NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. GENERAL OVERALL VIEW OF ALL ACTIVITIES. During the month of June, the Battalion continued operations in the Virginia Ridge AO. The first 13 days of the month, the Battalion operated northwest of Dong Ha Mtn. During this time there were several mortar incidents but limited ground contact. On the 14th, the Battalion moved to Vandegrift Combat Base to prepare for operations in Leatherneck Square, an extended AO for Virginia Ridge. On the evening of the 16th, the Battalion mounted trucks and moved up Route #1 in a blacked out convoy toward Gio Linh. Heavy contact began early on the morning of the 17th and continued throughout the day. Artillery and air strikes were used in direct support and Naval Gunfire was used as a blocking fire to the north of the contact area. The contact continued throughout the day and sporadic contact was made the next two days. The operation concluded on the 21st and the Battalion moved to Cua Viet for R&R lasting for 3 days. On the 26th, the Battalion moved into permanent positions. The CP moving to Cam Lo, Co M to Con Thien, Co K to C-2, Co I to C-3 Bridge, and Co L operated south of Cam Lo. The Battalion is in these positions as the reporting period ends.

4. INTELLIGENCE. During the reporting period, the battalion was involved in Operation Virginia Ridge. For most of the month, the enemy activity was moderate and not overly aggressive. However, during the period from the 17th through the 21st of June, the enemy was extremely aggressive due to the movement of the battalion into the area of a major infiltration route into Gio Linh district. Only a few days prior to the battalion moving into the area, the enemy had moved through the area and had initiated attacks against ARVN and Popular Forces in the Gio Linh area. The infiltration route, itself, had been located along the boundary between the 3d Marines and the 2d ARVN. During this 5 day period, there were 2 heavy contacts and 9 moderate contacts. Even though the rest of the reporting period had been moderate and followed normal enemy tactics,

there was one contact where Co I became involved with an enemy force of 35-40 men. The enemy initiated contact with RPG's and hand grenades. In addition, Co I received heavy small arms and automatic weapons fire from bunkers and fighting holes on both sides of the trail. The results of the contact were 3 NVA KIA's and 2 NVA KBA's. On occasion during this period, there were rocket attacks against Con Thien and C-2 while the battalion occupied these fixed positions. In all, the enemy employed rockets and mortars against the battalion 8 times.

The bunkers appeared to be 1-2 years old. The bunkers and ordnance were destroyed.
- 02 Jun 1100H In the area of YD196623 a Marine of Co I had an accidental discharge with a K16, wounding himself.
- 03 Jun 0610H In the area of XD968617 the CP observed 2 NVA in the open. They were approaching the hill from the west and returned to the west. Artillery and 81mm mortars were called with unknown results.
- 1350H In the area of YD015640 elements of Co L received 18 rounds of 60mm mortar. The first volley was not heard due to artillery being fired in 2/3's AO. Two rounds were direct hits in fighting holes. Artillery missions were called on suspected mortar sites with 1 secondary explosion of white smoke. AO called in air strike. Results were 3 USMC KIA's and 16 WIA's.
- 1710H In the area of YD014640 elements of Co L received 12 82mm mortar rounds. All landed in the perimeter with 1 being a direct hit in a fighting hole. Artillery mission and fixed wing were called in, with AO on station, on suspected enemy position. Results were 1 NVA KBA, 4 Marine KIA's and 7 WIA's.
- 2100H In the area of XD997614 elements of Co I had movement on the NE side of their perimeter. The movement worked it's way around the perimeter with scout dogs reacting to an odor similar to marijuana. Grenades were thrown and on 2 occasions moaning was heard. Artillery was called in around the perimeter and the movement stopped at 040430H.
- 04 Jun 1315H In the area of XD971616 elements of Co I were heading NW when contact was made with 35-40 NVA in an area heavily prepped by artillery. Enemy initiated contact with RPG, automatic, and small arms fire. Fire was returned by all organic weapons. Unit withdrew about 40m to allow 81mm mortars and artillery to be used. An AO came on station and directed fixed wing air strikes. Unit assaulted position while artillery fired on routes of escape. The enemy appeared to have withdrawn to the N and NW. Results were 4 Marine KIA's and 20 WIA's, 1 NVA KIA, 2 NVA KBA's, and 1 AK47.
- 05 Jun 0940H In the area of XD986624 elements of Co K received 23 60mm mortar rounds. All rounds landed outside the perimeter. Counter mortar fire was called in results unknown.
- 1620H In the area of XD976623 elements of the CP discovered 4 NVA graves, 6 months to 1 year old. Grave markings read: B.13 Phan Thanly G-102, B.9 Ng Dinh Linh G-102, B.17 Ng Thanh Minh G-102, B.19 Phan Van Huong G-102. Each grave contained remains of 1 NVA and torn khaki clothing. Graves were recovered. Results were 4 NVA KIA's.

