind a false wall in a hut. Two bunkers were reconned by fire and heavy return fire was received. 1 10" MV / was taken. On 301100H. L, 3/3 Aiscovered 4 huts, vicinity 70150366. 47 K-AA rifles, 6 Chicom

burp guns, 6 US M-1 cerbinos, 2000 K-14 rounds, 300 9mm rounds, 12 machates, 1 g pound block of TNT were found. 3015051, M, 3/3 in the vicinity 70143382 sighted 2 NV1, wearing block pajamas, who went into dugout type positions. They were taken under fire and 1 NV1 was killed. Extensive rest and storage areas were the most common finds and enemy contact was light in the Taylor Common area.
