#### NARRATIVE SULMARY

1. GENERAL OVERALL VIEW OF ALL ACTIVITIES. During the month of June. the Battalion continued operations in the Virginia Ridge AO. The first 13 days of the month, the Battalion operated northwest of Dong Ha Mtn. During this time there were several mortar incidents but limited ground contact. On the 14th, the Battalion moved to Vandogrift Combat Base to prepare for operations in Leathernock Square, an extended AO for Virginia Ridge. On the evening of the 16th, the Battalion mounted trucks and moved up Route #1 in a blacked out convoy toward Gio Linh. Heavy contact began early on the morning of the 17th and continued throughout the day. Artillery and air strikes were used in direct support and Naval Gunfire was used as a blocking fire to the north of the contact area. The contact continued throughout the day and sporadic contact was made the next two days. The operation concluded on the 21st and the Battalion noved to Cua Viet for R&R lasting for 3 days. On the 26th, the Bettalion moved into permanent positions. The CP moving to Cam Lo, Co M to Con Thien, Co K to C-2, Co I to C-3 Bridge, and Co L operated south of Can Lo. Tho Battalion is in these positions as the reporting period ends.

Only a few days prior to the battalion moving into the area, and enough had moved through the area and had initiated attacks against .... and Popular Forces in the Gio Linh area. The infiltration route, itseld, had been located along the boundary botween the 3d Harines and the 2d 1.77. During this 5 day period, there were 2 heavy contacts and 9 mode - " mtacts. Even though the rest of the reporting period had been mode to and followed normal enemy tactics,

there was one contact where Co I became involved with an enemy force of 35-40 men. The enemy initiated contact with RPG's and hand grenades. In addition, Co I received heavy small arms and automatic weapons fire from bunkers and fighting holes on both sides of the trail. The results of the contact were 3 NVA KIA's and 2 NVA KBA's. On occasion during this period, there were rocket attacks against Con Thien and C-2 while the battalion occupied these fixed positions. In all, the enemy employed rockets and mortars against the battalion 8 times.

- Of Jun O730H In the area of XD987626 elements of Co H discovered an old bunker complex containing 11 4x4x4' fighting bunkers, 1 storage bunker containing 33 60mm mortar rounds, 271 82mm mortar rounds, 68 Chicom granades, and 4 7.62 ammunition drums (belt). The bunkers appeared to be 1-2 years old. The bunkers and ordnance were destroyed.