06 Jun 0915H In the area of XD969624 elements of Co I discovered a bunker complex running NE. It contained 8 bunkers, A-frame Type, 7x5x4' with logs and dirt on top. 105mm boxes had been used in construction. Bunkers had been used in the last 2 weeks and were 4-6 months old. All bunkers were connected by comm wire. Found also were 15 fighting holes. Bunkers were searched finding 8-10 PRC25 batteries (old Type), US cooking utensils, 1 5 gal watercan with 3d MarDiv insignia, 20-30 sandbags, 4 81mm mortar cannisters used as water containers, and 1 small notebook. Bunkers and equipment were destroyed.

1100H In the area of XD977646 elements of Co K received 30 60mm mortar rounds. All landed outside of the perimeter. Countered with artillery and 81mm and 60mm mortars. AO was called in. Results unknown.

1130H In the area of XD969623 elements of Co K found a complex of 4 bunkers and 4 fighting holes approximately 4-6 months old. Search of the area uncovered 16 Chicom grenades, 1 RPG round, 1 Chicom Claymore mine armed. Complex and ordnance were destroyed.

1420H In the area of XD957633 elements of Co K found 4 bunkers 3-4 weeks old. Search of the area uncovered 16 Chicom grenades, 2 armed Chicom Claymore mine, 1 RPG round, 3 NVA E-tools, 1 NVA helmet, 3 ponchos. Bunkers and equipment were destroyed.

1450H In the area of XD975658 elements of Co K received 12 rounds 60mm mortar outside their perimeter. Counter fire and an AO were used with unknown results.

1820H In the area of XD997630 elements of Co I received 53 60mm mortar rounds which landed outside their perimeter. Countered with artillery, 81mm mortars, and an AO with unknown results.

1935H In the area of XD947630 elements of Co K observed 2 NVA moving NW carrying a 60mm mortar. Supporting arms were called with negative results.

07 Jun 0940H In the area of XD973640 elements of Co K surprised 4 NVA attempting to set an ambush. NVA were fired upon with small arms. NVA broke contact and artillery and 81mm mortars were called on escape route. Search of the ambush site resulted in finding 1 NVA KIA, 2 RPG rounds, 2 Chicom Claymore mines, and miscellaneous gear. There was 1 Marine WIA.

08 Jun 0715H In the area of XD949627 elements of Co K surprised 4-5 NVA working on a bunker complex. The enemy fired a Chicom Claymore and withdrew. Countered with small arms, 81mm mortar. AO on station called in and artillery mission. Results were 1 NVA KIA and 1 NVA WIA. 4 Chicom grenades, and 1 US cartridge bolt captured.

0850H In the area of XD949627 to XD952629 elements of Co K executed an ambush on 4-5 NVA with 3 Claymore mines. The NVA fired 3 Chicom Claymores and small arms. Countered with small arms, 81mm mortar, and artillery to block withdrawal. Results

were 1 RPG7, 3 Chicon grenades, 1 Chicon Claymore mine, 1 NVL E-tool, shaving gear, rice cakes, and 5 incomplete bunkers captured.

1300H In the area of XD946630 elements of Co K were taken under fire by 4-6 NVL in bunkers and fighting holes. The NVL were armed with AK47's, Chicon Claymores and machineguns. Countered with artillery and fixed wing. Assaulted the enemy position, driving the enemy northwest. Results were 1 Marine WIA, 3 NVL KIA's, and 4 AK47 magazines, 1 RPG round, 1 82mm mortar round, 11 Chicon grenades, 1 NVL E-tool, 1 NVL bolt, 5 bunkers, and 1 Chinese wire phone captured.

09 Jun 0815H In the area of XD945624 elements of Co K observed 5 NVL moving across the top of a hill. 81mm mortar fire was called on the NVL. The results were 1 NVL KIA.

1000H In the area of XD949633 elements of Co K found 2 NVL graves about 1 week old. Death appeared to be by shrapnel. Results were 2 NVL KIA.

10 Jun 1400-1600H In the area of XD942637 elements of Co K, while in ambush, heard enemy on the hillside to their rear. The enemy sounded as if they were moving away. The elements moved to investigate and initiated contact with 5 NVL on a trail. Other NVL opened fire from further up the hill. AO came on station and directed artillery and fixed wing. Additional elements of Co K drove to link up with the ambush. Results were 1 Marine KIA and 6 WIA's, and 3 NVL KIA's.

1400-1930H In the area of XD943636 elements of Co K made contact with approximately 20-30 NVL and the rest of Co K closed on unit. Co CP prepared for the medevacs. At 1800H medevac helicopter received a hit from a RPG fired about 300m north of the LZ. AO called in fixed wing. Co K made additional contact at 1840H and suppressed it with organic weapons. Artillery and fixed wing kept being called in and the medevac helicopter returned for wounded. Results of the contact was 7 Marine WIA's, 3 NVL KIA's, and 4 AK47's, 48 Chicon grenades, 20 NVL E-tools, 20 sticks of TNT, 10 AK47 magazines, 150lbs of rice captured.

1600H In the area of XD963637 elements of Co L observed 2 NVL approximately 300m away. 3d Plt, Co L attempted to make contact with negative results.

1830H In the area of XD966639 a Marine of Co L was discovered missing. He was not by arrived in country and had joined the 1st Plt, Co L the day prior. His squad had turned around after attempting to find another route to their destination when his absence was discovered. He was last seen 10 minutes before, when the squad turned around. He was the last man in the squad when it turned around. No signs of enemy activity had been observed in the vicinity. The squad immediately backtracked, but couldn't find any sign of the Marine or his equipment. 3d Plt, Co L was near by began a systematic search of the area, another squad of Co L joined the search as dusk fell. The Company made 3 complete

Searchers with negative results. Two squads remained in the area overnight. At 11 0630H a systematic search was conducted while his squad retraced the entire route. Adjacent units were notified to be on the alert. AC assisted in the search.

- 11 Jun 0925H In the area of XD940653 elements of Co L received 11 60mm mortar rounds. All rounds landed outside the perimeter. Counter fire was called using mortars with unknown results.
- 1615H In the area of XD966636 elements of Co L found 4 NVA 82mm mortar sites with 14 82mm rounds and 1lb of C3. All ordnance was destroyed.
- 12 Jun 0630H In the area of XD965634 elements of Co L resumed search for the missing Marine. A Psyops plane with loudspeakers was utilized to encourage the missing Marine to signal so he could be located. At 1130H the missing Marine fired shots as directed by the aircraft. He was in good health except for the self-inflicted gunshot wound in the left foot. He said that he had got lost when he became nauseated, stopped, took off his equipment and moved up the hill and fell asleep. He said that he slept until late the next afternoon (11 Jun). When he heard a plane talking to him, telling him to fire his weapon, he decided to when it was too late to divulge his position and wait until morning. The next morning (12 Jun) he awoke and heard the plane broadcasting instructions which he complied with. When asked how he received the wound, he stated that the 1st shot was the one in his left foot. When asked why. He stated that he had been nothing but trouble to the platoon since he arrived by dropping his gear, dropping back, and getting lost and that if he was redeployed he wouldn't be anymore trouble. He was returned to the Co G1 and redeployed.
- 13 Jun 0730H In the area of XD960656 elements of Co K received 29 60mm mortar rounds outside of their perimeter. Mortar and artillery fire was returned with unknown results.
- 0900H In the area of XD969618 elements of Co I found 5 bunkers approximately 6x5x4ft and covered with dirt on top. Searched area and found 7 60mm rounds with increments, 1 NVA canteen, 2 flak jackets, 4 ponchos, 3 utilities, and 2 NVA helmets. The bunkers and gear was destroyed.
- 1230H In the area of XD952632 elements of Co L found 3 NVA Claymores with wires running to 2 bunkers. Also found were 27 Chicom grenades and 1 82mm round. The bunkers and ordnance were destroyed.
- 14 Jun Bn moved to Vandegrift.
- 15 Jun Bn at Vandegrift AB.
- 16 Jun Bn moved to operation in Leatherneck Square.
- 17 Jun 0605H In the area of XD197603 elements of Co I made contact with 5-6 NVA. the NVA point man was 30m ahead of the group. Co I

opened fire with small arms. An AO was called along with a gunship. Results were 6 Marine KIA's, 2 NVA KIA's, 1 AK47, 2 Chicom grenades, 1 RPG round, 1 AK magazine, 1 wallet, 1 ID card, and 1 knife.

0610H In the area of YD135645 elements of Co K received 6 122mm rockets, all outside the perimeter. Artillery was called with unknown results.

0800H In the area of YD183737 elements of Co H made heavy contact with an NVA company that was entrenched in a hedge row. After intense fighting, the enemy fled north. Results were 11 Marine KIA's and 25 NVA's, 10 NVA KIA's, and 2 AK47's, 1 7.62 machine-gun, 1 RPG round captured. The weapons were destroyed.

0850H In the area of YD197687 elements of Co I observed 1 NVA with pack. Snipers and M60 machine gun opened fire and the NVA was observed falling. Unable to find body.

1000H In the area of YD194709 elements of Co K observed 2 NVA camouflaging themselves. The unit opened fire and grenades were received from 4 NVA. One NVA was hit with small arms and exploded (appeared to have a satchel charge). Results were 1 NVA KIA, 2 sticks of TAT, 1 Chicom grenade, and 1 NVA belt.

1400H In the area of YD198698 elements of Co I observed 5-10 NVA moving south. All were well camouflaged. The NVA fired 6-8 RPG rounds and AK's. Co I returned fire and called an AO and gunship with results unknown.

1400H In the area of YD195707 elements of Co I and the 106 Plt came under heavy ground attack by a NVA Co. The NVA used small arms, machineguns, RPG's, mortars, and grenades. 1st Plt, Co I moved to the east to set up blocking positions and made heavy contact. Results were 6 Marine KIA's and 23 NVA's, 24 NVA KIA's, 1 NVA nurse KIA, 3 NVA POW, and captured were 10 AK47's, 1 SRS, 1 E16, 2 RPD machineguns, 2 RPG2, 1 RPG7, 10 60mm rounds, 30 Chicom grenades, 2 AT mines, 35 AK magazines, 200 RPD rounds, 500 AK rounds, and various documents sent to Rect 6-2.

1400H In the area of YD195706 elements of Co L made contact with an estimated platoon of NVA. Fired upon enemy with small arms and called in fixed wing. Results were 1 Marine KIA and 3 NVA's, 13 NVA KIA, and captured were 11 AK47's and 3 RPG2's.

1530H In the area of YD132701 elements of Co L received 50 rounds of small arms fire. Fire was returned and the area swept with no active results.

1800H In the area of YD196717 elements of Co K received 10 60mm mortar rounds. Counter fire was called using 60mm mortar, AO, and artillery. Results unknown.

1900H In the area of YD190707 elements of Co L observed 1 NVA approaching their position. He was taken under fire and killed. The following morning another NVA moved towards the position. He was also taken under fire and killed. Results were 2 NVA KIA's

and 1 AK47 and 1 RPG2 captured.

2030H In the area of YD190699 an ambush element of Co L initiated contact with an NVA force resulting in 1 Marine KIL, 4 NVA KIA's, and captured 1 AK47 magazine, 500 30cal rounds, 3 Chicom grenades, 2 NVA helmets, 3 hammocks, and miscellaneous 702 gear.

18 Jun 0000H In the area of YD194707 elements of the 106 Plt on a search and clear mission, found the following: 7 NVA KIL's, 4 NVA MIA's, 1 RPG2, 2 M16 rifles, 57 Chicom grenades, 8 60mm rounds, 4 cans of 60mm primers and increments, 11 RPG rounds, 3 AT mines, 6 RPG boosters, 25lbs of rice, 10lbs of TNT, 20 AK47 magazines, and 400 AK47 rounds.

1015H In the area of YD190698 elements of the 106 Plt sighted movement to their front. Several grenades were thrown and the area was checked finding 1 NVA POW and 1 AK47.

1500H In the area of YD176694 elements of Co I observed 1 NVA filling canteens. NVA started moving north and point opened fire. Results were 1 NVA KIA, and 2 NVA canteens and 1 NVA belt captured.

1515H In the area of YD164712 elements of Co K found a small bunker, 2-3 months old. Found in the bunker were 24 Chicom grenades, 25 RPG rounds, 30 60mm rounds, 1 case AK47 rounds, 75 60mm rounds, 50 RPG boosters, 2 M26 grenades. The ordnance and bunker was destroyed.

1900H In the area of YD175693 elements of Co I observed 5 NVA moving toward their position from the east. They also heard movement to the E. The unit opened fire with small arms and 60mm mortar. Artillery and 81mm mortars and AO were called in with unknown results.

19 Jun 0845H In the area of YD166718 elements of Co K found 1 NVA grave with body that was about 3 weeks old. Results were 1 NVA KIA.

0850H In the area of YD175694 elements of Co I were moving east on a trail when they found loose gear lying around. Results were 2 straw helmets, 1 RPG round, and 1 M26 grenade. The articles were destroyed.

1230H In the area of YD162723 elements of Co K found 3 pair of Ho Chi Minh sandals, 70 rounds AK47, and dried blood on grass a week old. The gear was destroyed.

1310H In the area of YD168696 elements of Co I observed 1 NVA and opened fire. Results unknown. Also found 2 bunkers with overheads of dirt and logs. Bunkers were destroyed.

1330H In the area of YD166707 elements of Co L found 20 NVA packs hidden near a stream. Brought packs back to company perimeter and had the packs searched and record gear. Results were 20 NVA packs, 11 NVA canteens, 30lbs of rice, 10lbs of powdered milk, 12pr NVA utilities, 3 NVA E-tools, documents, personal papers, and miscellaneous medical gear. Documents and personal papers sent to K 42 and rest of gear destroyed.

- 1300H In the area of YD153637 elements of Co I observed 2 NVA moving east. Were unable to tell what they carried. Snipers opened fire and artillery called in with unknown results.
- 20 Jun 0715H In the area of YD174723 elements of Co N found 5 NVA bodies, 4 in graves and 1 lying above ground. All had been dead for 3-4 days. Further search of the area resulted in 5 NVA KIA's, 100 rounds AK47, 1 NVA pick, 2 NVA E-tools, 7pr NVA boots, and 25 Chieu Hoi passes.
- 0800H In the area of YD163690 elements of Co I found an armed 500lb bomb in their perimeter. Also found was a tunnel 10ft long leading to a cave 8x10ft. From the cave led a tunnel 15ft to the north then 15ft to the east and then began to slope down. A partially decayed hand was found sticking out of the dirt. Search was discontinued because of bad air and a partially collapsed tunnel. The rest of the tunnel was destroyed.
- 1045H In the area of YD167700 elements of Co L found an AT mine. The mine was blown in place.
- 21 Jun The Bn moved to Cua Viet for R&R.
- 22 Jun 1600H In the area of YD167700 elements of Co N began search for a Marine who was missing since yesterday after a troop lift from the above coordinates. Moved to C-2 by helicopter where they mounted tanks and proceeded to YD167700 where the missing Marine was found with no apparent injuries. The platoon returned to C-2 on tanks, boarded trucks and moved to Dong Ha boat ramp where they boarded a river craft and returned to Cua Viet. Lost Marine stated he crawled into bushy area and stayed awake until 2400. Awoke in the morning and returned to the LZ to await assistance.
- 23 Jun R&R in Cua Viet.
- 24 Jun R&R in Cua Viet.
- 25 Jun R&R in Cua Viet.
- 26 Jun 1130H In the area of YD144616 elements of Co I observed two persons crossing a hill. Small arms fire was heard from the same area shortly afterwards. A patrol was sent to that area and found 2 boys with 6 50cal rounds. They were taken to the Co CP and questioned by interpreters from ITT and released.
- 2050H In the area of YD010564 elements of Co L heard digging on a road 200ft away. They moved down to the road and observed 1 person in civilian clothes digging. As he ran away, they fired at him and fell they hit him although he did not fall. They searched the area and found 1 freshly planted mine and 2 NVA ponchos.
- 27 Jun 0830H In the area of YD011001 a mine sweep found 1 60mm round. The round was blown in place.
- 0930H In the area of YD057563 a SEAL team truck hit a mine on an access road, damaging the truck. One civilian girl received shrapnel wounds. The road had been swept prior to the incident.

and other vehicles had been moving over the road. The mine had appeared to have been in place for 2-3 days because the road shoulder had been sprayed with oil after it had been planted.

1015H In the area of YD042566 elements of Co B detained 1 male dressed in civilian clothing but had no ID card. Suspect was carrying photos of himself, 1 hypodermic needle, 1 machete, 1 LAAW. He was later released after interrogation.

1030H In the area of YD057568 a "Duster" from 1/44th, which had been parked 1½ hours for routine maintenance, suddenly exploded and turned over killing 1 USA and wounding 3 USA personnel. Cause of the explosion believed to be an AT mine. The road was leading to LCB53 rock quarry. Two Boats, who heard the explosion from a security bunker, to move a machinegun to the opposite side of the bunker and moved an ammo can which detonated wounding them and 1 civilian. Incident reported to proper units.

- 1 0640H In the area of YD117701 elements of Co B received 4 122mm rocket rounds, one landed inside the perimeter. Road sweep team saw flashes and got an azimuth. Called in artillery mission with unknown results. Rockets wounded 6 Marines (2 engineers).

0830H In the area of YD117701 elements of Co B received 4 122mm rocket rounds which landed outside the perimeter. An AC was called and controlled artillery fire on suspected position with unknown results.

0925H In the area of YD090587 a Vietnamese child found a Claymore mine along side of a trail. Firing device was not found. Mine blown in place.

- n 1100H In the area of YD174598 elements of Co B were returning to the perimeter when the point man was charged by a water buffalo. The buffalo was shot in self-defense. This was observed by several civilians 200m away. MACV was notified by Bn 4-3.

1300H In the area of YD126670 elements of Co B, 3d Engr received 5 M79 rounds from 2 NVA 300m away while conveying to blow grade III ammo. Elements of Co B searched the area with negative results.
